Romina Zabalza is one of the three producers who, together with a technical operator, make up the team that in 2022 will be in charge of LRA 36 Radio Nacional Arcángel San Gabriel, which operates in Antarctica Argentina and broadcasts from Base Esperanza, on 15476 kHz 19-meter shortwave band and 97.6 MHz FM.

Romina told us that she is a dentist, a native of Tucumán, that she belongs to the Navy and that she will travel next February with her family to the Esperanza Base to join the 2022 work teams.



Together with the producers María Rodríguez, Claudia Albarracín and the technical operator Mariela Churquina, she is undergoing the corresponding training to take on the task during the summer and for the whole of next year.

He expressed that it is "an enormous pride" to assume "with a lot of responsibility" the work in charge of Radio Nacional's radio station and told details of the official presentation of the new staff held yesterday.

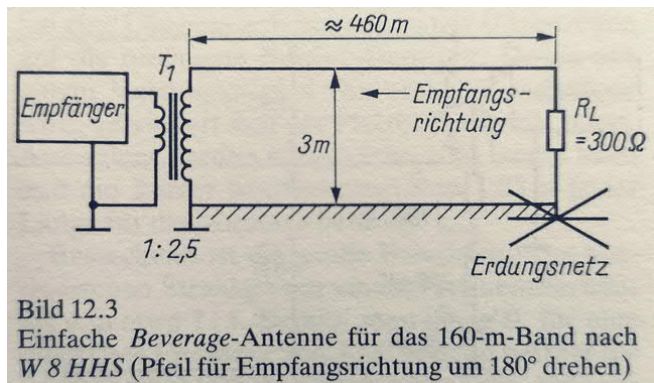
[A-DX] Die "Beverage" wird 100

Die Novemberausgabe der QST (Monatsmagazin des US-amerikanischen Amateurfunkverbandes ARRL) feiert mit einem Artikel "Die Beverage-Antenne, 100 Jahre später" von Ward Silver, N0AX, und Frank Donovan, W3LPL, das hundertjährige Jubiläum der berühmten Empfangsantenne. Sie wurde 1921 von Harold Beverage, W2BML, entworfen und patentiert (US Pat. 1381089 - 1920).

Die "Beverage" ist nach wie vor für die niedrigen Bänder beliebt, da die zunehmende Sonnenfleckenaktivität im Sonnenzyklus 25 dort zu schwächeren Signalen führt. Der Artikel erklärt die störunterdrückenden Eigenschaften der Beverage-Antenne und zeigt, wie man ein einfaches Beverage-Antennensystem baut [siehe auch 1].

Belrose et al führten mit einer 100 Meter langen Beverage-Antenne in einer Höhe über dem Erdboden von 1 Meter einige Experimente bei einer Frequenz von 2 MHz durch und veröffentlichten diese in der Januarausgabe der QST in 1983 [2]:

1. Die Wirksamkeit erhöht sich mit Abnahme (!) der Bodenleitfähigkeit - um 5,7 dB im Vergleich von guter zur schlechter Erdbodenleitfähigkeit.
2. Der Gewinn steigt nur geringfügig mit dem Abstand des Antennendrahts zum Boden an (0,3 m zu 3,0 m = 2 dB; 1 m zu 3 m = 1,3 dB).
3. Der Gewinn nimmt mit der Länge zu (Länge 100 m => 200 m = 3,5 dB; 100 m => 400 m = 5 dB / -7 dBi).
4. Der Öffnungswinkel (-3 dB) betrug bei 100 Meter Länge, 1 Meter Höhe bei 2 MHz in der Horizontalen 77° und in der Vertikalen 60° bei einem Erhebungswinkel von 42°.



Neben der Richtwirkung macht vor allem der große Störabstand zwischen DX-Signal und Störpegel diese Antenne bei DXern so beliebt. Einziger Nachteil: Diese Antennenform braucht viel Platz 😊👤

Museum of TV and Radio Broadcasting in Kazan.

On October 15, Minister of Digital Development of Public Administration, Information Technologies and Communications of the Republic of Tatarstan Airat Khairullin and Deputy Director General of RTRS Boris Terebilenko opened a TV and Radio Broadcasting Museum in Kazan. The exposition is located in the building of the RTRS branch "RTPC of the Republic of Tatarstan" in Troitsky Forest.

The opening ceremony of the museum was attended by Vladimir Yakimov, director of the RTRS Radio Telecentre in the Republic of Tatarstan, Firdus Gimaldinov, director of Tatarstan State Television and Radio Broadcasting Company, heads of other RTRS branches, regional media companies and specialized educational institutions.

The history of the development of national television is reflected in 11 thematic zones of the exposition. The stands show examples of radio equipment that RTRS previously operated in 13 regions. The exposition pays special attention to TV and radio broadcasting in Tatarstan. In the media zone, visitors can try themselves as a TV news announcer or weather forecast and take memorable photos.

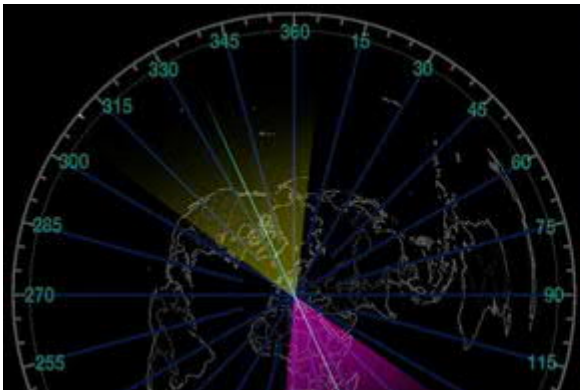

Ken Boord. Ken Boord was probably the most prolific American DX editor from the mid-1940s until around 1961. He had extensive contacts within the shortwave world, both in the U.S. and internationally, and these yielded voluminous DX information. After his 1944-1955 stint with *Radio News* he stayed in touch with his sources, ran his own "Flash Sheet" newsletter (see "Specialized Resources/DX Newsletters"), and shared his news with other DX editors on an ongoing basis. An example of the latter is an airletter he sent out in July 1956 containing extensive DX news. It is typical of the Ken Boord style. You can find it in "DX History-III/People," right below the "World at a Twirl" entry. Look for the red "New." -- And we have posted six new Colombian recordings from Tetsuya Hirahara. *Thanks, Tetsuya.* (Jerry Berg via DXPlorer)

DX nostalgia by RFK

This time we are focusing on QSLs from the vast collection of the late Olle Alm OA. I am sure that most of you know his name, not least because of his collaboration with WRTH. Olle sadly passed away in December 2019 after long periods of illness. As he started DX-ing in 1955 and kept up his hobby over the years, Olle naturally built up a massive QSL collection. Here are some examples.

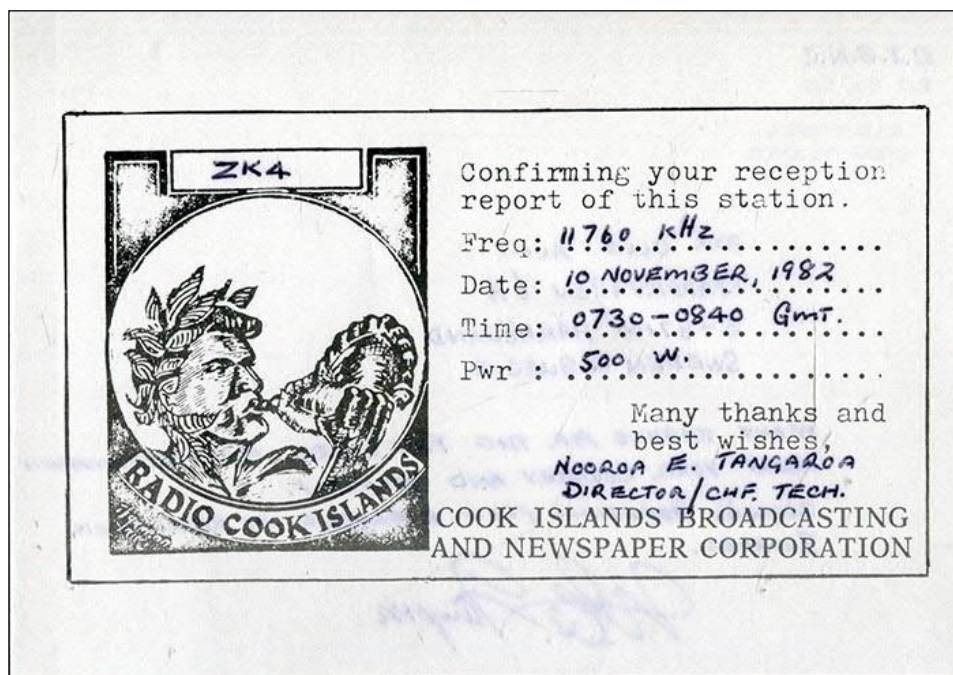
The first QSL is from OAX1A Radio Delcar in Chiclayo, Peru which OA reported in 1962. The station was listed with 0,3 kW on out-of-band frequency 6700 kHz and this picture postcard shows Avenida Balta. The station had its studios and offices on the second floor and with good eyes (or a magnifying glass) you can see a sign with the station's name far left on the building, above Banco Popular. The SW transmitter was on the air from 1900 to 0030 Peruvian time.



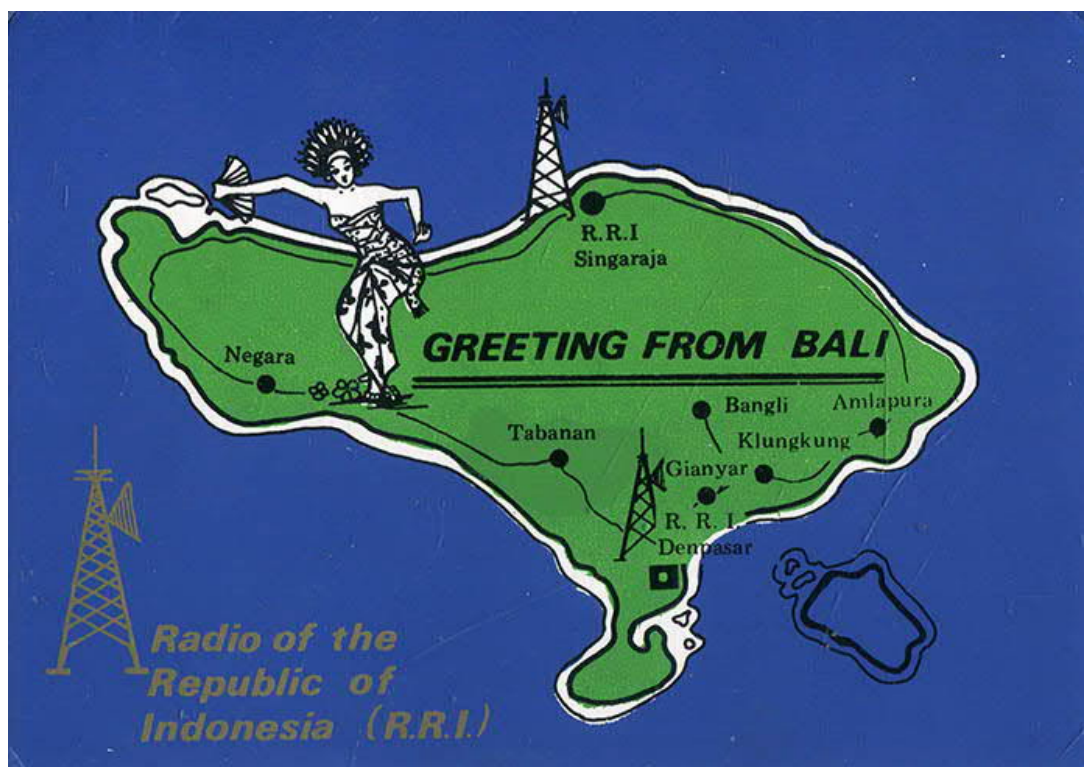
Next we have HIFA Emisora Cultural de las Fuerzas Armadas, also known as La Voz de las Fuerzas Armadas, from Santo Domingo, the Dominican Republic, heard in 1971. It used to be a regular catch on 4825 kHz where it used a 3 kW transmitter.



Olle, one of Sweden's top DX-ers, was very active on both MW and SW and here is a QSL card from a station which was very hard to hear: Radio Cook Islands. It came on the air in 1954, initially broadcasting just two hours a week. In 1974 George Jacobs of the VOA arranged for the VOA relay stations on 11760 kHz to go silent at a specific time, enabling American listeners to hear Radio Cook Islands. But Radio Habana Cuba stayed on the channel so nothing was heard.... Sadly the SW station was destroyed by fire in 1992 and the station never returned to shortwave.



Some stations of Radio Republik Indonesia RRI verified with own QSL cards and here is a card used by the Bali stations. On the backside v/s Moch. Hassan verifies OA:s reception of RRI Denpasar.



Olle took a special interest in Russian local stations and the fact that he spoke Russian made reporting easier. Here is a letter from the Khabarovsk station on 7210 kHz. The map with the indication of the transmitter location was made by Olle himself.
