Antenn var ALA100 med 15m loop.


Den enda analys jag gjort sen hemkomsten var att säkerställa/diskvalificera min tentativa

loggning av CKZU 6159,965v den 30/7 0100z. Ett förmodat ID hördes 0106z (tyvärr utanför 2 min inspelningen mellan 0059-0101).


Hittade bättre inspelningar vid 0000z, även på andra dagar, och kan nu konstatera att det givetvis borde vara CKZN! Kort efter 2359 hörs lokal id för "89.5 FM" (och även "98.7 FM") vilket pekar på relä av CBC Radio One NF. En loggning från BC hade inte varit trolig alls, möjligens sensationell!

Labbade med analys i SDR-Radio 1.5 ikväll. Provade tidigare för ett par år sedan med Perseus filer och hade ständigt missvisning. Tröttnade.

Men numera, med Afedri (via HDSDR och Winrad filformat) fungerar det som det skall. Kollade av 6010: LV dt Conciencia har problem men det blir bättre sen...

And I am searching since days for Fu Hsing Broadcasting Station, TWN because "Jonathan Short" did QSL:

The last days the 5129,971 station from Kyrgyzstan is again audible here after 1645 UT, poor signal, but Autumn is coming, so I can listen to some better signals from of my beloved Asia.

Today no signals from Lhasa on 4820 so Kolkata very clear, also no Lhasa signals on 4905 and 4920 (Chennai also audible!)

Jag tror också de spår på 3325 som syns t ex på bilden nedan är från NBC. Bärvägen är för svag för att gå igenom här nere – den bara ”syns”. Se ytterligare kommentarer i tipsen på 3325./TN)*

Arne Nilsson: Precis nyss fick jag **QSL** från **R Symban!!** Riktigt kul! Tack för hjälpen med mailadressen!

Anker Petersen: Here are my latest loggings from Skovlunde on my AOR and RadioJet.

Propagation on the 60 mb is fascinating: In the late evening you have strong signals from domestic stations in China, later the Latin Americans fade in and after midnight UTC the AIR regionals sign on.

But most stations fade out again after about one hour, so it has always been a big challenge to DX on the tropical bands at the right times!

John Ekwall. Hoppas att sommaren varit bra trots allt. Ute på Karön så är det jobb som gäller - på syrrans gårdsbus där jag hjälper en snickare att ordna till ett nytt tak. Tyvärr en massa underarbeten som tar tid.

Fick 10 dagars ledigt från detta jobb och passade på att göra en liten Norrlandstripp. Här kommer en första del. Avslutande del med bilder kommer efterhand, när jag hittar kamerakabeln.

Nostalgitripp till nordliga latituder

Med en del vånda beslutade jag äntligen att besöka Norrland. Eftersom jag numera befinner mig i Blekinge året runt, är en bilresa till Norrland en tripp på ca 180 mil t o r. Vad var då anledningen till denna resa? Kommer man en bit upp i åldern är det ett par saker så måste klaras av innan det blir försent. Då jag varit redaktör för SWB under en rätt lång tid har det förekommit många samtal med bidragsgivare genom åren, så varför inte besöka dem?!

Efter lite trevande kontakter i maj började det småningom klarna hur långt jag skulle fara – Gällivare blev det och gamle vännen Arne Härkönen. Det var mer än 40 år sedan jag och Arne kunde pokulera över ett och annat glas whisky. Så nu var slutmålet bestämt eftersom AH var med på noterna. Nu var det bara att lägga ut mellanstationer, både på upp- och nerresan.

En tisdag morgon i mitten av juli satte jag mig i en nyservad Corolla. Starten var redan 0600 eftersom jag hade ca 85 mil framför mig. Första anhalten var Karlsborg och Eric Lund. Eric är arkivansvarig hos SSA och till honom hade jag en flyttlåda med allehanda DX-tidningar och annat material. Under våren 2012 hade Eric kommit upp till Norrköping och fyllt en släpvagn med massor av DX-tidningar men även SWB's gamla hederliga stencilutrustning Gestetner 360 med tillhörande plåtskåp och stenciler mm. Min gamla stationära dator (Win97 och XP) med programvaror tillhörde också flyttlasset. Nu kompletterades denna utrustning med min flyttlåda. Eric förevisade lagerlokalen som innehöll en fantastisk mängd radio-tidningar från tidigt 30-tal och framåt, samt naturligtvis material relaterat till sändaramatörhobbyen – en hel del radioapparater kunde beskådas. Typiskt nog hade SSA fått sin lokal uppsagd nu när Eric var klar med katalogiseringen. Området är det gamla flottiljområdet som numera används för att utrusta svenska militära insatser i utlandet. SSA hade dock fått en annan lokal ca 300 meter bort och flytten sker troligen nu i höst. Efter fika och trevlig samvaro var det bara att ha sikte inställt på Hudiksvall och Jan Edh.

Mellan Askersund och Kumla var det mycket semester-trafik men väl på E20/E18 flöt det på bra. Ett kebab-stopp gjordes vid Örsundsbro. Nya genomfarten i Uppsala till E4an inga problem alls. Lugnt och behagligt tempo sedan upp till Hudik där jag hittade fram till Fiskaregatan. Ett fint gammalt hus med inneträdgård men det var inte där vi skulle umgås utan färden gick vidare till Drässviken ute på Hornslandet, där Åsa och Jan har en sommarstuga. Medan Jan förberedde grillen fixade jag till 2 Caipirinhas som förrdrink och preludium till kvällens bildspel från mitt besök i Brasilien hos Nils Olsson. Vi hann med en kvällspromenad till den lilla hamnen innan det blev mycket snack över en whisky. Jan hade en föraning om att SDXF knappast kommer att existera om 10 år. Det finns ju knappast någon framtid för DX-hobbyen och nya utövare går knappast att rekrytera då ju alla radiostationer finns på nätet. I princip delade jag hans åsikt.

Morgonen därpå begav sig Jan och jag på en liten utflykt på det vilda och natursköna Hornslandet. Vi tittade till det gamla fiskeläget Hölick, där SMHI under några år hade en bemannad väderstation. Fin utsikt över havet och fjärdarna vid sidan av en välfyllt camping. Väl värt ett besök. Vi tvärade sedan över norra delen och passerade ett antal klapperstensområden innan vi nådde Kuggörarna. Vilken bedårande idyll – jag blev helt stum av denna lilla fiskehamn som är väl skyddad av vindar. Bland rödmålade fiskestugor uppe på en höjd låg SMHI's automatiska väderstation. Ovanligt nog var stationen ej omgärdad av något stängsel. Efter detta trevliga besök var det dags att vända inåt till Hudik och en fika tillsammans med Åsa, innan nästa bilresa tog sin början med Söråker som mål.

Stefan Wikander hade förvarnat om trafikkaoset söder om Sundsvall i samband med bygget av den nya bron över Sundsvallsfjärden. Visst var det lite tjorvigt emellanåt med jag tyckte det flöt på rätt bra. Passerade Timrå med köpcentrum innan jag kom ut på den trevliga sträckan till Söråker. Det var inte så svårt att hitta till Stefan efter goda köranvisningar.

Det blev ett glatt återseende. Senast jag träffade SW var på ett konvent i Bergslagen på 70-talet, dessförinnan var det Hammarstrand och tidigt 70-tal. Det var då Stefan och jag hörde countrymusik på 6012 kHz men fick ej ID. Troligen var det AFAN McMurdo vi hörde. Men det var då det. Nu var det annat som Stefan ägnade sig åt – natur och fåglar framförallt. Han har bra koll på ovanliga sångare och andra flygburna gäster. Vi passade på att ta en tur ut på Åstön och det gamla militärområdet, där Stefan har hittat ett framtida QTH för NA-lyssningen om intresset fortfarande är vi liv. Efter en dryg timmes utflykt var vi tillbaka och dags att koppla av med en drink – Caipirinha naturligtvis. Vi hann väl bara halvvägs när Stefans Elisabeth kom hem från jobbet och lockade ner ås till stranden. Där såg vi aktern på en stor pontonkran som var på väg till Sundsvall för att lyfta brospann. Ni kan kolla själv hur det går med bron på Trafikverkets hemsida. Till middag blev det Stefans specialare på lax. Som underhållning spelade SW sin favoritmusik från USA och Texas och berättade en hel del dråpliga historier från sina många besök där. Sedvanlig bildvisning från Brasilien följde innan det så småningom blev dags för lite nattsömn. Blev genomgående sena kvällar på denna resa, så lite morgontrött var man allt.

Dags för en ny resa, denna gång till Ö-vik och närmare bestämt Bonässund där Gert Nilsson väntade med sin prunkade trädgård. Men innan jag kom fram var det med spänning man åkte igenom det beryktade Höga Kusten-området med bro och Skuleberg. Hisnande vyer minst sagt. Väl framme väntade fika innan vi kollade vad Perseus FM+ kunde avslöja, inte så mycket Es dena middag. Gert berättade om QTHet i Hanabäcksliden där man lyckats få ett bra kontrakt på scoutstugan. Dock är det problem med antenner som går av då och då. Teknikern GN får rycka ut och fixa efter felrapporter från Bo Nensén. Eftersom jag hade planerat att vara i Umeå vid 17-tiden blev det ett kort besök men som sällskap fick jag 2 jättestora zucchinis från Gerts grönsaksland.

There was a weak carrier also on 5019,89 at 1845z. Acc. to Stig Adolfsson, NBC Bougainville has been one of the most difficult Papuan stations to log in Sweden. On Aug 15 RRI Palangkaraya (tent) was noted on 3324,995 at 2216z and seems to be back almost on their nominal frequency. This makes it real difficult to catch NBC. I have also listened over and over again on the 3325 recording from July 6 and I am now quite sure it is the RRI station. On July 15 & 27 RRI Palangkaraya was noted on 3324,88. So Stig Adolfsson was absolutely right after listening to my three recordings that all of them came from RRI. TN

The U.S. east coast is dotted with these stations in urban areas (which might explain the Euro reception). When I hear an ID with the freq ("Radio 15-70") I tend to think domestic. Nice clip, Dave. That's pretty good clarity considering how weak the audio is on this one. /John Herkimer ----- Thanks a lot for the audio file. Unfortunately not enough audio yet here in Sweden. I sent the file to Henrik Klemetz who is an expert in finding ID's. He says: <i>The music is Colombian. The program style is not. "Extra, extra" is unusual in Colombia today. Puerto Rico: is out of the question – the station is religious. Mexico: It is hardly La Poderosa. ID only on the hour and half hour. Then most likely some US-Hispano. If the carrier is audible in Sweden maybe it is from East coast or Florida.</i> Henrik says he will listen again if a new audio file is possible to get. 



KYRGYZSTAN 4795 - Program 1 hrd via Perseus site in C. Germany on 8/5 from 0007 tune w/ Kyrgyz vocal then non-stop what sounded at first blush like LA vocals. Gradual improvement from S2 to S3, peaking 0045-0100. SINPO 34333 with periodic, short-term ute QRM (pulsed signal of some type), a backgnd hum and typical summer static. Signal then faded after 0100 back to S2. I was convinced that this was not Kyrgyz R. also listed here at same time frame, because of the apparent LA music. However, at 0055 there was finally a man and then woman ann in unk lang to 0056, but not SS. This was fol by inst mx that sounded more C. Asian, then woman ann at 0101 until tune out at 0107 (mixed w/ backgnd mx until 0102). Fading pattern supports Kyrgyz R. passing through gray line. Carrier much better looking than audio as shown in the Perseus screen shot here: <https://app.box.com/s/cxy2i9f20r4o12opp5fk> (file was labeled R. Lipez Uyuni thinking (hoping!) this was the Bolivian at tune in). This would be Bishkek's 15 KW xmtr, thus the relatively weak sigs, even in C. Germany.

Since I awaken before 1200 UT August 5, I hasten to check the tropical bands for Asia: on 60m, nothing much but China on 4940, weak Indonesia on 4750; then to 90m, where at 1153 I am pleased to find the SSOB is also the best signal in a long time from PNG on 3385, i.e. Radio East New Britain, Rabaul, S9+20 playing tune resembling ``Alouette'', Tok Pisin, 1155 mentions ``ten o'clock'' which is imminent locally, more music; 1200 announcement is cut off the air at 1200.5*. Second best is 3205, which stays on with some modulation, and third, carrier from something on 3325. Nothing audible on 120m. Our sunrise today 1141, latening about one minute per day (Glenn Hauser, Enid OK, DX LISTENING DIGEST)

PAPUA NEW GUINEA. 3874.6 V UnIdentified (possibly NBC) outlet here, first noted at 1057 with talk by a man, seemingly in English and with (I thought) references to "PNG." Then into ads or similar prior to 1100, brief techno (dance) music and unmistakable NBC news theme at 1101 (checked against WWVH). I say "possible NBC outlet" because I presume someone else could relay the news (which was in // to the news on much stronger 3385 NBC East New Britain). Warbly, weak and unstable transmitter, measured drifting down to .57-ish. (Am also thinking whether this may be some sort of back-up feed from Port Moresby, to outlying stations?) 9/8 (David Sharp NSW via DXLD)

Hi Ron, All I have determined is, this station seems to // 3385 most (perhaps all) of the time. Also being heard in Darwin (much closer to the target). Cannot speculate if TX site is also East New Britain or if someone is relaying the station. As you've noted, the TX is highly unstable and drifts considerably.

I have recently informed in my last report on SW activity in Uruguay, that Emisora Chaná, was inactive, since some press info had informed in Nov 12, 2012 that the government had closed several FM community low power in Department of Tacuarembó, being FM Chaná among them.

DXer Ernesto Paulero, in Buenos Aires has just has hrd them (Aug 9, 2013) according to reports in Condiglist YG, so I immediately called by telephone to the station owner, Mr. Omar Lima, CX6OL, who confirms that the station has been again on the air since 15 days ago, and is now running 24h, with 30 W, (nominal 50W), AM, with no xtal (thus the

variability/instability of fq reported last year). Antenna is very low (4 meters above ground, but he plans to raise it to 15 m height.

He also tells this has been corrected in some way, and there's no so strong deviation in fq. This is confirmed today by further monitoring.

Asked about its permission and closure for the FM, he stated that he was never notified or visited by telcom authorities and he has been always normally operating on FM. (This is rather weird... or the telcom didn't work effectively or the press info was not 100% correct). The SW had been off air for about six months, but is now reactivated. They currently operate 24H. 5980.2v 0.05nominal Em. Chaná, Tacuarembó: 24h

Dear Radio Friends, In past few days I have read many monitoring observation posts from Ron Howard from California, USA and Gautam Kumar Sharma of Abhayapuri, Assam regarding AIR Shillong, AIR Aizawl and other AIR regional stations who are currently broadcasting on shortwave. These postings in yahoo DX lists increased my curiosity for these stations` recent status and during past few days I have been regularly monitoring these stations. As far as AIR Shillong and AIR Aizawl are concerned, I have monitored these two stations in past few days and yes, found that AIR Shillong situated in Meghalaya state of India and at a distance of about 390 kilometres South West of Jorhat, now can be better heard on 4971 kHz rather than 4970 kHz. Please find below two links for AIR Shillong video as received here in my QTH at Jorhat in Assam, in the morning hours.

And AIR Aizawl broadcasting from the state capital of Mizoram, although not very strong, but can be heard now in morning as well as evening hours on 5050 kHz. During evening hours though I observed some interference from CNR.

I have also tried other AIR stations in NE, viz AIR Imphal on 4775 kHz, AIR Gangtok on 4835 kHz, AIR Kohima on 4850 kHz, AIR Kurseong on 4895 kHz, AIR Guwahati on 4940 kHz and AIR Itanagar on 4990 kHz on 9th August morning between 0300-0400 UTC, but could not hear any of them except AIR Kurseong on 4895 kHz. This proves that other AIR stations are off the air these days as already informed by Ron Howard and Gautam Sharma. Here is a video of this AIR station search.

For all these observations I have used JRC NRD-91 receiver and a 20 mt. long dipole antenna. Hope these will be useful information for all of you as AIR will be broadcasting LIVE commentary of India's 67th Independence Day celebration from Red Fort, New Delhi on 15th August and these AIR stations are supposed to relay this program on their respective frequencies between 0135-0240 UT.


