Radio Triunfal Evangelica memories

The item from Arnaldo about Radio Triunfal Evangelica, Chile, brings back great memories, which I will try to reconstruct with the help of some old NUs.

R. Triunfal Evangelica was a 50 watt station on 5825. Gabriel Ivan Barrera in Argentina first reported them in July 1996, heard up to 2400 UTC on 5824.9, but badly QRMed by WEWN s/on after that. On October 16 he heard them again, on 5824.88, with what must have been a pretty good signal, as he was able to copy the ID text, which included a request for reports to the station address in Talagante, near Santiago. He then telephoned the station, which was run by Bishop Fernando Gonzalez Seguro, who gave the then-current sked as 2100-2400 (except Thursdays and Sundays).

Two weekends later, I and a few other members of the Boston Area DXers did a DXpedition to our usual oceanside site on the Pemaquid Peninsula in Maine. I had 5825 on my target list, and while listening on Saturday, October 26 at 2250 I started hearing what I called a "weak but persistent signal" on 5824.94, with religious songs, talk, "almost certainly SP." I listened intently to almost midnight UTC and was hoping to get the s/off announcement on the hour, and a tuning signal, which GIB had reported, but the frequency was blocked by the WEWN s/on at 2358. Soon after this, WEWN started signing on at 2300 rather than 2400, so the 2300-2400 window for possible Triunfal Evangelica reception disappeared.

I sent the station a report with a tape of my reception (no emails with MP3 attachments in those days). At the same time I sent a tape to GIB, who later confirmed that it was them, and that he could identify the voice of the bishop at various points on the tape. Around then, GIB also received a QSL letter from the station for his own reception, and my fingers were crossed. Seven weeks after sending the report, I received a full-data QSL from the bishop. (It had been in transit to me by registered mail for three of the seven weeks). See attached JPG. GIB later advised me that he had visited the station after my report had arrived there and posted the reply himself. He reported hearing the station again in December, by which time it was on 5824.7. In January 1997 I received a second letter from the bishop, this time a thank you with an inspirational message.

Such were the things that made it all worthwhile "in the good old days" (although 20 years seems not very long ago). We all have stories like this.

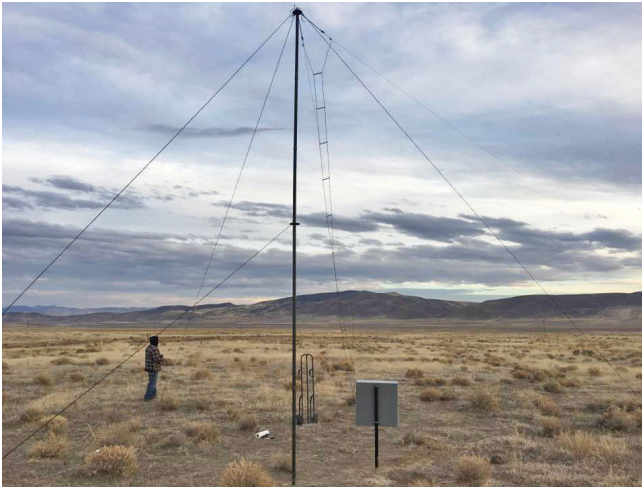

We have built radio stations in Honduras (www.radiomi.com), Central America (Radio MI on AM, Shortwave, and the web. They are heard locally in Central America and in many other nations. IMF helped build this station many years ago. In the USA we have purchased a property near Battle Mountain, NV where we are working to build a powerful Shortwave Station which will be beamed at Mexico and Asia. It can be heard also in North America. We plan to build more stations after this. We have also just built a radio control center and small studio in Corona, CA to send programs to these transmitters via satellite/internet. It is now in operation. 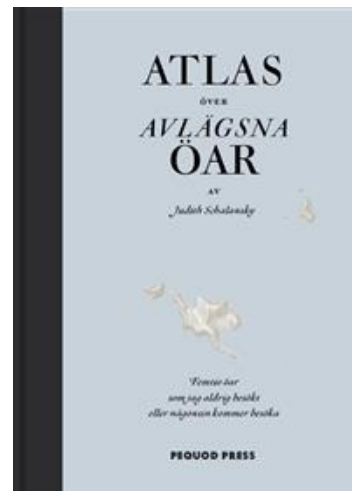

Den 26 september 2003 börjar 3COV sända. Trots att det är dåligt väder och att de inte ens har aktiverat det lägsta frekvensbandet får de omedelbart radiokontakt med flera enheter. Ju lägre frekvens, desto längre vågor, Det går inte en dag utan att de besväras av militären, som ställer frågor och ber dem visa sina identitetshandlingar och tillstånd, trots att de i förväg varit i kontakt med landets myndigheter och förklarat att radioamatörer inte intresserar sig för vare sig politik eller religiösa frågor utan uteslutande för kommunikation över gränserna. Varje enskild deltagare har personligen fått tillstånd av transport- och kommunikationsministern att besöka ön i två veckor, och har av tullen fått dispens att föra in - och ut - exakt ett styck radioutrustning.

Klockan tio på morgonen den 4 oktober får expeditionen ett abrupt slut. Myndigheterna har beordrat att alla sändningar omedelbart skall avbrytas och antennerna plockas ned. Radioamatörerna får tre timmar på sig att montera ner stationen och flygs redan samma dag till huvudstaden Malabo med ett ryskt transportflygplan. Stora delar av fotodokumentationen går förlorad och telefonsamtalen med anhöriga avbryts ständigt. Två dagar senare får DJ9ZB och EA5FO tillstånd att lämna landet. EA5BZP och EA5ZN hålls kvar.

Den 10 oktober får också de återvända hem: *Vi beklagar djupt att vi inte kunnat uppfylla expeditionens målsättning och är mycket tacksamma för all den hjälp vi fått av föreningar, klubbar och privatpersoner. liksom för den vänlighet och vänskap som Annobon borna har visat oss. Tyvärr kan vi inte gå in i detalj på vad som har hänt, eftersom vi vill hålla möjligheten till framtida expeditioner öppen. Vi ber om förståelse för den svåra och känsliga situation som vi har hamnat i. Hur som helst, vi ger inte upp hoppet om att kunna återaktivera 3COV så snart omständigheterna tillåter.*

PINA is a regional media umbrella group in the Pacific whose president, Moses Stevens said in the Pacific radio remains the most effective and efficient means of communication and source of information.

He said the ABC shortwave has been a lifeline for many rural people in the Pacific for almost 80 years.

The organisation has made a formal request for the ABC to reconsider its decision.

France decided to stop its emissions in long wave AM to December 31, 2016 to 23H59.

The disappearance of amplitude modulation, scheduled for the end of 2016, should enable Radio France to 13 million euros in savings.

She signs the end of an era.

However, the transmitter should be saved. Indeed, there is an atomic clock, giving hundreds of thousands of receiver's French legal time.

Allouis, will retain a vocation scientific and legal. Since [1977](#) the **Allouis** transmitter is also used for the transmission of signals from an [atomic clock](#) installed in the main building.

It takes less than one second error in a million years.

Time signals are issued in [phase modulation](#). Their transmission format is similar to that of the DCF77.

Time signals allow access to French legal time and synchronize

clocks. Reception modules are marketed for this purpose.

The financing and maintenance of the system are provided since 2004 by the French Chamber of watchmaking and Microtechnology (MFHC).

These signals are widely used in key sectors of industry requiring synchronization reliability: production and distribution of electricity, air transport, rail and road as well as for the management of public lighting, the synchronization of traffic lights crossroads, etc.

DX-Radio, Sveriges första "riktiga" DX-tidning.

1944 grundade Birger Lundström Sveriges Radioklubb och Sveriges första egentliga DX-tidning, DX-Radio, såg dagens ljus. Med på åtminstone ett hörn var Arne Skoog "Mr DX". Om man undantar tidningsklubbar som "Teknikens Världs Radioklubb" och "Teknik för allas Eterklubb" blev SRK snabbt Sveriges största DX-klubb, en position klubben troligen behöll under hela sin existens. I mars 1953 planerades bl.a. av ekonomiska skäl, en samgång med Scandinavian DX-Club, men sammanslagningen verkställdes aldrig. Till synes trollades klubbens ekonomiska problem bort rätt snabbt för maj-numret av DX-Radio utkom som maskinsatt och tryckt tidning och även i fortsättningen var tidningen tryckt. Att Birger Lundström och Grafisk Reproduktion, där tidningen trycktes hade ett finger – ett stort sådant - med i spelet behöver man väl inte tvivla på.

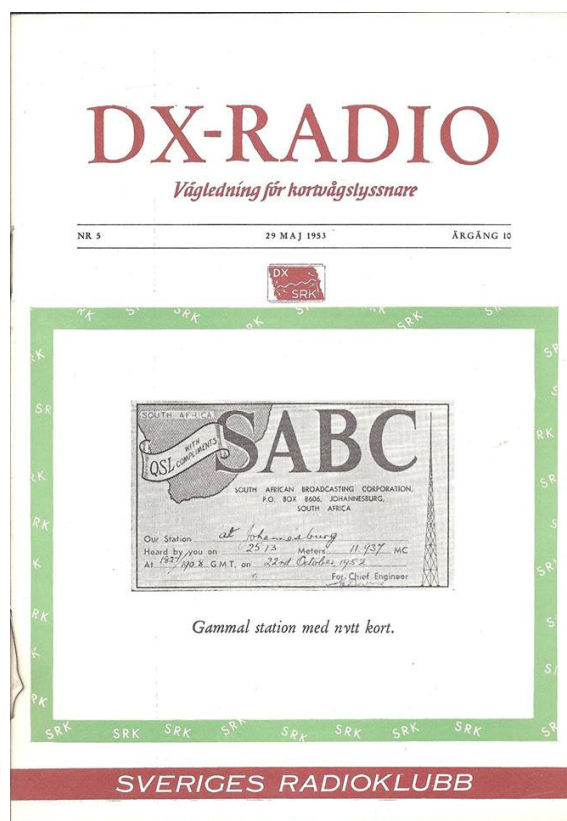

Han är bra vår ordförande och vi hylla honom av hjärtat den 6 oktober och önska honom fortsatt framgång som hövding, idékläckare och glädjespridare. — Till sist en passus — med mycket smussel undanhålla vi vår ansvarige utgivare detta manus denna gång eftersom det är han som är födelsedagsbarnet.
