De kan ju t.ex. lägga fram bevis för ev. kunder som tänker utnyttja deras service att de faktiskt har hög kvalitet tekniskt och når ut till lyssnarna.

Jag skickade under år 2016 193 rapporter av vilka 119 verifierades, 67%. Fram till dags dato i år har jag skickat 164 rapporter med hittills 102 svar, 62%. Det ser ut som om jag kommer någon procent högre i slutresultatet i år, att döma av läget i slutet av oktober i fjol.

Vi kan utöva vår hobby för vårt höga nöjes skull. Men vi kan också bidra till samhörighet mellan alla som älskar radion och vill att den ska leva vidare. Det kan vi också uttrycka genom vår rapportering till stationerna.

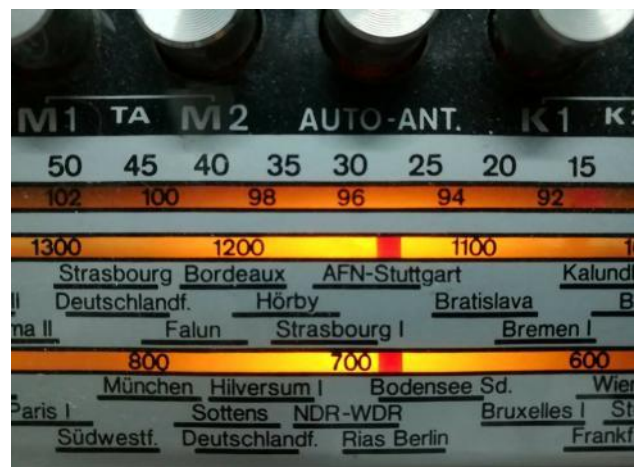

For many years 4835 kHz. was the frequency of ABC Alice Springs NT, but that was shut down earlier this year and is now extinct. **Craig Allen** (owner and operator of the low powered "Ozy Radio," that was recently successfully testing on 5045 kHz., till off the air since Sept 17), now has the use of 4835 kHz.. He indicated to me "I was able to acquire this frequency off the government."

Craig inquired as to what the current situation for me was regarding any 4835 reception. My reply:

"Here on the California coast the only station I occasionally do hear now on 4835 kHz. is All India Radio - Gangtok (Sikkim). Majority of days I can only hear their weak carrier, but when there is very good propagation, I can hear some faint audio. Here is a recording I made earlier this year - <http://goo.gl/Jw2yxo> . They play nice subcontinent music.

As you can hear, even on a very good day, they have rather poor reception via their 10 kW transmitter. AIR Gangtok schedule: 0100-0415 UTC & 1030-1600 UTC.

Can only guess that Ozy Radio would have no real problem on most days of being heard here in California over AIR Gangtok. It is rare that reception of AIR Gangtok on 4835 kHz. is reported in the SW listening press, unless from within India or that general area."

Would indeed be wonderful to again have an Australian station on 4835. Wish Craig good luck with his endeavors! (Ron Howard, Oct 25, San Francisco, CA, dxldyg via DX LISTENING DIGEST)

Propagation-Triggered SDR Recordings

Automatic SDR Medium Wave Recording based on 160 Meters DX Results: Finnish MW DXer Jukka Salomaa, OH2BUA, has written a set of files for controlling the popular HDSDR software on an automatic basis. His goal is to have HDSDR launch unattended WAV "I/Q" recordings overnight, whenever his receiver detects the reception of weak North American DX in the FT8 digital mode on the 160 meter amateur band. He says the scripts are modifiable to DX from your own target areas. According to Jukka the system is fairly sensitive, but a trigger sensitivity filter can be added to adjust for false positives (i.e., weak FT8 traffic from the target area does not always result in MW DX being received from the same region). Jukka uses a SDRPlay RSP2 receiver, but I'm sure any other SDR radio using the HDSDR software could work well.

He has written in detail about these experiments in this series of forum messages on the SDRplay web site: <http://www.sdrplay.com/community/viewtopic.php?f=9&t=1839> At the bottom of the page you will find a ZIP archive of Jukka's scripts and other files which can be modified to suit your own location, UTC time offset, and desired MW DX target areas.

Devising means by which the entertainment and media industries could support the war effort during World War II was an important issue at the time, and in October 1943 a Writers' Congress was held to focus attention on it. The joint sponsors of the Congress were the Hollywood Writers' Mobilization, a group with similar aims, and the University of California, Los Angeles, which hosted the gathering. Among the 1,500 persons of varied background who were in attendance was E. T. "Buck" Harris, well known within shortwave circles of the day as the manager of American west coast shortwaver KGEI, which had opened in 1939 as 20 kw. W6XBE (it went to 50 kw. in 1941, by which time its call letters had changed). The papers of the Congress were published the next year, and included one by Harris, "Short-Wave Broadcasting in the Pacific Basin Area." In it he reviews the station's history and the changes that took place after Pearl Harbor, discusses west coast vs. east coast shortwave, quotes from listeners' letters, etc. We have posted the article under "DX History/Stations," and at the start of the file we have added a scan of Buck Harris's KGEI picture ID! -- Also this time, under "Specialized Resources/The DX Recordings of Colin Miller," we have posted two more recordings, from Zaire (the old Belgian Congo, now Democratic Republic of Congo). *Thanks, Colin.* (via DXPlorer)

Voice of African Brotherhood from Lubumbashi had a decent signal on 25 mb also here in Finland. I also remember the Angolan station Radio Diamang somewhere a bit out-of-band in the 25 mb. 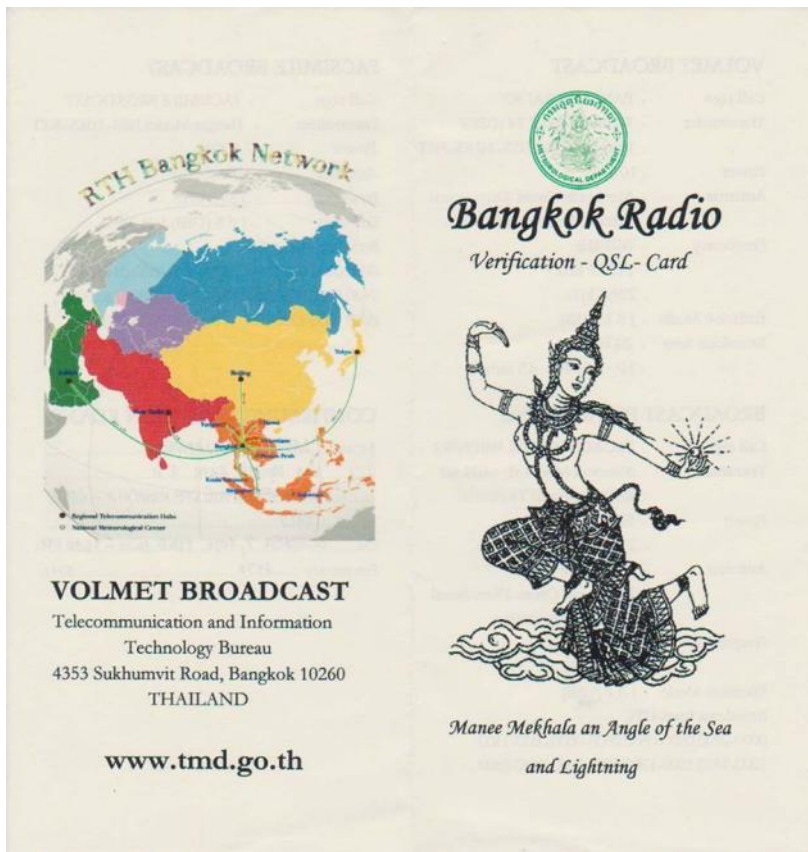
2017 PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND DXPEDITION

THE FIRST RADIO MUSEUM IN KAZAKHSTAN WAS REPLENISHED WITH EXHIBITS FROM EUROPE

One of the most visited exhibitions at the international forum "Kazakhstan's Path to Space: Realities and Prospects" held in Astana was an exhibition of radio receivers of the Republican Center for Space Communications (RCCC).

During the forum foreign partners RTSKS - representatives of the Italian division of the French company Tales Alenia Spase (TAS) - presented a gift.

Giuseppe Matarazzo, the manager for working with key clients of the Italian space agency and the Italian Defense Ministry, donating two rare exhibits of radio receivers, noted that "now the radio stations of the RCCS have replenished with European copies."

"We repeatedly visited Ascona as partners and saw this unique radio station. True, it had radios only Soviet and Russian production.

Therefore, Tales set out to find new exhibits. We managed to get a French lamp receiver in 1950 and a German radio in 1980, which we gladly handed to the President of the RCSK Mr. Lefter, "explained Larisa Injudzhyan, who has been working with TAS on developing projects in Europe and Kazakhstan for more than ten years.

"Our radio equipment, which is located in the ground control complex satellites in the city of Akkol, we first put up for public viewing. Forum participants were keenly interested in unique exhibits, as well as models of our KazSat-2 and KazSat-3 satellites," said Maral Darkhan, commercial director of JSC "RCSK".

The initiative to create a radio museum was born several years ago, when partners gave the first radio receivers to the space center of communication, then RCCS employees joined this action.

Today in the arsenal of the museum more than 150 exhibits, the oldest of them is the RN-1 radio receiver of 1938, there is another VHF receiver in 1927 that operates in the range of 80-100 MHz. 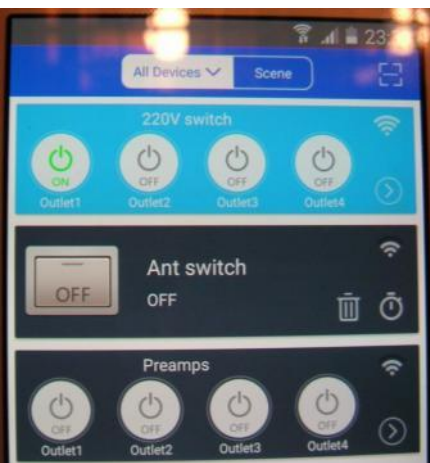
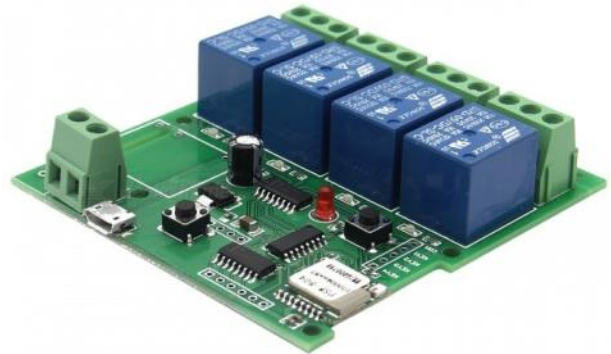


Bild på hur appen ser ut som styr switcharna!

KBRW now / Windturbine noise

Just checking how if I ever could hear KBRW (680) again in the evening (Nov 5), I found it audible right now. Hadn't expect that in Nov.

Now a new windpark with 6 x 2.2MW turbines has started 1km away, right at the side of my NA antenna lobe. nother 3x 2.2 MW is 3km away in the lobe center.

All generate a 4kHz comb maxed around 2MHz which even stretches into lower MW during daylight. I can hear the 4kHz comb from all turbines, even older ones, in all directions now. Until now the older park sitting at 90° antenna diection was not a real problem.

The tower is 80 / 100m high, that acts as a perfect halfwave radiator, thus the max around the 160m band and can be heard further away. Poor design !!

There's no more spot on our penisular without it.

Another wide noise bump is in the lower MW, along with weak hash on the remaining MW band, Weak NA signals in the late morning will be impossible.

So I am a bit glad that evening signals are strong enough to get over it, along with Alaska
