Dan Olsson: Det var länge sedan jag bidrog med något men det blir så när jag inte kan höra något av värde härhemma.

17-18 mars var det sedvanliga gamla gänget ute i Saxtorp och lyssnade. Vi kunde tyvärr konstatera att vår longwire åt sydväst är kass. Trots att den är hel så blir det ingen signal i den så vi får dra en ny i sommar. Vi fick använda Pers ALA-loop och den fungerade bra.


Arne Nilsson: Nu är det ett tag sedan jag kom in med ett bidrag, så det är väl dags igen! Det har tyvärr varit si och så med lyssnandet, men de gånger då jag försökt, har cx varit mediokra, i bästa fall. Men det är bara att kämpa på...

Det är väl det gamla vanliga som hörts, vilket kan tyckas lite tråkigt, men ibland kan det vara tryck i signalerna, och visst är det kul om stationer som Ondas del Suroriente eller R Tarma dundrar in med fina signaler! Musiken kan vara trevlig att lyssna till.

På min ”fritid” har jag också börjat med, och lärt mig, hoppas jag, att mäta Noise Figure på mottagare och förstärkare! Jag köpte för ett år sedan en kalibrerad bruskälla från Continental Compliance Limited/RF Design i England (<http://www.rfdesignuk.com/>). Den förblev liggande i ett år innan jag tog tag i saken och beslöt mig för att det var dags att göra ett försök! Martyn (som jag tror är ägaren) var väldigt hjälpsam, och då jag förklarade för honom vilka frekvensområden jag var intresserad av, så fick jag en extra kalibreringspunkt för 2 MHz (normalt är bruskällan kalibrerad mellan 10-1420 MHz, min alltså mellan 2-1420 MHz).

Den modell jag köpte heter RFD 2315 och kostar £148,80 inkl. moms. Till denna hårdvara har Owen Duffy, VK1OD, skrivit ett program som på ett enkelt sätt presenterar NF (<http://vk1od.net/software/nfm/>) . Man använder då alltså datorn som en del av instrumentet och ljudkortet hanterar brussignalerna. Jag ska inte trötta ut er med en komplett beskrivning av hur man gör, utan presentera mina resultat!

Jag började med att mäta min Perseus, med och utan preamp inkopplad:



I rutan "Instrument calibration" finns resultatet av mätningen utan preamp, och NF är då ca 21,2 dB. Under "Combined measurement" mäter jag Perseus + inkopplad preamp och den totala NF för mottagaren blir då ca 19,6 dB.

Under "Device under test" visas resultatet för preamp, dvs NF ca 16 dB och förstärkning 4,2 dB. En preamp med dessa data är inte speciellt bra, och förbättringen med preamp inkopplad blir bara ca 1,6 dB eller, om man tar hänsyn till noggrannhet (kanske ca +/- 0,2 dB) och konfidens, så ger denna preamp ca 2 dB förbättring av den totala NF.

Mätningarna är gjorda på 14,000 MHz, SSB och 2,4 kHz bandbredd, på samma frekvens som Perseus' data är uppmätta och de anger en en NF på 18 dB med preamp ON och Dither OFF.

Jag har två Norton förstärkare från Clifton Lab's: En äldre modell med diskreta komponenter och en nyare med SMD kretsar/komponenter. En mätning av dessa gav följande resultat:

	Gain	NF
Gamla modellen:	9,8 dB	3 dB
Nya modellen:	9,9 dB	2,2 dB

Jag köpte dessa som byggsats och har inte trimmat dem för optimal NF utan följt rekommendationerna i byggbeskrivningen. Vid en kontakt med Jack Smith på företaget, så bekräftar han att hans egna mätningar ligger i linje med mina. Jag tycker att det är respektgivande data!! Om man kopplar in en sådan förstärkare mellan antenn och Rx, så sjunker systemets totala NF till ca 10 dB, vilket motsvarar en MDS på -130 dBm (-122 för Perseus, enl. fabrikanten). Men då får man vara försiktig med att inte skaffa sig problem med intermodulationsprodukter (IP2 och IP3)!

(Stort tack till dig Arne för en lektion i hur man mäter upp sin utrustning. Väldigt intressant. Man kan ju fråga sig vilken nyttja den Preamp som finns på Perseus egentligen gör. I praktisk drift är det inte ofta jag har den inkopplad. /TN)

BRAZIL - 5044.97, R. Cultura, Belem, with great big signal but few anmts at 0917 on 3/25. Nice pgming - Nat King Cole and Natalie Cole in that digitally-created duet, "Unforgettable" and then some Johnny Mathis. OM boomy voice in PP w/anmts at 0925 and into canned ad string 0926. Strong signal but low modulation. Brazilians doing well this evening: 4885 blaring and also noted 6059.94 Super Radio Deus e Amor, Curitiba, with a terrific signal post-0900. 5940.06 Radio Voz Missionaria, Camboriu, also hrds same time, but inside a real QRM mess on that general freq, needed ECSS USB to separate clearly. CHINA. 4940, Voice of Strait, March 31 at 1503; Saturday only English show “Focus on China” in progress; YL with news items of the past week; frequent musical bridges; China and Zambia signed bilateral agreements; Irish and Chinese governments to work together with the aim of improving trade and investments;

DIEGO GARCIA [non]. 4319-USB, AFN, March 29 and 30 heavy QRM has returned here again after being absent for two days (Ron Howard, San Francisco at Ocean Beach, CA)

EQUATORIAL GUINEA [non]. 15190, Radio Africa. March 31 checked briefly 1501-1502 and found nothing here; no trace of them or IRRS (Ron Howard, Asilomar State Beach, CA)

INDONESIA. 3325, RRI Palangkaraya. On March 29 very late signing on; not heard at 1205, 1230 or 1257, but was on by 1418.

March 30 from 1209 to 1226 with the usual Jakarta news relay; // 3995 RRI Kendari (poor, but for a change the ham QRM not too bad) and 9680 RRI Jakarta (heavy CNR1 QRM); news ends with the usual patriotic national song; 1227 no longer // (Ron Howard, San Francisco at Ocean Beach, CA)

KOREA NORTH [non]. 6020, Shiokaze/Sea Breeze via Yamata. After 1400 noted in English for Friday, March 30; moderate jamming (Ron Howard, San Francisco at Ocean Beach, CA)

MALAYSIA. 5964.7, Klasik Nacional via RTM. Now that the A12 schedule has started and the powerhouse station that was here has moved away, now able to clearly hear KN again; 1131-1208 & 1237-1305; March 25. In vernacular playing pop songs; many IDs and singing jingles; 1237 Muslim call-to-prayer (the Isha/night prayer – their local sunset was at 1223). Very nice to hear this again! MICRONESIA. 4755.47v, PMA-The Cross Radio, 0950-1033, March 25. Non-stop Christian songs; 0959 “This is 88.5 FM and it is 9 o’clock” and more songs; was gone by 1047. Seemed to be on a higher frequency and with slight drifting (Ron Howard, San Francisco at Ocean Beach, CA, Etón E1, dxldyg via DX LISTENING DIGEST)

MYANMAR. 9730.85, Myanmar Radio on March 24 running well past their normal 1000*; first noted poorly at 1249; after 1500 fair to almost good reception; in vernacular with EZL songs and indigenous songs. Wished they ran late every day! MP3 audio at <http://www.box.com/s/a18fe2cb70bde6381ea4> .

Seems my March 24 reception was actually the programming of Padauk Myay Radio (FM?), which I believe was relayed via Myanmar Radio. Ms. Htike Htike has responded that she has listened to my audio file and "It's not from our station, Myanmar Radio", by which I assume she means the programming was not Myanmar Radio's, but instead from "one of stations in our country. It's name is PadaukMyay Radio. It's also broadcasting in Nay Pyi Taw". I do not imagine that Padauk Myay Radio has a SW transmitter that broadcasts from Nay Pyi Taw on 9730.85, which is a known Myanmar Radio frequency.

This would seem to confirm the information at the excellent website of Alan Davies (<http://www.asiawaves.net/myanmar-radio.htm>), which shows "Yangon - 9731v kHz., Myanma Radio, Padauk Myay Service". Certainly is difficult to tie down a positive station/program ID, as the Burmese/Myanmar language is so difficult to decipher.

MYANMAR [non]. 5915. In the past I often heard a weak Myanmar Radio here under a strong CRI (in Russian). March 27, I was briefly excited to hear Burmese with a very decent signal mixing against CRI at 1358, but alas was much too strong to be Myanmar. In fact was the newly scheduled **BBC in Burmese from 1345-1430**, so Myanmar has no hope at all of being heard during this time slot (Ron Howard, San Francisco at Ocean Beach, CA, USA)

MYANMAR. 7110. Noted March 29 with English segment from theme music at 1430 thru to 1500*. Best reception so far. Very clear ID, except there seems to be a word before "Radio" that I cannot make out. "Pyin Oo Lwin" sounds fairly clear and am almost positive about that.

"Good evening dear listeners. You are tuned to the ____ Radio Pyin Oo Lwin and thank you very much. We are broadcasting the third English transmission on the air again. Radiating on 639 kilohertz and 7511 megahertz." (fairly clear: "7511") Easy listening music.

"Good evening our dear listeners. May I present for you some sweet melodies of life."

Also 1442 to 1448 nice segment about Myanmar culture and history. Today with information about Myanmar lacquerware. White noise jamming after 1434, but not as strong as yesterday.

So the most likely scenario here is that this programming is produced in a studio in Pyin Oo Lwin, in central Myanmar, and then transmitted from Nay Pyi Taw (Ron Howard, San Francisco at Ocean Beach, CA, USA)

Suggestions are that there is no "the", but instead "You are tuned to Thazin Radio Pyin Oo Lwin". Also it must be "7 point 11". Thanks to Mauno Ritola (Finland) and Victor Goonetilleke (Sri Lanka) for their kind assistance. (Ron Howard)

MYANMAR. 7110, Thazin Radio, 1430-1501*, March 31. The first day with no white noise jamming, which was a big help for better reception! Usual intro; EZL pop songs ("You're The One I Love", etc.); 1443: "Hello and welcome to Myanmar Traditional ..."

cultural show; "Through this program you will be able to find out more about Myanmar and its people"; "Today I would like to tell you about Myanmar music, the heart and soul of Myanmar people"; talking about Myanmar musical instruments (unique set of 21 drums in a circle: <http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=8cIE4rVITPA>); 1449 back to pop songs (Rod Stewart, etc.).

It is indeed very good news from Alan Davies that there are in fact SW facilities at Pyin U Lwin! (Ron Howard, Asilomar State Beach, CA)

PAPUA NEW GUINEA - 7324.97, tentatively Wantok R. Light on 3/25, thanks to Dave Valko for tip to check this out. Probably the one hr'd very poorly at 0858-0913, very weak signal and difficult to read, but broadcaster definitely "there". 0858 tune-in to hear OM anmts, couldn't tell lang, and then into some type of instl mx thru top of hour. At 0901 a woman (or else OM with higher-pitched voice) into long discourse, would match with Dave's observation of newcast at this time. Signal too difficult to work very successfully this night, fading in and out. Frustrated and could not hold past 0913, but well worth further checks. (Perry, Illinois via DXPlorer)

VIETNAM. 7906-USB and 8294-USB, Vietnam Coast Radio Station (VISHIPEL) (presumed). Thanks entirely to the timely tip from Sei-ichi Hasegawa (Japan) that I tuned in to this.

March 19 observed on 7906-USB; *1020-1025*, *1105-1110*, *1120-1125*. Actually 10 minutes between the broadcasts of these five minute segments; in Vietnamese with assume marine weather; today always ending with the same commercial ad (OM & YL along with sound of phone ringing and young girl says "Hello"). Pulsating noise QRM till 1123. 8294-USB not heard today.

March 20 on 7906-USB again with five minute segments; again ending with the same commercial ad. At 1220 found // 8294-USB for the first time, but this frequency did not run the commercial ad at the end of the marine weather, as heard on 7906-USB; went off at 1224, so the segments on 8294-USB are about one minute shorter and about eleven minutes between segments; noted *1235-1239*.

Need to confirm the full schedule and exact transmitter sites of these broadcasts.

This is Ho Chi Minh Radio, Ho Chi Minh Radio, Ho Chi Minh Radio" with announcement that a fishing boat had one person overboard and dated "1100 UTC the 17th of March, 2012"; into Vietnamese. UNID BRAZIL - possibly a new Brazilian (or at least, an old one on a new fqy) on 6035.00 at 0906 on 3/26. Tune-in with OM giving fqy info in progress in PP and then into PP ballads at 0809, something of an updated Abba sound. Fair sig and no QRM. 0815 OM PP anmmts wishing all MBD and then into another ballad at 0817. Degrading by 0830, lotsa atmospheric noise and no ID. Almost entirely gone by 0842. Might speculate a QTH in the far, far eastern portion of Brazil that juts out into the Atlantic? Not noted when fqy checked on 3/28, same time. (Perry, Illinois via DXPlorer)

International Reply Coupons

According to "Stamp Magazine" from 18 February 2012 Post Offices in the UK no longer sell International Reply Coupons. These were once the universal "currency" of DXers chasing QSLs. (via BDXC-UK)

An International Reply Coupon (IRC) is a device by which a person in one member country of the Universal Postal Union (UPU) can prepay the return airmail postage cost of a letter of a specific maximum weight from a different UPU member country. At the time of writing and in theory at least, IRCs are exchangeable in all countries with the exception of Taiwan. UPU member countries may decide not to sell IRCs, (notably the Netherlands and Sweden, amongst others) but their exchange is compulsory in all countries. NuForce uDAV2

Jag köpte en USB-driven hörlursförstärkare.

Särskilt när jag lyssnar remote, så blir ljudet långt ifrån perfekt i mina hörlurar. Och jag har tidigare använt mig av Edirols externa ljudkort, och varit belåten med det förbättrade ljudet som detta innebär. Men Edirol är lite bölig att använda, eftersom jag måste gå in i datorn och ändra aktiv ljudenhets om jag vill ta med mig datorn till annan plats utan att plocka med mig Edirol.

NuForce uDAV2 löser detta problem genom att det enkelt pluggas in i ledig USB-port, och då direkt tar över som ljudkälla, utan några som helst extra inställningar. Och när USB-porten kopplas ur, så återgår ljudet att komma från den ursprungliga ljudenheten i datorn.

Formatet är i storlek av en normal tändsticksask, så NuForce uDAC2 är idealisk att ta med sig och använda både på Dalarö och mitt remote QTH inne i Stockholm.

I now think that when people are asking "what headphones should I get for my laptop" they are missing something they really need. a DAC & AMP combo like this is really needed to extract the potential out of any high quality headphones or earphones and I think its a very smart idea that if you are going to get one you should plan to get the other.
