Den föränderliga radiovärlden - eller?

När man bläddrar i senaste upplagan av World Radio TV Handbook, särskilt när man tittar på avdelningen Internationell radio grips man lätt av vemod. Så många länder har upphört med sina kortvägssändningar till utlandet. Det är både den digitala explosionen som trängt undan analog kommunikation, det kalla krigets upphörande som minskade behovet av kortvägssändningar till Östeuropa och de ökade kostnaderna för energislukande analoga sändningar som har lett dithän. Ja, det här vet ni om, alla ni som läser det här.

Men finns inget kvar av det gamla utom små kvarvarande rester av analog radio?

1843 uppfann Samuel Morse telegrafin och dess alfabet och drygt 50 år senare skapades radio av Marconi, Popov och Tesla - man tvistar alltjämt om vars och ens del i uppfinningen. Men det var telegrafin som blev det redskap som först användes inom detta nya kommunikationsmedium.

Och nu kommer jag till det jag vill påpeka: Telegrafin, som kom till för 170 år sedan lever och frodas alltjämt genom amatörradion. Trots alla tekniska framsteg har man funnit att telegrafi ofta är det bästa trafiksättet för att överföra meddelanden säkert under besvärliga förhållanden. Och trots att kunskaper i telegrafi idag inte längre är nödvändiga för att få licens som radioamatör är det många nytillkomna amatörer, som lärt sig CW och många av dem föredrar den framför andra trafiksätt.

Själv njuter jag av telegrafin, det är som ett eget språk, och liksom handstilar på papper kan vara helt olika är det samma sak med "handstilen" på telegrafi. En skicklig telegrafist är en njutning att lyssna på.

Nog är det märkligt att detta äldsta inom radiokommunikation fortfarande lever och inte visar några tecken på att dö ut!







This is a screenshot from Jan 30 at 0100 of a tentative signal from R Alvorada. Their transmitter is drifting up and down on both sides of 4865. Also note the instability of the carrier with heavy spurs on both sides of the carrier. /TN

Note the extreme resolution possible in the IQ Analysis above. No IQ analysis possible in the Perseus software. If you open the files in SDR Radio, the IQ analysis there can be used for Perseus files. /TN

Radio Progreso's successful test from October to December of 2013 using 4765 kHz frequency registered to Cuba at the ITU with 50 kW omnidirectional and high take off angle antenna was completed on the last day of December and starting January 1 2014 it is now a permanent daily service 7 days a week.

Under study now is the possibility of extending the on the air time starting at 2300 UTC, so that the broadcast will be from 2300 to 0500 UT.

As regards to reports received and QSL verification, the station will issue a QSL card soon, and in the meantime listeners who report correctly the transmissions will receive a QSL letter.

Anniversary reminders: 14 aniversario de Radio Verdad: 25 Feb 2014 Bodas de Plata ``Volviendo a Jesús``, 1 abril 2016 [Gerente Édgar Madrid`s signature show] Also enclosed a note in English, and a tract in Spanish, but no pennant or QSL (I already have several). The envelope makes an interesting cover, altho it bears no postage stamps. It`s airmail style, bordered by alternating red and blue parallelograms. On the obverse there is a rubber stamp imprint of a triangle superimposed on a circle, inscribed: CQ0101 / CORREO DE GUATEMALA, S.A. / Concesionario de Correos y Telegrafos / 14 DIC 2013 / Chiquimula / Chiquimula / Guatemala / Centro America [really they are all in caps of various sizes]. If Correo de Guatemala is an S.A., does that mean it`s privatized? On the reverse there is another rubber stamp overlapping the flap, reading 17 DIC 2013 FRANQUEO. And a self-adhesive label taking the place of a true postage stamp, with yet another date, apparently when the letter was axually ready to leave the country, 13 days later than the first one, 27-Diciembre-2013. (Of course there were holidays intervening.) In its upper-left is a red imprint with a stylized bird, and EL CORREO / Destino Seguro. A much larger similar bird logo underlies the middle of the label; and there is tilted grid across the right half of it. Across the bottom is a long bar code.
