Stugan är tillbyggd, den pampiga altanen färdig, bokar och popplar borta, allt klyvt och både gamla och nybyggda vedbodnar är sprängfyllda. Och höstgrävt. Så vad annat finns att göra än att, efter sådär nio år, gräva fram trådar, apparater och stövlar? Så, jo, jag har dragit ut markbävrar och lyssnat.

Egentligen hade jag tänkt att ha mer permanenta antenner; när väl Eon plockat ner alla sin luftledningarna skulle det ske. Det blev klart i våras, men då kom popplar och annat emellan. Till hösten... hette det då. Fast nu har grannbonde Allan bestämt sig för att ta ner i stort sett alla träd på betesmarkerna, träd som skulle bli de perfekta fästpunkterna. AUSTRALIA. Craig Allen (owner and operator of Ozy Radio on 5045 kHz.) posted the following on WRTH Facebook page, regarding the news story of more SW stations wanted in PNG: "Maybe they can lease my 4835kHz shortwave licence off me I will put it at Boigu Island" [Queensland, Australia - Ron]
Boigu Island is less than 5 miles away from PNG. (Ron, San Francisco via DXLD)

BIAFRA [non]. 11530, Nov 18 at 1857, WRMI IS & ID loop, S9+10 to S8 (while 11580 WRMIBS is S9-S7). 1900 tune and YL opening Radio Biafra Broadcasting from London, shortly the 3-frequency schedule lacking 9580 which the OM sometimes mentions for this transmission. I check 9580 too and only a JJBA carrier; no more time to listen today. I'm surprised that apparently no one in Europe has checked for RBBFL on 9580, or whatever may really be occupying it at this hour.

Richard Langley, NB, says: ``Looking at the WRMI transmitter/antenna-field-layout, transmitter #7 and transmitter #10 can connect to the 87° Africa beam double rumboid [sic]. So, one of these combinations is likely being used. And I guess it's supplying a decent signal off the back lobe for stateside listeners to hear it. Although they claim they are broadcasting from London, the text message number they give is a Nigerian one: 234 810 617 7870.``

And Wolfgang Büschel, Nov 18: ``Re 11530 kHz RMI Okeechobee TX#4 relay, old fashioned horizontal rhombic antenna in use, 'small 87 degrees azimuth' angle though, JBA on threshold in western Europe, only S=2 or -108dBm in the poor. 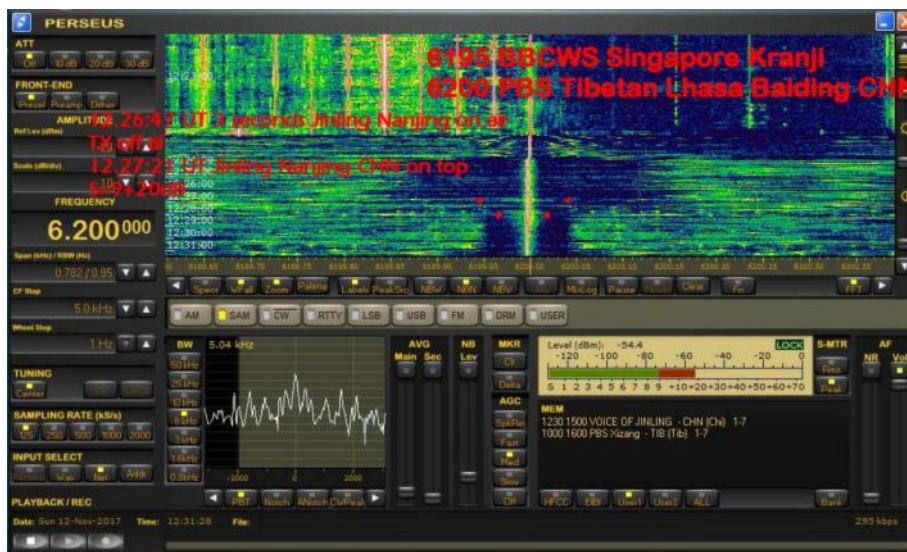

PAPUA. PNG Post-Courier, November 6, 2017

Minister for Communication, Information Technology and Energy Sam Basil wants all 22 provinces to have short wave frequency radio stations.

He said this during the Central Province assembly induction program last week Friday in Port Moresby.

"My role as the minister is to make sure that we go back to all the 22 provinces to make sure that we revive the radio stations," Mr Basil said.

He said most of the radio stations currently using frequency modulation (FM) face the problem of signal loss in the rural settings as it is only powered by repeater and could not be able to penetrate when it meets obstacles.

"This is to ensure that people are kept informed and in tuned with the government of the day," Mr Basil said.

He said to achieve this he will need the assistance of each local PMs of the 22 provinces.

"We will also require the support of the provincial government and administration for my department to roll out the program because I believe that the past decision made by previous government that transfers the provincial radio assets back to the provinces, the National Broadcasting Corporation and Department of Communication took the step back because there's no funding to make sure we maintain those asset.

"I want to go short wave and we want to bring back to all the provinces capital in Papua New Guinea through National Broadcasting Corporation so that people in the mountains can have excess to communication," Mr Basil said.

[SDR-Radio] Application for V3: Offset-DXing on Medium Wave "On the fly"

Hi - have duly to admit that only now I came across an application of V3 which can be used for medium wave DXing "on the fly".

As some of you may know, each assigned medium wave channel is populated by many station - nearly all of them with some unintentional offset of their carriers. While "File Analyzer" tool provides an excellent resolution of down to 0,023 Hz (hence separating even GPS-controlled networks plus adding some 50+ dB on sensitivity over listening bandwidth), now discovered how to do something similar "on the fly" during actual listening.

I wrote a six pager on that, with 12 screenshots. Also some notes of measuring signal strength and calculating SNR of speech and music had been added. See: www.dk8ok.org

La Red Minera de Radio y Televisión se postulará a la lista del patrimonio cultural e inmaterial de la Organización de las Naciones Unidas para la Educación la Ciencia y la Cultura (Unesco) para preservar su modelo de comunicación alternativa que pronto cumplirá 70 años.

“Estamos postulando para que las radios mineras, al ser autogestionarias y no partidarias (...), sean patrimonio de la humanidad”, precisó el director de esta red, Alberto Ponce, quien además destacó el carácter único de estos medios de comunicación y su lugar en la historia del sindicalismo del país.

“Son únicas en Latinoamérica y en el mundo, pues pertenecían a los sindicatos de trabajadores mineros, y fueron creadas para defender los intereses y la lucha del movimiento obrero”, remarcó.



Ponce explicó que para lograr la postulación se prepara la documentación que se entregará a la Unesco, aunque aclaró que existen pocos archivos, pues muchos fueron destruidos por el Ejército durante las intervenciones militares que sufrieron los centros mineros en las dictaduras.

Hace 70 años, antes de la Revolución Nacional del 9 de abril de 1952, en 1947 se fundó la primera radioemisora La Voz del Minero, de Siglo XX (Potosí), cuando el estaño era el principal producto de exportación de Bolivia y la minería en general se constituía en la base de la economía tradicional. Posteriormente, otros distritos mineros continuaron con la iniciativa y se constituyeron la Radio 21 de Diciembre de Catavi, la Radio Nacional de Huanuni, Vanguardia de Colquiri. En la década de los años 70 se contaba con 26 emisoras de este tipo. En la actualidad muchas de ellas desaparecieron.

Para la instalación de sus emisoras, los mineros compraron equipos, capacitaron a la gente de los campamentos y cada miembro de los sindicatos contribuía con una parte de sus salarios, pese a que eran muy bajos, para el funcionamiento de estos medios.

El 28 de agosto, el Ministerio de Minería entregó una condecoración a los directores de las radios mineras que aún están vigentes. El premio reconoció además el “alto nivel de conciencia de los trabajadores para transmitir sus ideales frente a la postura editorial de los medios comerciales que no tomaban en cuenta estas luchas”.

El comunicólogo y periodista Luis Ramiro Beltrán (1930-2015), en su trabajo Comunicación para el desarrollo en Latinoamérica (1993), indicó que los mineros bolivianos, sin saberlo, al crear las radios mineras y trabajar de manera autofinanciada y no partidaria, sin publicidad comercial y practicar una “verdadera democracia en la comunicación” se convirtieron en los precursores de la “comunicación alternativa para el desarrollo”, una década antes de que se comiencen a plantear las bases teóricas de este modelo.

Delfín Arias, exradialista minero, afirmó que las radios sufrieron el acoso militar y fueron las primeras en ser acalladas con la destrucción de sus equipos y la persecución de sus dirigentes. “Se buscaba el silenciamiento de los medios”.

Por efecto de la relocalización, que se activó en agosto de 1986, las radios se debilitaron y muchas llegaron a desaparecer. La decisión del gobierno de Víctor Paz Estenssoro (1985-1989) de echar a miles de trabajadores provocó una masiva migración a las ciudades. (La Razón)

Interesting news item from a CounterTerrorism Digest:

A Swedish radio station played an Isis propaganda tune after its frequency was hijacked by a pirate transmitter. Malmö residents who tuned into popular radio station Mix Megapol at around 8.30am on Friday suddenly found themselves listening to Isis recruitment song 'For the sake of Allah'. The song was played after the radio station's local airwaves were hijacked by an unknown offender, Bauer Media, which owns the station, confirmed after 24Malmö.se first reported the incident. "We will report this incident to the police and to the Swedish Post and Telecom Authority," marketing director Jakob Gravestam said in a press release. He confirmed to 24Malmö.se that the three-minute song – with lyrics trying to tempt Westerners into joining Isis with promises about maidens waiting in paradise for fighters – was played for around 30 minutes. "It is of course very serious, especially as they played a song about recruitment for Isis," Gravestam added, admitting that it was very difficult to stop anyone with a pirate transmitter from hijacking a radio frequency. Mix Megapol is a commercial station which normally plays hits from the 80s, 90s, and early 2000s.

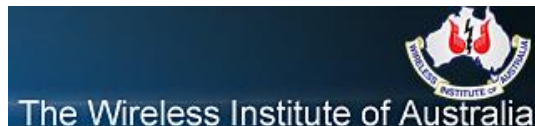
Reports can be easily and quickly made by anyone using the Online Intruder Report Form at <http://www.wia.org.au/members/protecting/intruderreport/>
