Glenn - One of the disadvantages of my listening to SW by the edge of Monterey Bay, is the strong presence of CODAR activity – [https://coastwatch.pfeg.noaa.gov/in-fog/CM\\_u25h\\_las.html](https://coastwatch.pfeg.noaa.gov/in-fog/CM_u25h_las.html) - "Surface currents within the Monterey Bay are measured using seven CODAR type high-frequency radar stations distributed around the perimeter of the bay." Regarding 11835 reception, most of the time CODAR is absent, but occasionally is moderately strong. Believe all the audio files I have posted here for R. Vanuatu on 11835 have been CODAR-free, but attached brief audio is of a recent CODAR reception, mixing with Radio Vanuatu. (Ron Howard, California)

First, hope all is well with yourself and your family.....

As well, thank you for posting the article about Kusalik's Kaper #2...I have received quite few comments about this, and many cannot believe it has been that long!

Now, my observations.. the article called "Memories from the past..PAPUA NEW GUINEA was well done and accurate on the information that was submitted. The author did his homework of the stations from this region.

I must point out that I have ALL Papua New Guinea Stations verified...ever one of them... Papua New Guinea, New Ireland, North Solomons (Bougainville) Admiralty Islands, New Britain plus the following stations: Radio Free Bougainville and the other Radio United Bougainville, both on 3880 kHz.

A Total of 25 stations.... heard in Chatham Ontario (to 1980) and later in Coaldale, Alberta (from 1980)

Radio Free Bougainville 3880 kHz was the station that was airing independence from the Government in Boroko. See the attached Verification from Interim Government, plus the three Prepared Cards signed and stamped, 3880 kHz.

Plus, the reply from Sam Voron who was go between for this organization/station Radio Free Bougainville. In his reply (on the reverse of the QSL Card) is the fact my report was heard via DX Party Line via HCJB!

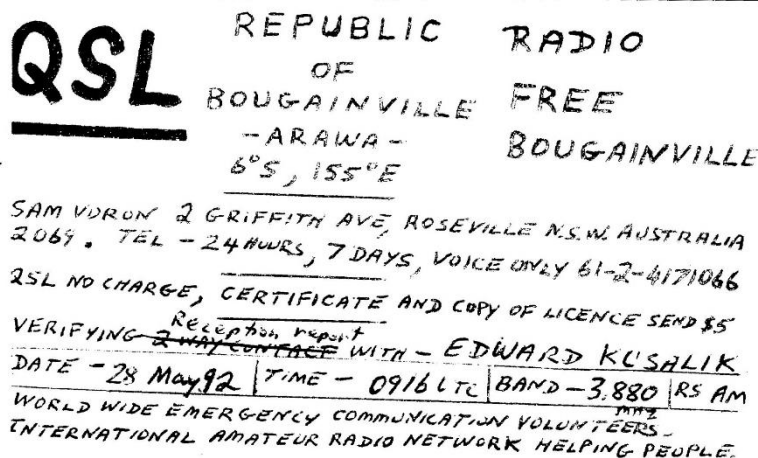
What is interesting is the power of Radio United Bougainville was only 70 watts! While the station, Radio Free Bougainville was reported as 600 watts, but Sam says that this is inaccurate.

Radio Free Bougainville, however, has not been the only voice of that conflict heard throughout the region.

At one time Radio United Bougainville. an "unregistered" station, could be heard on 3880) kHz, and was purported to be under the control of (or an organ of) the PNG Defense Forces, a claim the Defense Forces denies. 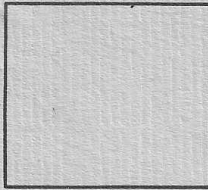
BRA (BRA = Bougainville Revolutionary Army). Reports, however, describe Bougainvilleans who had been forcibly removed from their villages and interned in the care centers — which the BRA refers to as "occupied areas."

From Loloho in the southeast, near Arawa town, where the ore ships for the Panguna open pit copper mine used to harbor, Radio United Bougainville went on air in January 1994. The nature of its broadcasts, called a "hearts-and- minds campaign." was clearly designed as a counter to the broadcasts of Radio Free Bougainville.

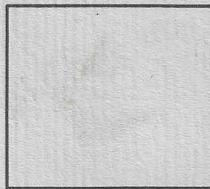

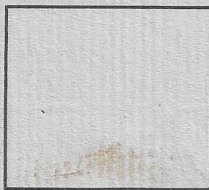

Thank you for your letter dated 23rd of November, 1994 as per your reception report above.

In verifying your report, I wish to sincerely apologise for the long delay in responding to your request which I believe has kept you waiting under great suspense. Admittedly, it is not of ignorance but it is due to unreliable and poor mailing system we are currently faced with under the so-called political crisis on our island of Bougainville.

The crisis has caused a lot of inconvenience to our daily lives including basic essential services such as communication as confirmed with my reply to your letter.

I hope you bear with me, the difficulties and hardships we are faced with. Had the situation being normal, it should not have taken me this long to respond to your letter requesting verification of your reception reports.

Lets hope things will fall back inline if total peace and normalcy returns to the island in future.

As the Programme Controller of Radio United Bougainville I wish to take this opportunity in verifying your report.

Your reception report dated the 2nd of June, 1994 of having heard Radio United Bougainville on frequency 3880KHZ from 1136 - 1204 (1/2) hours UTC is accurate and satisfactory according to my Station's DX - DRM1 Log/Record Book.

The Station you have logged and heard was indeed Radio United Bougainville, "The Voice of Unity for Bougainville and, the Male Announcer you heard was myself on presentation."

For your future reference, Radio United Bougainville was established and launched on February 18th, 1994. It is situated and located in Loloho, East Coast of Central Bougainville, Papua New Guinea. The Station is owned and funded by the Bougainville Transitional Government with Security provided by the Security Forces of Papua New Guinea in case of attacks by the Secessionist rebels on the island.

The primary role of the station is to conduct and carry out extensive Public Awareness Campaign as to comprehensively counter-act on the rebel's unfounded propagandas that has psychologically affected the minds of the innocent civilian population. As a result of their propagandas, a lot of the civilians have fled into the bushes in fear of the Security Forces, therefore it is our duty and role to counter-act on these propagandas in order to bring them back into civilisation.

The Station has overwhelmingly achieved positive results in its campaigns with influx of innocent civilians into government controlled care centres seeking humanitarian assistance after nearly six (6) years of human suffering and hardships while held captives by the rebels.

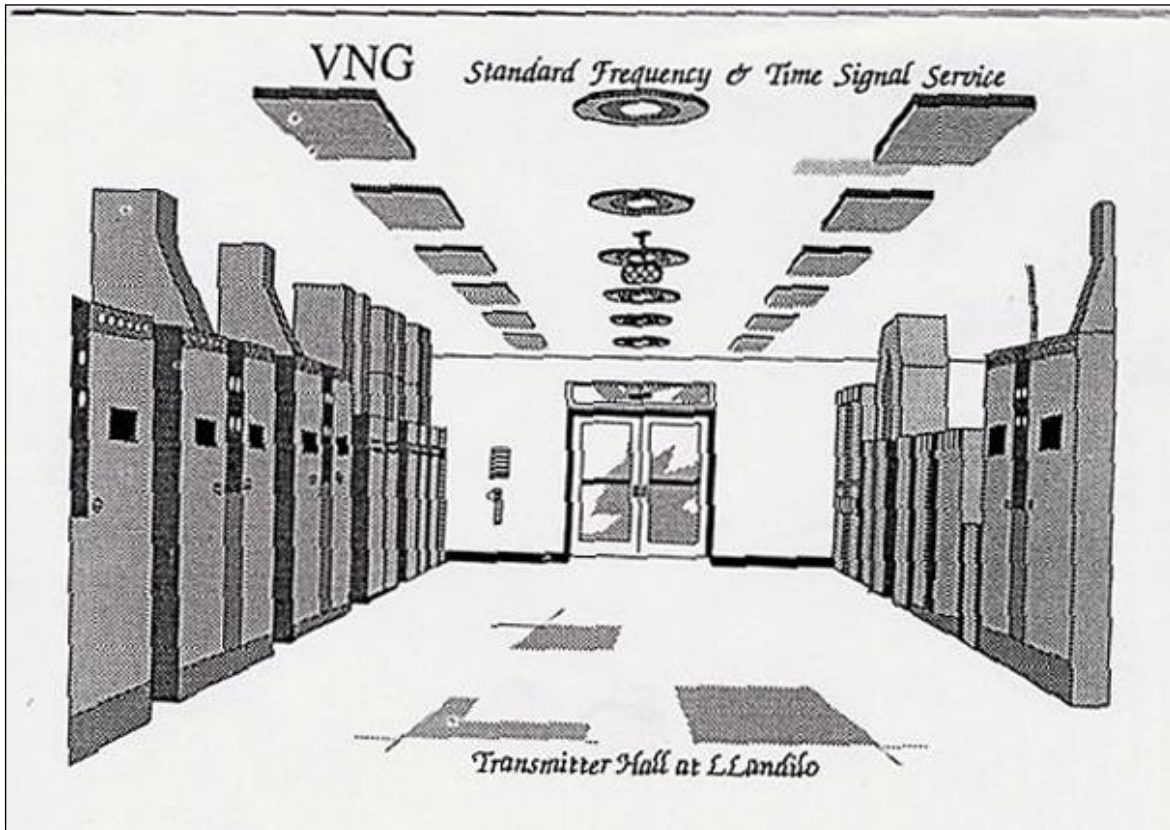
For your information, I am a Journalist and Broadcaster by Profession.

This QSL was received by SA for his 1960 report of The Sierra Leone Broadcasting Service. SLBS came on the air in 1934, becoming the first English speaking broadcasting service in West Africa. In 1974 a 250 kW Brown Boveri SK53 transmitter was installed at Waterloo with some support from Germany. For economical reasons soon only 50% of the output power was used and the station was leased to foreign broadcasters like Deutsche Welle. At times it was also used by a radio organization in Kuwait, broadcasting Radio Al Koran.


