Went out on a micro-DXpedition last Friday evening (10 October 2014) and found a few stations on the air. It isn't much, but here's a report. A link for an Abu Dhabi video is included.

**Ullmar Qvick** (via NORDX): Vår hobby består idag till stor del av minnen från fornstora dar. För min del har alltid Radiotjänst som sen blev Sveriges Radio ingått i basen för mitt radiointresse. Det var där det började, och tidningen Röster i Radio var min lilla DX-bibel de första åren. Och P1 följer mig varje dag!

Nu hittade jag på loppis en minnesbok *Hört och sett. Radio och television 1925-1974* med 336 sidor och många bilder som illustrerar textavsnitten. På Röda Korset hittade jag några dagar senare en annan bok som täcker samma period plus lite till: *Nils-Olof Franzén: Radiominnen.* Boken är utgiven 1991 och jag hittade den i RK:s gratishylla... Min totala kostnad för svensk radiohistoria ligger på 50 kr.

Många intressanta detaljer: Det finns inga som helst inspelningar från den svenska radions första år, för man hade ingen teknik, men skriftliga skildringar finns, inte minst dem som den legendariske Sven Jerring, den förste hallåmannen, har bidragit med.

**Ron Howard:** Hi Gentlemen, Am shortly off to Shanghai for three weeks, so no reports for a while. Best regards.

**Anker Petersen**: As mentioned two weeks ago, reception conditions for Latin America still are very poor here in Denmark.

I listened from Skovlunde on my AOR AR7030PLUS with 28 metres of longwire at 9 metres altitude. This time I scanned the 90 and 60 mb in the middle of our night at 0000-0125 UTC. Only two stations from all Latin America were audible: R Rebelde on 5025 and R Habana Cuba on 5040 - and only with moderate strength. At the same time I heard 15 Asian stations, many with a strong signal!

**Arne Nilsson:** To say that activities on SW are low right now is probably an understatement! OK, I normally scan the bands almost every day, but very seldom find anything exciting. And the log this time is ridiculously short, HI. One interesting observation from this morning (25.10), though, was a weak carrier from The Cross 4755,6 and that's a first for this season at this location.

## **Old radio hunters mark history**

Forget vinyl. If you're looking for unadulterated sounds from old-school technology, listen to a man who goes by the name Didi Radio talk about his collection.

"I think their designs are very artistic. Their sounds are also more natural, because they're analog receivers and use tubes. Their resonance is far better than transistor and digital radios," Didi Radio, whose real name is Didi Widianto, said.

He made his comments at the recent Layang Swara (Sound Messenger) exhibition, which displayed 60 vintage radios, some dating to the 1930s, at the Soedjatmoko Cultural Center in Surakarta, Central Java.

The radios came from the private collections of members of the Audio Radio Preservers of Yogyakarta (Padmaditya) in Yogyakarta and Magelang, Central Java.

Although decades old, the receivers — mostly tube radios made by Philips, Erres, Blaupunkt, Robin and Telefunken — are well maintained and still working.

"We collect the radios for their historic value. In their times, these sets were so important for the dissemination of information. They were also a luxury," said Didi Sumarsidi, another Padmaditya member. "In the 1960s, we had to crowd the subdistrict office to listen to the radio."

Padmaditya was founded in 2011 by collectors who would hunt for old radios at antique shops and flea markets.

After meeting to exchange information and spare parts in different cities and villages, the collectors decided to form a community.

"Originally there were only 11 people. We continued to promote the love of old radios from then on. Today there are over a hundred Padmaditya members from Yogyakarta, as well as other cities such as Solo, Semarang, Surabaya and Jakarta," Didi said.

Like Didi Radio, Edi Sunaryo says he was lured by the distinctive designs and analog sound. "The analog system gives the impression of a genuine human voice."

Edi says his zeal for collecting came rather late, only two years ago.

"I've been going around flea markets and antique stores in Yogyakarta, Solo and even Surabaya, sometimes alone and more often along with other members. As long as the products are well-designed and their prices reasonable, I take them," Edi said.

Edi, who says he has eight radios in his collection, doesn't care whether they work or not. Attractive shapes and complete spare parts are more important.

"Not a problem if the radios don't work because some community members are skilled in repairing tube receivers," Edi said. "Many friends have had their damaged radios fixed up. If they're irreparable they can still be modified."

Among his several radios showcased at the exhibition was a Bence, made in Surabaya in 1956 — and reportedly the first to be produced in Indonesia. The radio is pyramidal and made with a wooden frame.

There was also a Philips radio dating to the mid-1950s working in the short wave (SW), medium wave (MW) and frequency modulation (FM) bands.

"This radio is rare because when it was produced, the FM waveband wasn't yet known in Indonesia," Edi, who also teaches at the Indonesian Arts Institute (ISI) of Yogyakarta, said.

Edi said he was lucky he could buy the radios from an owner and not a third party. "A radio worth Rp 200,000 (US\$16.3) from its owner could cost Rp 1 million from a dealer."

Didi Sumarsidi, a former physician for the Indonesian Military (TNI), said he once took home 40 old radios – much to the dismay of his wife, who thought the pieces were scrap metal.

When he was assigned to Bima, West Nusa Tenggara, he returned with two old radio sets, each weighing 12 kilograms. "They were Siemens multiband radios made in Germany."

Didi says he has two prized pieces in his collection of 175 radios: a Philips radio with a dial in the shape of a compass and a Philips Bi-Ampli, both of which he bought for Rp 200,000 and are still working.

The value of the radios for sale at the exhibition ranged form Rp 200,000 to Rp 12 million, Didi said. However, collectors are selective, only selling to fellow hobbyists and usually only because they already have more than one radio of a specific type.

The oldest radio at the show resembled a cathedral. It was a Dutch-made Philips product of the 1930s. Somebody once offered to buy it for Rpv20 million but its owner wouldn't give it up. Actually, the radio was bought for Rp 300,000, said Didi, a collector since 1970.

Viewers could marvel at a Philips Aida made in 1946 in Eindhoven, Holland, with city names still printed on the wavelength dial with traditional (tempo doeloe) spellings, such as Batavia for Jakarta, Soerabaia for Surabaya and Bandoeng for Bandung.

Transistor radios of the 1960s, such as Ralin-brand radios, were on show, still operating in the SW and MW bands.

Radio expert Iwan Ganjar also displayed some manual gramophones of the 1920s. Using no electricity, the old record players operate by winding a crankshaft.

"This exhibition constitutes a way for us to document historic articles," Didi said. "With the changing times, the objects that once marked the nation's history should not just be forgotten."

## DX Report on Peruvian SW stations 23 October, 2014 aboard the MS Zaandam

As we were preparing to leave Lima, Peru, I was able to set up a relatively decent radio setup aboard our cruise ship, the Holland America's MS Zaandam. Over the last few weeks, I located a private area, electrically quiet, and almost ideal for reception. It's located on the aft end, 6<sup>th</sup> deck with a convenient flag pole to secure my 75 feet of random wire which I brought along on the cruise, as well as my trusty Eton e100 tiny portable receiver. I coupled the wire to the receiver initially by wrapping a few strands of the Teflon coated wire to the collapsed whip, but later found that directly connecting via an alligator clip did not overload the receiver. I connected the receiver via a patch cord to record a few of the stations heard using Total Recorder Pro



on my little MSI Wind notebook. What I have yet to try is the SDR-IQ which I also brought along. The main issue is the total lack of any electrical outlets, so the session lasted about 2 hours, the duration of the battery life of the little notebook. Here's the setup at the aft end of the ship:

Much more preferable than standing on the Promenade holding the receiver in my outstretched hand, and garnering a lot of puzzled looks (I was decoding VOA Radiogram). Interestingly, most people asked whether I had an "internet signal". Understandable, I suppose, since the cost of internet aboard can be up to \$0.75 a minute! Ouch!!!

I had downloaded the A14 SW frequency schedule earlier, and noted the large number of Peruvian SW stations listed. Unfortunately, very few stations are still using SW in Peru, at least in the time frame of 20:55 to past 23:00 UTC that I monitored. One more interesting photo is included below, taken while on a tour of Lima. Well worth the visit, as this is a truly fascinating and lovely city of almost 9 million people. The antenna itself had no obvious markings, so it may very well be abandoned. The building at the base was likewise abandoned in appearance. I'd welcome suggestions on what type of antenna this represents. Lima did list a number of SW stations, but not a single one I could find was on the air.

As you might see, there were lots of insulators on the guy wires, as well as that interesting vertical component. I suspected that this might have been an old SW transmitting antenna? Now on to the report: I checked every frequency on SW for Peru, and also for Bolivia. Frequency was only readable down to 1 kHz on the Eton. I often tuned 1 kHz above or below to improve reception.

- 6174 Radio Tawantisuyo, Cusco. Good ID heard at 20:55. Rapidly improving in strength to very good reception at 22:00. All in Spanish.
- 4985.5 Listed as Radio Voz Cristiana, but not sure about this. Fair to good at 21:07 Programming did not sound religious.
- 4955 Radio Cultural Amauta, Huanta. Nice ID heard at 21:18. Very good at 22:16.
- 4775 Radio Tarma, Tacna. Very good at 21:22, and continued at great levels when rechecked at 22:50 and 23:10. Lots of local ads.
- 5025 Radio Quillabamba, Cusco. Not heard before 21:00, but very good signal at 21:38. ID at 21:44, mentioning Onda Corta.
- 4747 Radio Huanta 2000, Huanta. Not on the air before 22:00 but at very good level at 22:15 and again at 23:09.
- 5980 Radio Chaski, Peru at good level at 22:40 UTC. Nothing heard earlier.

Now, I also heard a number of other interesting stations. On the Eton, one has to be careful with images in the receiver, and perhaps some of these listed below might represent these.

- unid at 22:00 with Koran chants fair level. Later, at 22:51, there was a powerful Spanish station on this frequency.
- 3340 Likely Radio Misiones Internacional, Honduras. Fair/poor level at 22:10.



tent Radio Em Camargo, Bolivia at fair level at 22:50.

A number of Brazilians started to fade in later in my session: 3370, 4805, 4815, 4865, 4885 to name a few.

3325 Spanish heard at 23:07 unid.

So, very few Latin American stations left on SW, but Brazil, if that is an interest, still seems to have many stations remaining on the tropical bands. I'm hoping to monitor a bit more, especially as we round the Cape. I have heard LRA 36 several days ago, at poor to good level, with deep fades. I expect reception will continue to improve over the next week or two, as we approach Antarctica.
