Kan det jag skisserar vara så ogenomförbart?

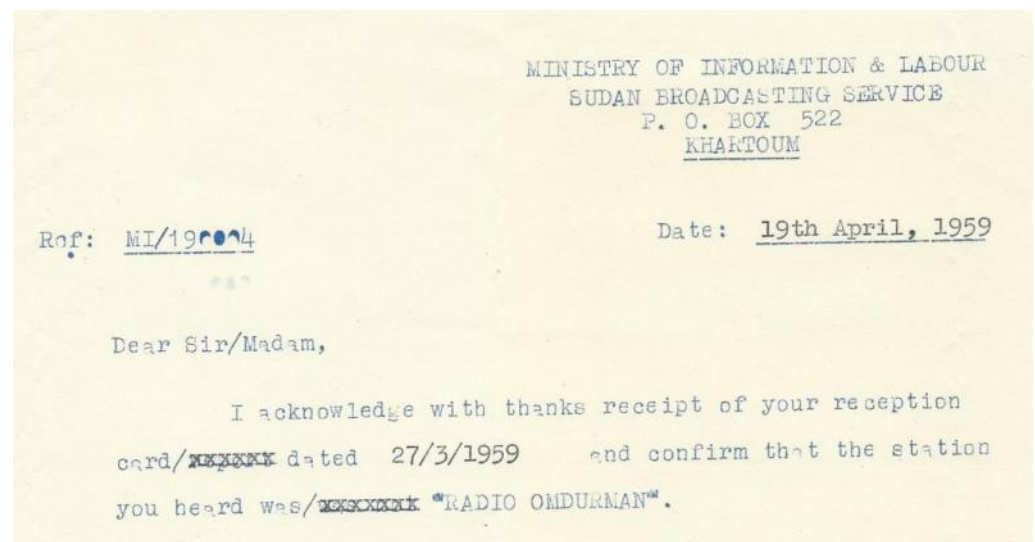

Caversham Park shaped the news agenda in the mid-20th Century.

## Svensk DX-historia

**Med tanke på forumets namn** kanske någon är intresserad av vad jag hitintills hittat i Riksarkivet av det material Arne Skoog inlämnade 1993:

"DX-ing" innebär, enkelt uttryckt, att lyssna på radioutsändningar runt om i världen med hjälp av en radiomottagare för framförallt kortvågs- och mellanvågssändningar. Det en "Dx-are" i första hand sysslar med är att samla på sk QSL-er, bekräftelser från radiostationer att man lyssnat på deras utsändningar. "Dx-aren" skickar ett meddelande till radiostationen att man lyssnat på dem vid angiven tidpunkt och hur mottagningen har varit etc. och får därefter, förhoppningsvis, en bekräftelse (QSL) på att man lyssnat på stationen i retur.

Det anordnas också tävlingar i "dx-ing", på klubbnivå men också Svenska mästerskap. Det går till på så vis att arrangören tar kontakt med radiostationer runt om i världen och ber dem att sända tävlingsbidrag på en bestämd tid på känd frekvens och våglängd. Tävlingsdeltagarna har sen att försöka få in sändningarna och lyssna på dem. Den som fått in flest stationer och hört flest programpunkter har vunnit.

"Dx-ing" har väl framförallt lockat teknik och språkitresserade och blev en populär hobby efter kriget och fram till en bit in på 1980-talet då bla datorerna på allvar slog igenom och hobbyn "radiolyssning" snabbt avtog. Men det finns fortfarande aktiva klubbar och ett riksförbund, "Sveriges DX-förbund" (SDXF).

Arne Skoog har betytt mycket för "dx-ing" i Sverige och utomlands. Han har varit en flitig debattör och inspiratör sen 1940-talet och deltagit aktivt och påverkat det mesta som skett inom "dx-ing". Han var med om att bilda den första riksorganisationen "DX-alliansen" i mitten på 1950-talet, den kom så småningom att byta namn först till "Riksförbundet DX-alliansen" sen till dagens namn "Sveriges DX-förbund" (SDXF). Han verkade också länge som kontrollör vid SM-tävlingarna och skapade sig ett stort kontaktnät i Sverige och utomlands. Han var också engagerad i EDXC (European DX-Council) som bildades på 1960-talet.

Arkivet (dnr. 54-2563-93) som deponerades hos Riksarkivet (1993-07-28) av Arne Skoog föreligger i den kronologiska ordning som var vid mottagandet och har inte sorterats. Det innehåller material från mitten av 1940-talet till slutet av 1980-talet såsom bland annat: Korrespondens gällande tävlingar, alliansens verksamhet och framtid, medlemstidningar som Alliansnytt (AN) och Stredak, mötesprotokoll, verksamhetsberättelser, resultaträkningar, utskick av olika slag bla gällande de olika tävlingarna, material gällande piratradiostationen Radio Nord.

Arkivet är fritt tillgängligt för forskning.

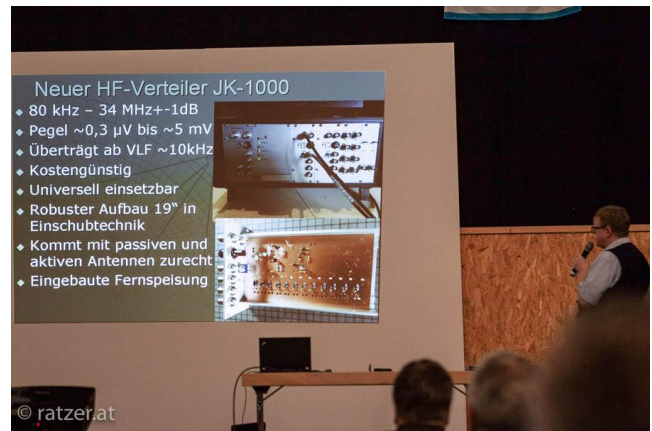
