Manuel Méndez: Estación 4940, received email from the station with a photo of the transmitter:



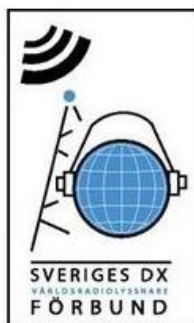
"Señor Manuel

BRAZIL. 3365.10, Oct 13 at 2312, JBA also into Argentine SDR, could be **R. Cultura Araraquara**, following this tip via Paul Flanagan, BDXC which I passed on to the WOR iog:

``From DX FANZINE: "Very interesting breaking news from Brazil. From 21 to 02 UTC this evening Radio Cultura Araraquara will make a transmission attempt on 3365 kHz with the apology {sic} of the eclipse experimentation. Looks like the actually intention is to check if the transmitter, which has been turned off for a while, is still working. It's worth checking if it's true and if it happens."``

3365.077, much better S7/9+5 when I can get onto Brasília SDR, 2316 song; 2319 sounds like jingle ID but uncopied, another song. 2326 frenetic announcement maybe included ID. 2328 more of that, 2329 ``Cultura FM``, ads with lots of phone numbers, finally mentions ``em Araraquara`` - hardly ``cultural``, IMHO. Some more explicit IDs to 2339 (Glenn Hauser, OK, WOR)

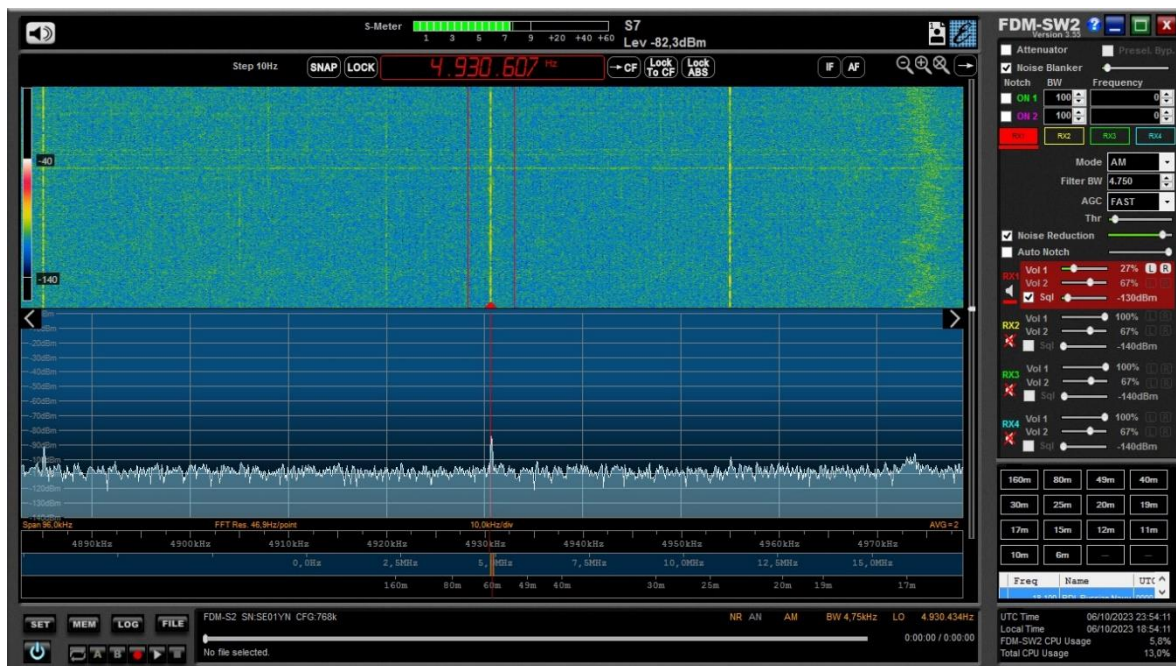

Microsoft has stopped renewing licenses for companies from Russia.

After September 30, Microsoft stopped renewing licenses for companies from Russia. Now clients of the technology corporation in the country will no longer be able to renew subscriptions to its services

According to Microsoft representatives, they took this step because they comply with the Western sanctions regime against the Russian Federation. The company also recalled that sales of all its products and services in Russia have been suspended.

Russian Minister of Digital Development Maksut Shadayev said that the country has an alternative to software products from Microsoft. Shadayev added that there was a year and a half to prepare, "everyone understood that this was coming."

TASS journalists sent a letter to Microsoft's Russian office asking them to clarify whether the company was going to reconsider this decision. Representatives of the publication have not yet received a response.

In addition, a survey of readers showed that an electronic newsletter of this format is not really needed - in the modern world, people quickly learn all the "hot" DX news from electronic forums."

[WOR] BDXC-UK Communication items, Oct, Reading Meeting Report

Our last meeting in Reading was held in March 2020, so it was really pleasing to resume them again on Saturday 23rd September! Good to see these members again at our old venue, Reading International Solidarity Centre: Dave Gallop, Chris Gibbs, Chris Greenway, Ian Kelly, Dave Kenny, Chris Morgan, Alan Pennington, Alan Roe, Jon Ryland, David Shaw and Klaus Werner.

At the meeting, Chris Greenway gave us an enlightening talk about Radio Atlantico del Sur (RAdS), the British Ministry of Defence's 'grey propaganda'

station on the air during the final four weeks of the Falklands War in 1982, targeting the Argentinian troops on the Falkland Islands.

RAdS made 47 broadcasts between 19th May and 15th June 1982, using a 250 kW Marconi BD272 transmitter on Ascension Island (Sender 302) requisitioned from the BBC. Broadcasts were on either 9710 kHz (evenings) or 9700 kHz (mornings), frequencies close to 9690 kHz which was used by Argentinian radio. Live programmes in Spanish from a BFBS studio in King's Building, Westminster were relayed to Ascension, initially on a shortwave ssb feeder from the BT's Rugby Radio Station, then by 'phone line. RAdS's manager was Neil French-Blake (founder of Reading's Radio 210); station engineer was Jim

Warrack (Chief Engineer at Hereward Radio).

Chris's talk highlighted the myths and reality of RAdS: much more of the truth about the station has emerged in the past ten years, from now declassified documents in the National Archives in Kew, Neil French Blake's memoirs and his interview with Stewart Purvis for his Forces TV film plus files retrieved from French-Blake's Swiss flat. We heard some recordings, including the station's theme tunes: Herb Alpert's "Treasure of San Miguel" and "Argentina", an instrumental by Dutch group Conquistador, recorded for the Dutch football team at the 1978 World Cup finals!

Chris also bought along his Radio Atlantico del Sur QSL - his first report to the station's announced address "Box 408, London" had been returned with note scribbled on the envelope "Try Bush House". But a second report direct to the MOD would result in the desired QSL card.

Strangely enough, all of a sudden I can't write a capital "T" on the keyboard so I'll have to copy and paste that letter. Every other symbol seems to work. Strange... Anyway, here is another QSL from OA, La Voz de la Victor – La Radio Internacional de Costa Rica", heard in 1961.
