**Lars Skoglund: Radio Taiwan International/Tainan 9955** svarade med kort, vykort och programschema.

**Ralph Perry:** Tried your recording of 3360 but couldn't make anything out . . . but it's very impressive, how quiet the 90 mb is for you!!

I wonder what the status is these days for Radio JPJ. According to that letter they sent to PFA, and according to other comments from PFA, it appears they are ready to reactivate their station (as of 1 Dec) on the newly-licensed frequency of 4880 kHz. I've been watching that fqy, mornings and evenings, but nothing noted yet.

Those other logs in the 2100-2200 slot are of course way too early for reception here in the central USA, as we're still in daylight at that time. Not sure when local sunset is in Bolivia these days, but 2130 is only 5:30 p.m. there, so might be a little early. No problem, tho, for Brazilians, farther to the east. Happy Listening!

**Stephen Calver:** Had a tip-off from a DX'er friend in Wales, Mark Davies. He said try 12105 kHz at 1600 gmt for Radio Dialogue via Madagascar. I heard it @ 1615 with a full English id and this ann...."Radio Dialogue, giving you a voice, putting you in the heart of the community". They mentioned FM but clealy state they are on short wave. At 1630 the language changed but still gave regular id's in English. Very clear frequency and nice audio. Signal was 454 throughout. Would be intrested to hear of other reports on other days. DX-ing with Flex Radio Systems 1500 & antenna Half size G5RV in roof.

**Dan Olsson:** Hej! Dags att lämna bidrag efter att ha varit ut och känt på den skånska kylen (-14 grader) under en kvällspromenad med hunden. Dock har jag lite värme kvar efter ha sett Evita på Malmö operan innan ikväll. Tipsen denna gång ifrån en lyssnarnatt i Saxtorp där vi var sex stycken (årsrekord). Tyvärr så var kondsen inte dem bästa.

**John Ekwall:** Senast jag hade en utlandssemester var för 15 år sedan, då jag gjorde min Sydatlanten-tripp för att besöka Tristan da Cunha och St Helena. Vid mitt besök på St Helena hade jag och Jan Tunér (JT) trevliga stunder med personalen på radiostationen (Tony, Derek m fl) då vi pratade radiominnen på vad som hade hänt med världsradioändningen på 11092,5 kHz under de gångna åren. Vi bjöd på en stor grillfest dagen efter Lucia hos grillmästaren Mike Olsson (sedemera startade han både en radiostation och tidning). Nu 15 år sedan kommer R St Helena att läggas ner på Juldagen - 45 år sedan Tony Leo startade det hela.

Ett löfte jag gav på Bulltofta en septemberdag 1972 till Nils Olsson (NIOL-NO) var att jag skulle besöka honom i hans nya hemland Brasilien. Som de äldre medlemmarna kanske kommer ihåg, var det kärleken som fick Nils att flytta - Luzia Donato på radiostationen Rádio Educadora i Uberlandia. Tiden gick och det blev ingen resa till Brasilien under resten av förra seklet.

Vid ett flertal tillfällen besökte jag Nils under hans hembesök i Jonstorp men det var nog först under 2007 löftet förstärktes om en resa. Nils kom nämligen till Sverige för att jobba några år för att få rätt till sin folkpension.

NO kom bl a till Karön några gånger och det var då jag sa "min nästa utlandsresa skall gå till Brasilien". Så blev det - 15 år efter äventyret ute på Sydatlanten satte jag mig på planet i Kastrup för att via Lissabon ta mig till det stora landet. Så gott som alla plan går sen kvällstid, eftersom det är fråga om 9-11 timmars flygning snett över Atlanten. Väl framme i São Paulo blev det bytte till inrikesflygplatsen Congonhas innan jag vid 15-tiden landade i Uberlandia. Där välkomnades jag av Nils och Luzia. Efter ca 25 min kunde vi ta en välkomstdrink hemma hos familjen Olsson i Jardim Karaiba, ett villaområde i södra utkanten av Uberlandia.

Vi tog det rätt lugnt ett par dagar med promenader och lite simning i Cajuba Clube's simbassänger med efterföljande nationaldrink Capirinha.

Sedan Nils flyttade till Brasilien 1972 har staden växt från 140.000 till nu närmare 700.000. Uberlandia har blivit ett logistikcentrum för produkter från Amazonas och det sker ständiga utbyggnader inom området. Staden ligger på en kulle och det är därför branta gator ner till omgivande satellitområden. Alla gator är enkelriktade och parkeringsplatser är få. Det finns dock ett otal smågarage där man kan parkera bilen för 15-25 kr timmen. Affärsgratan Afonso Pena domineras av allehanda skoaffärer och apotek men även andra inrättningar. I utkanten av staden växer det upp nya "shoppingområden" - ett ligger bara 5 min från Nils och heter Uberlandia Shopping och bara ett stenkast från det relativt nya universitet, där Nils dotter Anna-Karin läser till trädgårdsarkitekt.



Jag hade två utflyktsmål som jag gärna ville besöka - Iguacu-fallen och Brasilia. Rio de Janeiro och São Paulo lockade mig inte alls. Efter att ha konstaterat att resan till Foz de Iguacu skulle kosta 8000 kr för några dagar blev det alltså Brasilia som fick besök. En måndag satte vi oss på bussen till denna nyanlagda huvudstad (1959 av Kubitscheck och arkitekten Niemeyer). Efter dryga 5 timmar genom höglandet med många fazendas (jordbruk) körde vi in genom ett antal satellitstäder innan vi kom in i Brasilia. I denna stad är det lag på att inga bostäder skall byggas så därför kommer invånarantalet alltid att vara 600.000. Runt omkring staden bor det drygt 1,5 miljon! Brasilia ja - en fascinerade och storstads stad men inte ett dugg anpassat för strövande turister - alltför stora avstånd. Det fick bli en 3-timmars guidad resa för att bese alla stora monumentalbyggnader. En sak som jag inte riktigt gillade var den fixering vid grundaren och presidenten Kubitschek (kallad JK) - ett mausoleum hade nyligen byggts där hans liv presenterades. Hela hans liv presenterades med hjälp av saker han fått från sina statsbesök. Där fanns även replika av den bil som blev skrot när han omkom i en bilolycka 1976. Arkitekten Niemeyer omnämndes dagligen i sjukhusrapporter, då han de senaste veckorna hade åkt ut och in. Det var ju bara några veckor kvar till han skulle fylla 105 år. Men den 5 december slutade hans liv. In i det sista var han verksam med nya projekt bl a i Angola.

En dag fick vi tillfälle att besöka en piratradiostation. Det var en tidigare medarbetare på Rádio Educadora, som Luzia fortfarande har kontakt med, som för några år sedan förverkligade sin dröm - en egen radiostation. Efter en del snirklingar hamnade vi ett studenthusområde. I en liten etta hade han hela sändareutrustningen för sin FM-station. Robert (som vi kan kalla honom) sa att detta var första gången på 5 veckor han tittat till sin utrustning. Hela stationen sköts automatiskt av en dator. Spellistor innehållande 1000-tals låtar väljs slumpmässigt ut men det fanns även reklam (statligt) som han bara kopierat från en annan station och sedan sänds ut vid en del jämn klockslag. Stationen har inget namn och inga talade inslag. Denna hobbyverksamhet kostar Robert ca 1600 kr i månaden, främst hyra av studentbostaden.



Nils och min dag kunde se ut så här - frukost kl 8, skjuts av Luzia till skivaffären där hon jobbar ca 2 timmar innan kompanjonen tar över på eftermiddagen. Om vädret tillät - besök på Cajuba och lite simning. Förberedelse för lunch 1300, då Luzia hämtas. Kanske 2 timmars siesta (blev lite dåligt med slummer då grannen byggde om sitt hus och arbetarna förde ett väldigt liv med sina maskiner och rop), kaffestunden kl 1600 var viktigt för då träffades "storfamiljen" dvs Luzias systrar. Sedan lite snack och kanske Sudoku, som Nils gillar. En del kvällar var det barbecue som gällde. Det var allehanda saker som skulle grillas, korvarna är suveräna i Brasilien, sedan var det nationalköttet "picanha" som skulle på grillen. Detta kött är ofta dyrare än oxfilé, kilopriset ligger mellan 70 och 100 kr beroende på kvalité. Picanha kan närmast jämföras med vår rumpsteck styckningsmässigt.

Sedan blev det naturligtvis några öl eller någon whisky.

Dagarna gick ganska snabbt och mina 3 veckor var snart till ända. Tyvärr hade man inställt mitt plan på eftermiddagen, så jag var tvungen att redan kl 7 vara på flygplatsen för att ta planet till Guarulhos i São Paulo. Detta innebar 10 timmar för mig på flygplatsen - inte alls roligt. Efter att ha varit vaken mer än 30 timmar landade jag till slut i Kastrup i strålande solsken och +10 grader, att jämföras med de 28-32 grader det var i Brasilien.

Blir det något ytterligare besök i Brasilien? Knappast och det beror främst på att jag inte kan portugisiska. Visserligen har jag fått ett par äktenkapsförslag men skall man bo i privathus, så är det muromgärdat med taggråd. Detta passar mig inte - jag vill ha nära till naturen - så det får bli Sverige som gäller för mig i framtiden.

**COLOMBIA** Full-detail and attractive e-QSL card rcvd 12/1 from Rafael Rodriguez, QSL mgr for **Alcaraván R. on 5.910** ([rafaelcoldx@yahoo.com](mailto:rafaelcoldx@yahoo.com)). Hrd on 12/1 from 0307 to 0336 and from 0340 to 0356 w/ vy nice Colombian music via the Perseus site in Central Germany. Infrequent male ancr, clear ID's for "Alcaraván Radio". Rafael will either e-QSL quickly, or for a written report and 2 IRC's (that option is not long from being no longer an option), he will send the old-fashioned LA QSL with station souvenirs, etc. The e-QSL is quite nice and I would say as good as the "real" QSL. Interestingly, Rafael appears also to be the QSL manager for the new Radio Logos station in Chazuto, Peru (4810 KHz). Ray Rising, one of the organizers of Radio Logos, sent an e-mail to Rafael asking that he QSL my Radio Logos report. I did get a quick reply from Rafael after this but the "QSL" was vague and had no details. Not sure how he got roped into this, but is obviously not prepared to duplicate his excellent reply for Alcaraván Radio.

He was definitely getting weakly modulated audio from Leh as we exchanged further messages. Although encouraged, I am not yet convinced I actually heard what seemed like singing. Another factor this day was the especially strong QRN!

This was on a particularly good morning to India, with lots of audio from Port Blair 4760 (however, read below) and Itanagar on 4990. It was much later (after 1325) that the SSB talking stopped, and I never heard any additional audio from Leh. Since sunset at Leh was around the time of the strongest signal, as well as when the possible audio was detected (and Mauno's observation), may I suggest those who can check in the coming week the 1200-1300 time frame. **MADAGASCAR. 6135.18, R Madagasikara**, 0305, Nov 29, carrier (&faint audio?) hetting /being hetted by R Santa Cruz open carrier 6134.80. In the clear when latter station closed 0312, still there at 0340 recheck but under annoying splatter from BBC English 6140, could not trace 5010. Tell-tale split freq still heard regularly to 1500y off, had never before heard them there in the morning (Martien Groot, Schoorl, Netherlands).

This is Taupo Maritime Radio..." fol by freq list which does not include 6224, but rather 6215 KHz. Nominal HF sked for Oceanic area warnings is 0903-0913 with a repeat at 0933-0943. This was a much longer bcst and there was no repeat after 0930. Nice USB sig lvl at S-3+ with moderate noise lvl and no QRM. (Bruce Churchill via DXPlorer)

In 2006 I heard ZLM on this channel and they replied with nice e-mail full data text QSL. Power is (was) 1kW. On 6224 I managed to catch also Andaman Islands, Port Blair Port Radio, but never had QSL from them.

**SPAIN [and non].** REE's broadcasts for North America have indeed vanished without advance notice. Another major SW broadcaster has abandoned us!

They obviously did not want to give listeners a chance to campaign against these cuts. There had been rumblings about reduxions in service, but this still comes as a shock, despite the overall financial crisis in Spain. Another clue, a bad omen, was that REE never registered a B-12 schedule with HFCC, forcing it just to keep on the books the B-11 schedule for reference.

which explains the changes, along with preserving the most popular programs and canceling others (what about `Amigos de la Onda Corta`? It's not mentioned as preserved), and trying to put a positive spin on this --- building up REE's ``digital`` coverage by internet and satellite instead of SW.

These numbskulls are keeping only the Spanish DRM broadcast to NAm, 9625-9630-9635 and beyond at 00-02 via Costa Rica, ensuring the smallest possible audience, instead of just one AM frequency!

## Other radio news

### An argument in favor of shortwave radio in the age of the Internet!

**First, it was Egypt.** At the height of the protest against the Mubarak regime in 2011, authorities shut the Internet down. This week, it was Syria. Just as rebel forces there were making big gains, someone pulled the plug on the Internet, and Syria went dark.

Service was restored on Saturday, but Andrew McLaughlin, former White House adviser on technology policy, expects we'll see more of this.

"The pattern seems to be that governments that fear mass movements on the street have realized that they might want to be able to shut off all Internet communications in the country, and have started building the infrastructure that enables them to do that," McLaughlin says.

The key to shutting down the Internet is building that infrastructure in such a way that the Internet service is provided by a government-owned company, subject to government orders. You could also have the service providers housed in facilities where the government could shut off the power. Technically, it's not hard.

These are the main differences with the 4.0b stable release, plus the reported bugfixes.

### **Client**

- . Support for Windows 8.
- . The servers map is no longer integrated in the Perseus software (when clicking on the "Show Map" button, a default browser window will open). The link between the map and the Perseus software is done by a tool (included in the package) called mhttps.exe. During the first run, administrative privileges are required to properly register the MTTP protocol.
- . mhttps.exe does no longer need the MS Redistributable libraries to run.
- . Buttons font rendering was modified to address some users that reported "blocky" or hardly readable labels on some buttons.
- . Audio Delay: this new feature inserts a configurable delay in the DSP chain, please refer to the release notes (included in the package) for more information about it.
- . FM Deemphasis: enabled while using the FM demodulator. The de-emphasis time constant (50-300 us) is user adjustable from the software Settings window.
- . Reversed RTTY and CW settings are now saved in the registry and restored at startup.
- . Notch filter stays enabled after stop and re-start while playing a recorded file.
- . Default connection timeout when trying to reach offline servers is now 5 seconds.
- . Setting a negative offset is now allowed in "Set Filter Bandwidth" command through CI-V.

When audio output is muted, changing demodulator does not re-enable it.

### **Server**

Support for Windows 8.

- . Support for the delay feature
- . Restarting the server is no longer needed after a DNS change
- . Blacklist support: using a text file (as explained in the release notes) it is possible to reject connections from an IP address or family of IP addresses (server software settings has a new section).

Note: due to a change in the protection algorithms needed to support Windows 8, some users may be unable to use their down-converter license (a few digits might change). In this case, contact me via email.


The campaign ends on Christmas Day, and (if successful) I'll be leaving for Yemen on March 12.

Sitt DX-intresse har Nils odlat som bla. ordförande i Åstrops DX-klubb. Kontakten med den klubben och andra han är medlem i kommer han också att hålla. De får sas en egen latinamerikakorrespondent.

Han ångrar aldrig att han stiger på SAS-planet till Rio. Det har han hunnit tänka över många gånger. Luzia möter och han får återse henne. De bilar de 70 milen till svärföräldrarnas hemstad och sedan vidare till Überlandia.
