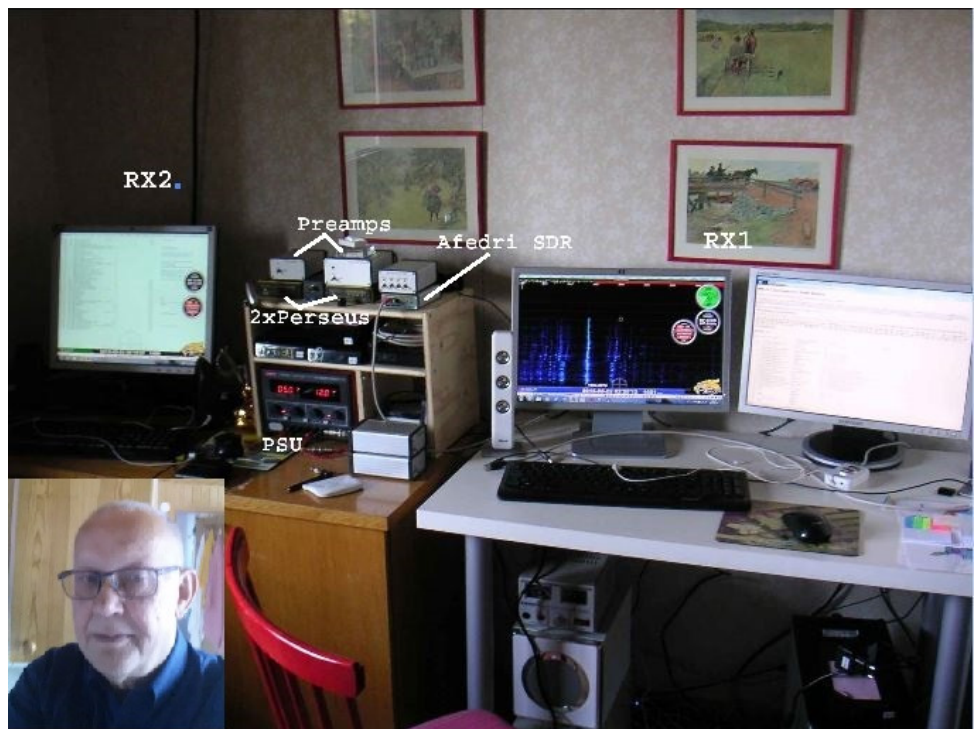

Robert Wilkner: OTTAWA, Ontario — At the height of the Cold War, the BBC World Service, Radio Canada International and the Voice of America used high-power, multilingual broadcasts on the shortwave radio bands (1710 kHz–30 MHz) to blast news and information behind the Soviet Union's "Iron Curtain." In turn, Radio Moscow, Radio Havana Cuba and East Germany's Radio Berlin International pumped their own versions of reality to the world via shortwave.

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EASY TO BLOCK

"In an effort to prevent the dissemination of information related to this event, the Chinese censorship authorities have severely blocked most Google services in China, including search and Gmail," said the China Web traffic watchdog Greatfire.org in a June 2 email to Bloomberg News. "Our gut feeling is this disruption may be permanent."

It is relatively simple for authoritarian regimes to block websites they don't like. But in fairness, shortwave radio broadcasts can also be blocked by "jamming" stations. "Some BBC World Service Internet services are blocked in specific countries — most notably in China," said Fry. "The English shortwave broadcasts to China and the surrounding countri-

on FM and satellite, and would also do the same on Internet. Briefing Journalists last month after a meeting between officials of Ministry of Information and President Buhari, Dr. Shade Yemi-Esan, Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Information said: "Right now the signals from radio Biafra have been jammed successfully by NBC. The commission is also working with security agencies to get those that are behind that radio because it is an illegal radio. It is not licensed by anybody to be on the airwaves in Nigeria." Nnamdi Kanu, Radio Biafra Director in a statement posted on their website, described their shortwave radio as "Nuclear War Head". It is unbelievable that Radio Biafra that is supposed to have had its wings clipped by NBC is now not only broadcasting in the South East and Niger Delta but now sending its air waves across Nigeria and Africa. Has NBC lost the air wave war with Radio Biafra? The answer will be known with what happens in the next few day[s]` The story is illustrated with a young opposite-gender couple embracing, but not clear who they are. The local times given in UT +1 correspond to UT: 06-08 and 18-20. It's likely that the site is Issoudun, FRANCE, which is on 15560 to Africa immediately prior to both broadcasts (but Deutsche Welle relays had then been scheduled, presumably, as backup/alternatives, surely out of the way for this).

COLOMBIA. 5910 & 6010, Aug 29 at 0110, no signals from **HJDH and HJDH** (but a JBA carrier on 6010.0; HFCC shows only possibility is a 5 kW reserve transmitter in Belarus, 23 hours a day; more likely a 5 kW Brazilian, unbeknownst to HFCC, but not off-frequency?). It seems the last time the Colombians were heard was May 23 as in DXLD 15-21.

I asked HJDH QSL manager Rafael Rodríguez R. in Bogotá why they are off, and received this rather surprising reply, original Spanish in the dxldyg and next DXLD; here in my translation: (Glenn Hauser, OK, DXLD)

Best Regards, Mr. Hauser, Earlier this year, Martin Stendal was linked by the Colombian Attorney General in an investigation for alleged support he would give the Colombian guerrillas of the FARC. He was accused by two former guerrillas seeking economic and legal benefits, incriminating Martin. The investigation determined that the work he carried out in no way could be interpreted as support for the FARC, because what he does is just evangelize and seek peace in Colombia.

Among the accusations, it was mentioned that he used the shortwave broadcasters to send encrypted messages, something that was not proven, but during the period of the investigation he preferred to keep them off the air. At the end of May he was exonerated of any accusations.

He also suffered the loss of his father, who started the evangelical work here in Colombia. After that I could not really have direct contact with him. I am informed he has decided to wait until all the investigation calms down and he is not currently in Colombia.

The organization decided to perform preventive maintenance on the equipment which already had some flaws, but an ongoing problem in the area where the transmitters are located is the electricity supply (ups and downs, absence, etc.). After the maintenance it was decided to hold off until the situation is regularized, through a power plant fueled by diesel.

Actually I have no official information about ceasing broadcasts on shortwave, but all the work that Martin and his organization developed is going through changes. I am confident that sometime soon they will reactivate transmissions.

ZAMBIA. In Africa, the biggest problem we are facing in Zambia at the moment is what they call "load shedding". Central Southern Africa has been experiencing drought conditions for the last few years, and water levels at the Zambesi dam are much lower than normal. Most electricity in Zambia (to the north) and Zimbabwe (to the south) is supplied from hydro electric turbines at the dam, and that supply has been greatly reduced. As a result, most areas in and around Lusaka are now experiencing rotating power outages for 9 hours per day, every day. While we do have a 750 kVA Caterpillar genset onsite that is capable of powering both transmitters in an emergency, to run that from diesel for 9+ hours per day would be prohibitively expensive. So, we are hoping that, when the rainy season starts in October, they will get a good amount of rainfall, and that power generation will return to normal. We will have a permanent American missionary/transmitter engineer onsite from the beginning of September, and we are now working towards a November sign-on for 'Voice of Hope - Africa'.

NIGERIA. [Masterweb Reports] - Radio Biafra has launched a satellite television dubbed Biafra Television and a shortwave (SW) radio that will cover most Africa and beyond. According to the clandestine station, the frequency of the broadcast is 15560 kHz in the 19 meter band and hours of broadcast for the time being, 7.00 – 9.00 am and 7.00 – 9.00 pm Nigerian time. The station still broadcasts on FM, satellite and Internet, even though Nigeria National Broadcasting Commission (NBC) claim they have blocked them on FM and satellite, and would also do the same on Internet. Briefing Journalists last month after a meeting between officials of Ministry of Information and President Buhari, Dr. Shade Yemi-Esan, Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Information said: “Right now the signals from radio Biafra have been jammed successfully by NBC. The commission is also working with security agencies to get those that are behind that radio because it is an illegal radio. It is not licensed by anybody to be on the airwaves in Nigeria.”

Nnamdi Kanu, Radio Biafra Director in a statement posted on their website, described their shortwave radio as “Nuclear War Head”. It is unbelievable that Radio Biafra that is supposed to have had its wings clipped by NBC is now not only broadcasting in the South East and Niger Delta but now sending its air waves across Nigeria and Africa. Has NBC lost the air wave war with Radio Biafra? The answer will be known with what happens in the next few days.

Willis Conover, The Voice Of Jazz Behind The Iron Curtain

Willis Conover was known around the world, but not so much at home. He was the voice of jazz over the Voice of America for more than 40 years, most of it during the Cold War.

Imagine what it was like to sit in the dark of a hushed room in Prague, Moscow or Warsaw in the 1960s, fiddle with the dial of a shortwave radio, slide over crackles, pops, and jamming, to finally find the opening notes of "The A Train" and a rich baritone intoning slowly through the static, "Good evening. Willis Conover with Music USA ... "

He played the Count, the Duke, and Satchmo, Dizzy, Miss Sarah Vaughan and Charlie Parker.

I remember asking East Berliners in the early 1990s, "Where did you learn such excellent English?" They didn't say the name of any movie, rock star or statesman, just: "Willis Conover."

Jan Zappner, the Czech jazz accordion player, told Terence Ripmaster, who wrote a Conover biography, that when he was a soldier in the Czech army, "Private radios were not allowed, so ... every night at ten o'clock, I sneaked through the toilet window into the communications building, where there was a shortwave radio on which I tuned in the Voice of America."

"There it was, 'The A Train,' and the great voice of Willis Conover. I will never forget that feeling of sweet conspiracy. While the barracks, the country, indeed, the whole socialist camp was asleep, I ... found out that over the trenches of the Cold War there was normal life, with great music ..."

It was a little hard for millions of people to believe that Americans were imperialist running-dog lackeys after they'd listened to Stan Getz, Miles Davis, and Thelonious Monk.

As Conover told Time Magazine in 1966, "Jazz tells more about America than any American can realize. It bespeaks vitality, strength, social mobility; it's a free music with its own discipline, but not an imposed, inhibiting discipline."

Conover, who died in 1996, could pack concert halls for jazz shows behind the Iron Curtain. But he wasn't a household name in his own country because by law, the Voice of America cannot broadcast to the United States.

This week, Doug Ramsey, who writes about jazz for the Wall Street Journal, reported that a campaign to persuade the Postal Services Stamp Advisory Committee to put Willis Conover on a U.S. postage stamp now has thousands of signatures. It would send the face of the voice who brought the light of hot jazz into the darkest places of the Cold War around the world again.

Historisk dag för SSA – 28 augusti 1925!

Publicerat 28 augusti, 2015

Idag för exakt 90 år sedan samlades ett antal sändaramatörer i Stockholm. Intresset var uppenbarligen stort och det beslutades att gå vidare med bildandet av en förening, och påföljande möte utlystes till den 10 september i Stockholms Radioklubbs lokaler på Hamngatan 1 A. Ett referat från mötet den 28 augusti trycktes upp och om ni klickar på dokumentet kan ni ganska lätt läsa hela texten.

Den viktigaste delen av texten lyder så här:

”Initiativtagarna för bildande av en ny förening för sändaramatörer i Sverige sammanträdde torsdagen den 28 aug. i Stockholm för att med ledning av inkomna svar å den föregående cirkulärskrivelsen undersöka möjligheterna för föreningens bildande och preliminärt utforma riktlinjerna för dess första verksamhet.

Då intresset visat sig stort och många anmälningar inkommit, beslöts att utlysa ett sammanträde torsdagen den 10 sept. kl. 7,30 e.m. å Stockholms Radioklubbs lokal Hamngatan 1 A i Stockholm.

För saken intresserade sändaramatörer ombedjas att då infinna sig eller att i brev till Interimsektariatet, Stockholms Radioklubb, insända eventuella förslag till styrelse eller önskemål beträffande föreningens arbete och organisation. Samtidigt torde de som förut inte insänt sin 2-krona benäget göra detta.”

Därefter följer två konkreta förslag om kalibreringssignaler på fasta tider och utgivande av månadshäfte med utdrag ur loggböcker. Önskemålen om månadshäftet och kalibreringssignalerna blev med tiden en realitet, men det skulle dröja först till oktober 1927 då QTC kom ut med sitt första nummer.
