Har då bl a hittat SWB-Bulletinen och den gör säkert livet lättare. Har återkommit efter en fantastisk resa Turkiet runt efter att ha vunnit resan i "Voice of Turkey:s" uppsatstävling. Återkommer säkert med några nyheter då och då. Senaste QSL är **Radio Damascus** som ju är svår att få svar ifrån. Fick två likadana kort, dekal och en tidning "Syria News" Det tog 5 månader. - En liten prelud från Ullmar Qwick, oldtimer. (*Ullmar! Hoppas få se dig som medlem!* /red)

**Christer Brunström:** **RdP Internacional 1555** kHz handskrivet brev, kort, dekal, penna, schema, broschyr om Portugal, två CD-skivor. V/s Christiane tyckte det var roligt att få brev på portugisiska.

**13/10:** Fick just ett meddelande från Adán Mur på Radio América. Aktuella frekvenser är nu 2300, 7737 och 9983 kHz. Själv har jag ännu inte hört ett dugg.

**14/10:** Nytt QSL: **Rádio Canção Nova 9675** med QSL-kort för rapport på programmet "Além Fronteiras".

**18/10:** **Radio Verdad 4052.5** med sedvanlig uppsättning från Dr Edgar Amílcar Madrid, Director y Gerente. Han berättar att efter ett åsknedslag sänder man med enbart 280 watts och att det är mycket svårt att hitta reservdelar. Av en uppställning framgår att flest rapporter har kommit från Sverige (40 st). På andra plats kom USA med 34 rapporter. Märkt nog kommer Finland först på tredje plats med 16 rapporter.

**Kenneth Olofsson:** Äntligen några rader från Mörrum, egentligen är konditionerna jättedåliga men ibland kommer det fram något ändå. Först ett QSL, det är **La Voz de tu Conciencia 6010,2** som svarat med ett kortfattat e-mail.

**Lars Skoglund:** meddelar per vykort QSL från **R Bethel, Arequipa, 5940**, 2-sidigt brev och två vykort.

**Börge Eriksson.** Hoppsan var det så enkelt att få QSL igen! Efter förra numret av SWB kopplade jag åter in min rx och gjorde ett svep och fick i hastigheten en rapport på Holy Tibet 6130 som redan har svarat och som bonus kom en indier. Kul. Nu gäller det att, efter tio månaders inaktivitet, uppdatera sig igen för att bilda mig en uppfattning om vad som hörs och inte hörs. Kunde snabbt konstatera en mängd konstiga lokala störningar som jag inte kände igen. Kopplade ur alla tänkbara källor i huset och kunde bl.a. konstatera att en nyinköpt video orsakade brum i stand/by läge. Men många störningar fanns ändå kvar och troligen kommer de från grannar. Husen ligger tätt i villaområdet och med denna tidiga vinter har troligen en del externa värmekällor slagits på. I övrigt var det inte så mycket att glädja sig åt. Kineser och indier var starka i 60 mb. på natten, medan LA nästan helt saknades. Bara de allra vanligaste kunde noteras. Få se om detta är tillräckligt för att locka mig tillbaka på banden. Det beror helt på vad eventuella rapporter ger i utdelning. Vidare kunde jag notera att bandspelaren lämnat in i form av en söndertorkad drivrem. Det är ett urgammalt kasettdäck så det får väl bli en nyinvestering eller ett besök hos polare Lennart som är en riktig skrothandlare med garage och förråd fulla av apparater. Inga tips denna gång men så var det QSL-en. **PBS Radio Holy Tibet 6130** svarade alltså på 10 dagar med QSL-lapp, brev på EE, vykort och programschema. Samma v/s som till de andra som fått dem. Jag bifogade en f/up på en rapport från år 2000, men den omnämndes inte i svaret. Vidare har **AIR/Jeypore 5040** svarat med brev på EE direkt från stationen efter 1 års väntan. V/s var A.Chanti Babu. assitant station engineer som uppger att man har e-mailadressen: [airjevp@sancharnet.in](mailto:airjevp@sancharnet.in). Jag får tydligen övergå från LA till asiater.

**AFGHANISTAN [non]**, Hello Mr. Hauser- Received in the mail today, Oct 18, a QSL of sorts from the 193rd Special Operations Wing (Penn. Air National Guard) with the following text: "This card acknowledges the receipt of a broadcast delivered by Commando Solo II during Operation Enduring Freedom. Thank you for your support of the 193rd Special Operations Wing" Also a personal note of thanks and apologies for the delay in responding on the back of the card. This was from a cassette recording of the 8700 kHz broadcasts I sent them in December 2001. 73s (Ben Loveless, WB9FJO, Michigan, Oct 18, DX LISTENING DIGEST)

**BRASILIEN: Radio Educação Rural, Tefé**, AM Beräknar att vara igång på 4925 kHz ex 3385 kHz inom de närmaste dagarna säger stationens direktör, Thomas Schwamborn, till Paulo Roberto e Souza, dx-are som bor i Tefé. Detta enligt Célio Romais i Radio News No. 22 021014. (Thord Knutsson)

**ECUADOR. HCJB:s engelska till Europa** från 27 oktober: 0700-0900 5965 och 2000- 2200 11895. DX Partyline lördagar 0700 och 2000. (DXPL via CB)

**GERMANY. 6085 Closedown Confirmed:** The current ROI Intermedia programme contains an interview with the technical director of Bayerischer Rundfunk. He confirmed that 6085 will be switched off by the end of this year due to high operational costs (hardly a surprise; that's a Telefunken S4005 500 kW transmitter, although running on reduced power) and continued with declarations that this is a temporary shut-down only. Of course!

By the way, first Bayerischer Rundfunk complained about the regarding item in the teletext service of Ostdeutscher Rundfunk Brandenburg, claiming that there would be no decision to close 6085. Some kind of internal communication, not to discuss the circumstance that the times when only official statements could be used for publications are over for almost 13 years now (Kai Ludwig, Germany, Oct 5, DX LISTENING DIGEST)

**HONG KONG 3940 SSB, RTHK**, wx rpts for the 2002 Hainan Race will be b/c at [dates and times converted from HK UTC+8 by JB] 0933 and 2133 UTC Oct 16-18, and 2133 UTC Oct 19-23. I could receive the special weather forecasts of Radio Television Hongkong for boats in the Hainan race. These forecasts will be broadcasted until October 23rd at around 21.33 UTC on 3940 USB. Reception from the Far East is possible in Europe at this time. Here now the logging: **CHINA 3940 USB Radio TV Hongkong**, October 16th, 2135-2143, English, weather forecast (showers, wind south east, visibility 4000m); no clear ID, however the coast of China was mentioned. **3940 R TV Hong Kong (USB)**, Oct 17, \*2133-2143\*, Flute interval signal at 2129 and 2133, Deep male voice giving ID in English and then reading weather reports for the Hainan Yacht Race including wind, visibility and sea state at various locations. Hong Kong was heard mentioned twice. Disappeared when the last report was read. Weak signal in much atmospheric noise. SINPO 25131 (Anker Petersen via HCDX)

**GREENLAND.** Glenn, I heard your call for DX'ers to try to catch the short wave transmissions from KNR - now that conditions should allow the transmissions to propagate a bit further. So I rang my source and he was in touch with the people running the short wave transmitter earlier today. Now it turns out that the frequency is **3815 kHz (USB)** - and not 3812 kHz as previously reported. The transmissions are no longer unofficial since KNR has started paying for the transmissions!! Broadcasting hours are 1200-1300 and 1800-1900 local time - which is 1400-1500 and 2000-2100 UT (when local DST is observed). One hour later UT [1500-1600, 2100-2200] when Greenland return to normal time from October 27th. I believe the transmissions consist of news in Greenlandic, followed by some PSAs of some sort and then finally news in Danish. The transmitter is located in Tasiilaq on the East Coast of Greenland and is running around 100-200 W. There's a general election coming up on December 3rd in Greenland, but there are no plans to let the short wave transmitter run for any longer on that date - but of course plans may be changed before the actual date (Stig Hartvig Nielsen, Denmark, Oct 17, DX LISTENING DIGEST)

**MEXICO 2390 R. Huayacocotla** 0030 - 0100 Band music, not quite mariachi, announced by W in Spanish, several IDs by M. Deep fades but good copy at top of the fade cycles, faded out completely before presumed sign-off with het gone shortly after 0100. This was on 10/12 UTC, only weak het heard on 10/13 and 10/14 UTC. (Steve George, MA [sageorge@amherst.edu](mailto:sageorge@amherst.edu) via Cumbre Digest)

**MONGOLIA. 4866v, Mongol Radio & TV**, Dalanzadgad, Sep 12 and 14, 1040 (fade in) – past 1300, active again with talks in Mongolian and Mongolian folkmusic. The crystal is defect, so it drifts up and down in frequency 4865.48 – 4866.20. There are also modulation problems and the transmitter power seem to be less than 12 kW as listed. 25332 (Roland Schulze, Philippines, DSWCI DX Window Oct 9 via DXLD)

**PARAGUAY: Radio América** sänder sedan någon vecka på 2300, 7737 och 9983 kHz enligt vänner Adán Mur. Fram till den 14 oktober hade man fått rapporter från Argentina, Australien, Bolivia, Brasilien, Canada, Tyskland, Italien, Norge, Paraguay, Senegal, Sverige, Uruguay och USA. Detta gäller på alla frekvenser man testat på. (Thord Knutsson)

**PERU. 6419.2, RADIO TROPICAL**. New station from Huancabamba, Piura. Broadcasting in 6419.2 with regular signal and better in LSB. In the first moment I think that maybe it's harmonic but I heard ``...Radio Tropical a través de los 6420 kHz en la onda corta internacional de 49 metros...``. As slogan ``Radio Tropical, la señal integradora de los pueblos del norte del Perú...``; Mentions of Ernesto Laverde as Owner- Manager and Felicito Campos Campos as Administrator. In 1995 was Radio Imperial in 6420.2 from this city, but the shortwave transmitter was sold to Radio Mi Frontera from Chirinos. I think but not confirm, that the equipment returned to Huancabamba since Radio Mi Frontera is inactive for long time. I send audio file from this station to friend Mika M. (Rafael Rodríguez, Colombia, dxing.info via DXLD)

**PERU. 6324 kHz, RD Comercial**, LV del Destino(p), 1040, Tuned into a female singing OA (but not huaynos ) music. While I listened, the song lasted for 15 mins. Male announcer came on and said "estación" and "nacional" but did not hear an ID. More music, then announcement at top of hour. Music program continued to fadeout at 1106. Signal went from fair to threshold from 1050 to 1105. Next day I tuned in at 1028 and they were already there, but signal not as strong. Not heard Oct 5 in the morning (ute there that wasn't during the week). Also heard in evenings but not as strong. (Sgrulletta Oct 3 via Cumbre Digest)

**PERU: SPECIAL REPORT FROM TAKAYUKI INOUE NOZAKI**

**Radio San Miguel**, which has been observed in the vicinity of **5500 kHz** since April of 2002, is one of the new station broadcasting from San Miguel de Pallaques, capital of the Province of San Miguel, Department of Cajamarca. This station is not Radio San Miguel Arcangel, which formerly transmitted between 5707.0 kHz and 5721.1 kHz from July of 1980 through December of 1995, then the station reactivated its shortwave transmissions on 6339.7 kHz between April of 1999 to May of 2001. I visited San Miguel in October of 2001 to make local stations' research. I noted that four stations were in operation: Radio Andina on 994.9 kHz, Radio San Miguel Arcangel on 1370.3 kHz, Radio San Miguel on 1453.0 kHz and Radio San Miguel FM on 97.9 kHz. According to Inelso Cruzado, the owner and station manager of Radio San Miguel, the station is licensed to broadcast on the frequency of 1450 kHz with callsign OAU2W. Radio San Miguel FM is licensed to broadcast on the frequency of 97.9 MHz with callsign OAT2K. Radio San Miguel also experimentally operated on 4815 kHz in 2000 without authorization, and they would made application for license to the Ministry of Transports and Communication. It was discontinued due to expensive electricity, but they informed me that the station would be resumed when they obtain more client that are interested in shortwave broadcasts. As of October 2002, Radio San Miguel broadcasts at 0900-0200 daily on medium wave and at 1200-0300 daily on FM.

**PERU. La Voz de las Huarinjas**, until July 13 was on 6816.8; from July 17 heard on **6819.6**. On the previous frequency it was heard 8 mornings in July, sign on 1050 variable: 4 dates at 1050/1055, two at 1100, one each at 1040 and 1045; and on 13 evenings. On the newer frequency heard three mornings in July from \*1100, and 13 evenings. Evening checks were made between 0000 and 0200 (Emilio Pedro Povrzenic, Villa Diego, Santa Fé, Argentina, Latinoamérica DX, July, Asociación DX del Litoral, Rosario, via Sept Radio Nuevo Mundo via DXLD)

**PERU/BOLIVIA. La Voz del Campesino**: two stations with the same name, one in Bolivia (6537.3) and the other in Peru (6956.7), rarely audible at the same time (only local Sundays, the only day the Bolivian is on at night). So far the two have been audible together on eleven Sunday nights, and even more rarely on a single morning. The Bolivian has another peculiarity: on Mondays they rest a bit longer and open later than usual (between 0830 and 1030), predominantly at 1030 currently in the winter (Emilio Pedro Povrzenic, Villa Diego, Santa Fé, Argentina, Latinoamérica DX, July, Asociación DX del Litoral, Rosario, via Sept Radio Nuevo Mundo via DXLD)

**6020.27, R. Victoria**, Lima, Sep 25-Oct 01, 0556-0839 (fade out), full Spanish ID, Spanish and Portuguese religious programmes produced by "Dios es Amor" church. ID: "estamos por Radio Victoria, transmitiendo el programa La Voz de la Liberación"; other ann.: "todo Lima y el Perú lo escucha cuando son exactamente las dos con 33 minutos", 35442 // 9720.27. (Gonçalves, Howard and Slaen...). This has not been reported since June 2001! (Anker Petersen, DSWCI DX Window Oct 9 via DXLD)

**SPAIN, CANARY ISLANDS.** All the credit and congratulations to Sung Chul Cho of the Republic of Korea for investigating and solving this 6715U mystery. As I was in close e-mail contact with Cho these days sharing some thoughts, may I put the findings in brief for those who might not be familiar with the "6715U unid".

- In February 2002, David Hodgson, TN, USA, first logged unid religious station on 6715U. - Soon it was found out that the language was Korean and the programs were aired on Sundays, Wednesdays and Fridays during UT evenings. - As heard only in Europe and USA suggested the station was somewhere in Europe or Africa. - The broadcast schedule switched to DST in the end of March.  
- Direction finding in Europe shows 224/044 degrees (WB). - David sent a recording of the program to Sung Chul Cho. - Cho finds out the program was related to Full Gospel Church of Korea. - Cho finds out from the tape they mention "Full Gospel Las Palmas Church"  
- Cho finds a letter from FG Las Palmas Church to Yoido (FG Church in Korea) in Korean at the Yoido web site, mentioning they relay the church service via SSB for Korean fishermen. - An FG churchmember in Las Palmas confirms after listening to an audiofile of 6715 that the program is theirs (Cho). - And finally, I myself just got an e-mail from the church itself (to my report and mp3 file) confirming this all (see below).

Well, the transmitter might be located at Las Palmas, Canary Islands. Speculating - the programs may be relayed from the church via f. ex. VHF radio to a fishing vessel and re-transmitted from there. Ahh, forget it.

#### **Local power noise**

I'm a 160, 80, 40 meter amateur radio operator including MARS, as well a LF, MF Dx'er, even some SW on 120, 90 60 meters, so noise was a big problem for me here in the swamps of central Florida. I tried a variety of solutions including loops, flags, beverages and phasing devices like the MFJ-1025/1026, all with varying degrees of success. Next I began studying the local power grid installation and its lack of maintenance and came to realize that most of my noise came from arcing across lightning arrestors damaged by lightning strikes. This was verified by a portable radio QRN search by me. Then it was off to communicate the QRN problem with the intransigent local power company, then the ARRL and even the FCC, a very slow process laborious process. Anyway to make a long story short, the removal of the ground wire lead from the lightning arrestors on the power poles became the temporary solution for me, followed by replacement of the lightning arrestors. My QRN went from +20 over S9 to S0-1 on 160.

How good is the 340 on LW and MW? How good is its synchronous AM detector? Is it's SAM sideband-selectable? How good is it's NB? Does it's display radiate any digital hash for my loop to pick up? Any and all comments on the 340 are appreciated. TNX.

My MW use is only occasional, but the sound from my RX340 when I do is outstanding. On MWDX, it seems to do quite well, but I'm more interested in HF (and some LF utilities/NAVTEX monitoring), where it's superb.

A review of an RX340 with the earliest version firmware by someone who does specialize in MWDX (Don Nelson) and compares it with his WJ HF-1000A is at Dave Z's "Radio Receiver Page" site: <http://members.fortunecity.com/swradios/340rep.html>

The few nits picked seem to involve things corrected in subsequent firmware revisions (or some misunderstandings on his part).

Another, more brief, review is at [http://www.swl-ute.com/rx-340\\_comments.htm](http://www.swl-ute.com/rx-340_comments.htm). The SAM is, indeed, sideband-selectable - one of the 340's advantages over the WJ-87xx/HF1000 units. You have to know how to choose combinations of AGC and IF gain, however, or it will be a bit more prone to unlock/relock than the WJs in rapid, deep fading situations.

The HF1000s are slightly better on rejecting very close-in QRM on HF, due to using an 8kHz roofing filter, instead of the standard WJ8711's 16kHz. However, this results in slightly worse HF1000 sound quality on MW (with its 9 or 10kHz channel spacings), since the RX340 can use filter bandwidths up to 16kHz. With SAM this yields RX340 sound quality that's near audiophile-grade.

The noise blanker seemed reasonably effective on the few occasions I've had for its use.

The review in the 2001 Passport to World-band Radio indicates that there is not as much digital hash as the WJs, and my own experience is that using an AOR loop sitting on top of the RX340 bears that out. (They do say that there is a small amount directly in front of the display glass, so I guess you it won't qualify for TEMPEST <g>.)

Dave-Z gave it an excellent review in the 2002 Passport, but he quickly pulled it from his web-site as (he told me) "a courtesy to Passport." What's left on his web-site is a pre-his-actual-use/review page full of random comments - some from me. I have a copy of the review HTML-page, but will respect his wishes and not redistribute it. The use of an RX340 as the receiver in a ham setup is reviewed at

Nobody "needs" a \$4K receiver, but if you can afford one, the RX340 is an outstanding receiver that will beat out anything at up to half-again the price. (It's basically just a computer-controlled RX331 surveillance/monitoring receiver with the addition of ergonomics.)
