**Jan Görlin (JGÖ) är kanske inte så där jättekänd i ”de inre kretsarna” men han har många år bakom rattarna.** Född 1948 i Nyköping fick han i början av 60-talet på biblioteket i Nyköping tag i en bok om kortvågslyssning av Hugo Gustavsson och därmed var intresset väckt. Hemma hade föräldrarna en Philips långsoffa, en bra mottagare på tiden och framför den började hans bana, som gått lite upp och ner. Första stationerna var de som sände på svenska, bl.a. Radio Roma och Vatican-radion, varifrån fick sitt första QSL, signerat av den välkände och omtyckta Lars Roth. Med en 50-meterstråd fortsatte han DX-andet, en favoritstation var Swiss Radio med sitt program ”Swiss Merry Goround”.



1964 kom han på att det fanns andra DX-are och tips att hämta, så det blev en prenumeration på Malmö DX-aren. Som många DX-are på den tiden blev han också en trogen lyssnare till de engelska piraterna; Radio London, Radio Caroline och alla de andra där den senaste musiken och de bästa hallåmännen fanns.

1967 var det dags att rycka in i lumpen och där blev det för Janne, liksom för många av oss andra i den åldern ett uppehåll i lyssningen.

Efter lumpen var det dags för studier på Chalmers i Göteborg, där han avgick med en civilingenjörsexamen på bygglinjen, något som resulterade i att han numera är VD för en byggfirma hemma i Norrköping.

Efter ett uppehåll på fem år var det dags att börja fingra på rattarna igen. Numera var han folkbokförd i Linköping och där i hyreshuset lyckades han på vinden få upp en inomhusantenn. Dags också att gå med i en lokal klubb, den numrerade avsmnade Folkunga DX-klubb, i förbundet har han varit medlem sedan mitten på 60-talet. Han har också varit medlem i den likaledes nedlagda DX Companions, en klubb från det lilla samhället Hällestad utanför Finspång.

Intresset har som sagt varierat med åren, men 1981 flyttade han med familjen till en villa i Krokek utanför Norrköping, och där fick han chansen att sätta upp en utomhusantenn och på nytt var det intressant att sätta på sig lurarna och ratta in lite nya länder.

1987 fick han nys om återstarten av NDL, Norrköpings Distanslyssnare och anmälde sig genast som medlem för att träffa lite likasinnade på ett bra avstånd. Han är väl inte den

flitigaste av mötesdeltagarna men dyker upp då och då, för inte så länge sedan för att bjuda på tårta för sitt 200:e land (numera har han 204).

Dock brukar han tillsammans med utd. släpa sig ur bingen tidig morgontid och åka ut till NDL:s QTH för att försöka höra några käpphästar, bl.a. Surinam, St. Pierre et Miquelon och Norra Cypern, en samling vilka vi lyckats knäcka efter ett par års försök.

Ett par Parkaresor har det också blivit, även de tillsammans med utd., då han lyckats slita sig från jobbet. Dock har han där lyckats hålla kontakten med detsamma via den i bilen monterade telefonen, vilken faktiskt fungerat i Parka. Under det första besöket lyckades vi både höra och få svar från Svalbard och Ceuta. Under det senaste gick Bahamas som ett spjut, återstår nu "bara" att få svar också. Däremot misslyckades vi med att höra både Tonga och Marshall Island, men kanske blir det en ny resa om ett par år.

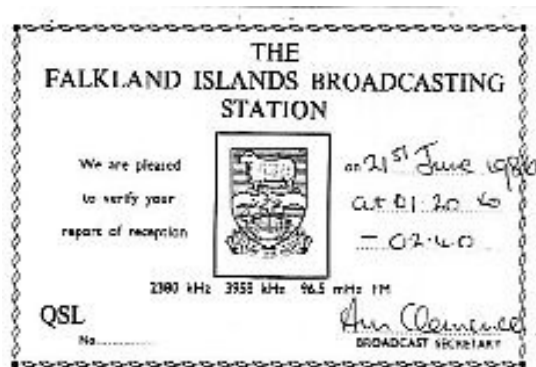
"Jag är i första hand landjägare," säger Janne. "Några större mängder stationer har jag inte, även om jag skickat en hel del rapporter efter mina Parkaresor. Numera bor jag i stan, Norrköping alltså, och att göra några fynd därifrån är ju omöjligt. Det får bli NDL-QTH:et lite då och då. Dessutom har jag ute vid min sommarkåk vid Slätbaken en skaplig FM-antenn, så det blir lite FM-DXing nu för tiden också."

Vilket är din bästa loggning och ditt bästa QSL är något man måste fråga om, och Janne tvekar inte.

"Det måste bli Falkland Island på, om jag inte minns fel, 2380 kHz. Jag jagade en ny brasse som skulle ligga på den frekvensen, och plötsligt hörde jag ett px på engelska. Det var Falkland Island som fadade in, och naturligtvis blev det en rapport. Belöningen blev ett QSL-kort och ett brev där Ann Clemence, Broadcast Secretary gratulerade mig till den fina fångsten. Det var en höjdare," säger Janne.

Några planer på att lägga ner lyssnandet, även om det nu är lite sparsamt, finns inte. "Än finns det ju några länder jag inte hört, och det gillar jag inte!"

**Arne Nilsson:** Since the previous issue of SWB, propagation towards the Pacific has been fair to quite good! I finally got audio off 3260/3365 and that certainly made my day and made all the work that I put into my Pacific antenna worth while! I guess that's what DXing is all about, at least for me: Hearing far away stations on my own equipment and on my own, self built, antennas. I am also happy to say that this antenna shows excellent electrical behavior, the SWR is flat at less than 1,5:1 from approx. 1-30 MHz.

It is tragic that those nice stations in the Pacific are disappearing, one by one. Not many left now and one has to look around for other challenges: MW DX is one option. MW still has quite a number of rare stations, but they are hard to get! MW also requires long wires for best reception and not everyone has real estate enough for that! And cx on MW have been lousy this autumn.

**Ron Howard:** Yesterday (Dec 4) a long segment of the highway adjacent to Ocean Beach, here in San Francisco, was closed to traffic due to blowing sand covering portions of the road. Therefore was unable to get to my favorite spot for SWLing. Glad to report that today the Great Highway was open again and I am back in business! Ron

What I find interesting is that you had 1415 with end of transmission. That is about the same time that some of the long running PNG NBC stations sign off too (NBC New Ireland on 3905 often signs off just after 1400; also 3365 signs off PNG-NBC, then I suggest the two would be mixing together, after 1400). BUT your " but heard one piece of march music and a lady singing in a very high pitch (opera?) after 1400z." sounds to me very much like KCBS programming and not like PNG NBC. Keep checking. You may be able to find a positive // that will solve the mystery! /Ron Howard

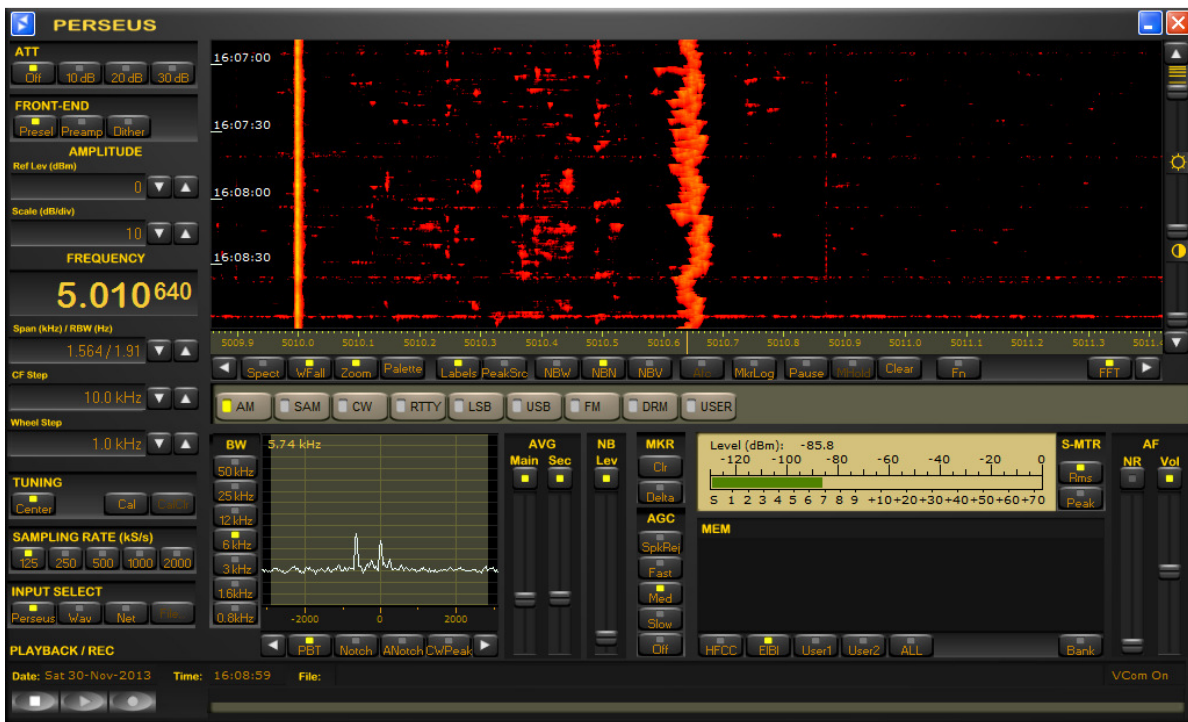

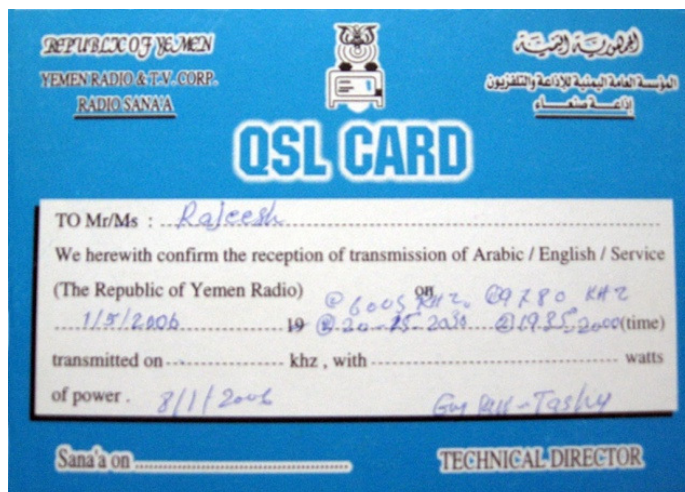

**BHUTAN** [non log]. 6035, BBS. Since reading of their recent reactivation, have checked for BBS from about 1300 to past 1500. Have only been able to hear PBS Yunnan, so perhaps BBS is back with a reduced schedule? This seems to conform to Gautam Kumar Sharma(GK) in Abhayapuri (Assam) (India) comments: "But I didn't find BBS's signal on 6035kHz on the evening and night on both November 20th & 21<sup>st</sup> also."

Recently Thomas Nilsson and I have both noted PBS Yunnan signing off at about 1500 (Nov 22 with 1500\*), with no other station present at that time. Certainly not hearing BBS with English from 1500 to 1600 UT. Needs continual monitoring. Nov 23 at 1300 heard only PBS Yunnan theme music on 6035.00 and nothing else, which conforms to - "I've not found any signal of Bhutan Broadcasting Service on 6035kHz on November 23th during my several airchecks from 0200 to 1030UTC. /73 & 55, Gautam Kumar Sharma(GK) Abhayapuri(Assam)(India)"

Dear xx:

I am the engineering consultant in charge of the Tropical Band use by Cuban stations, as well as other duties related to Radio Havana Cuba services.

The Radio Progreso 4765 kiloHertz frequency is on the air as "an experimental service", that goes on the air now at 0130 UT and until 0500 UT.

The Radio Rebelde 5025 kiloHertz frequency is on 24 hours with 50 kW and its omnidirectional NVIS high vertical departure angle antenna. It normally shows a high reliability, but it may have been off the air during the recent storm that was very strong in the La Habana and Artemisa provinces.

The Radio Rebelde transmitter is located at the Bauta transmitting station that is now part of the new Artemisa province Radio Havana Cuba's Tropical Band present frequency is on 5040 kiloHertz and it is registered at the ITU to start at this time of the year at 2200 UTC and be on their up to 0700 UT.

The 100 kW transmitter uses also an NVIS antenna.

In the near future, as solar cycle 24 moves into a period of much lower activity, we may perhaps begin to use the 90 meters band, following a past experience by Radio Rebelde on registered frequency of 3365 kiloHertz that proved to work very well for the NVIS service during the last years of solar cycle 22.

If you need a QSL from Radio Progreso or from Radio Havana Cuba you can send the request to me, and I will be happy to forward it to the station's correspondence departments.

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17540, Nov 27 at 1706, R. Mara, new clandestine for Rwanda, via MADAGASCAR, good with hiliife music, 1712 announcements in presumed Kinyarwanda. Ivo Ivanov reported this just started, but nothing yet known about its politix. Maybe something other than monarchist like the last one. 1755 still good with vocal music to abrupt off at 1757:05\* without any announcement (Glenn Hauser, OK, WORLD OF RADIO 1697, DXLD)

**MYANMAR: Myanmar Radio** with ABC Australia programs?

<http://www.mizzima.com/mizzima-news/media/item/10636-myanmar-radio-to-cooperate-with-australian-counterpart> contains a recent announcement that "Myanmar's state-run Radio and TV (MRTV) will cooperate with ABC (Australian Broadcasting Cooperation) International in program broadcasting, state media reported Friday."

An almost identical story appeared back in June 2012, with an agreement between Myanmar's state-run Radio and TV (MRTV) and the Voice of America (VOA). [http://news.xinhuanet.com/english/world/2012-06/06/c\\_131634340.htm](http://news.xinhuanet.com/english/world/2012-06/06/c_131634340.htm) . Shortly after the VOA story came out, Myanmar Radio indeed did start to broadcast "VOA Special English" programs on Wednesdays via their 5985.8v frequency, during the first half of their 1530 to 1630 UT segment in English.

That being the case in the past, we should perhaps keep a watch for ABC Australia programming to show up someday on that same frequency and perhaps also between 1530 to 1600, but probably not on Wednesday, as that is VOA's day. Now that we are well into the DX season, this is an ideal time to monitor for this possible new development.

**USA: KVOH, Voice of Peace**, Los Angeles re-launched on November 1st, and for the past 5 weeks has been broadcasting during North American evening hours on 9975 kHz, from 0200-0500 UTC.

On Sunday 8th December, KVOH will also be running a test on 17775 kHz, from 1400-1700 UTC. The programming will be a repeat of our Saturday night programs on 9975 kHz. The first two hours will be in Spanish, and the third hour, from 1600-1700, will be our jazz and swing show in English.

KVOH previously tested its 16 meter band transmitter back in July and August; this test is designed to gauge the effectiveness of 16 meter band winter propagation to our Central America & Caribbean target area, during the pre-dawn and early daylight hours at our transmitter site. ### Floodlight interference

I have a 27 watt CFL floodlight that I use in the shop along with four or five electronic ballasted fluorescent overhead lamps. The floodlight can be heard around 65 KHz (and harmonics) from 150 feet / 45 meters distance with a very strong signal, and indeed if I do any measurements with an oscilloscope I can't have the floodlight operating or else the waveform being observed is contaminated with the 65 KHz signal. The electronic ballasted overhead lamps have a similar problem but at a somewhat lower frequency.

The government is driving everyone to these energy efficient products so the problem of unwanted interference is only going to get worse.

And after tearing down a couple of Chinese CFLs, it was clear that both had PCB pads for EMI control parts but they were not installed. I assume the EMI control parts were used for approval testing and then removed for volume production. I'll have to try an LED lamp and see if that improves the unwanted radio smog. I may wind up replacing the overhead fluorescent lamps with something else - maybe a home made strip of white LEDs with an analog power supply.

I also noted an interesting mus-mash of SDR-Radio spectrum "lines" (signals) interestingly spaced and lovable as to their noise content.

So, I used my "old fashioned digital receiver" PL-660 as a portable "EMI/RFI Detector", and scanned my environment.

After a brief analysis, punctuated by new and innovative swear words, and a few "Holy crap...that thing is noisy!"...:

I switched from my 27W CFL tube powered desk/area light to a 3W LED of equal light output, and said noise magically dropped. Then, when I did likewise to the 27W CLF in the ceiling light, all the noise(s) vanished.

Yes, the LED lamps cost a bit, yet the results were well worth it.

### Cheap switching PSUs

Cheap switching PSUs are almost always RF sources. At my DX location (which is shared with 3 other DX-ers), there are around 15 external hard drives, of WD and Seagate brands. Their PSUs are junk, but luckily they need 12VDC so it's easy to find linear PSUs to power them. Actually we use one or two large (10-20A) PSUs and power bars, such as the MFJ-1112 power strip.

Linear PSUs may cost a bit more (just like Jack's LED lamps) but if you want a clean spectrum you must be prepared to pay for it.

Hopefully all this contributes to the promotion of DXing in China, both as a hobby and also as a way to monitor alternative news sources - which is still needed in China. As many Chinese broadcasters - despite this new PR - don't know anything about our hobby, it might be a good idea to include one of the Chinese links along with your reception report, if you're interested in getting verifications from Chinese stations.

The reports were made by a Xinhua news group driving 1,200 km from the Finnish capital Helsinki all the way to Lapland just for the purpose of reporting on DXing - and reindeer.
