QSL: Utöver e-QSL från pirater som till exempel Kennemer Radio (6240), Station QRP (6925) och Radio Spaceshuttle (3905) gläds jag över SIBC och ett riktigt trevligt mejl från Antarktis. V/s på SIBC var Patrick Tibaua och från LRA36 svarade Roman Labrousse.

Ännu ett tips på externt ljudkort. Jag håller med om att inbyggda ljudkort ofta har sina begränsningar. Arne Nilsson: Well, it's really been a while since my latest contribution to SWB! Most efforts here have been focused on MW, with some nice results, but propagation on MW now has deteriorated terribly, practically no useful TA signals any more due to the long daylight hours here close to the Arctic Circle. I have of course listened sporadically also on SW, but not found anything very exciting. Lately, PRU and BOL stations have been received with quite good signals and that is always nice. E.g. 3310 R Mosoj Chaski has been booming in with armchair copy and nice music. One interesting station is also tent LV de Artigas URG that was received on June 2nd with a readable signal.

Summer is also time for antenna work and so far most of my time has been put into making Common Mode Chokes for all antennas. The noise levels from most of my antennas are now only a couple of dB higher than the Perseus' own internal noise which is impressing! Leif Åsbrink assisted with useful help and support.

Other radio news

Common Mode Chokes (CMC)

Noise reduction: Inspired by the Youtube presentation by Leif Åsbrink, SM5BSZ, I decided to have a go at building Common Mode Chokes (CMC) for my antennas and receivers. I recommend you all to look at those presentations! I made 4-5 CMCs and connected them between antennas and receivers. They are easy to make and easy to connect and if you follow simple rules and recommendations, you don't really need a lot of complicated measurements to verify the performance.

I used 3E25 cores (diameter 25 mm), wound approx. 20-22 turns of twisted pair wires on the cores, installed them into plastic boxes with BNC connectors and that's it! (Do NOT use metal boxes!)

Measurements using a MiniVNA Pro shows an isolation between wires of approx. 40 dB, which translates into an equivalent impedance of around 5 kohm for common mode signals. When making those twisted pairs, use a drilling machine and make sure you have appox 1½ turns per inch or something like that. Using those parameters, I found that the rest is not very critical: You will get the 40 dB isolation on the CMC.

For my most noise affected antenna, pointing at approx. 50

degrees (towards Pacific) I have now reduced the noise level by more than 10 dB! The other antennas show a noise just 1-2 dB above the noise of the receiver itself (Perseus) and this now calls for preamps to be used all of the time! The noise factor for antenna + receiver is now around 12-14 dB compared to the NF for Perseus = >19 dB, i.e. I now have more sensitivity in my set-up! I have no strong signals in the vicinity of my QTH.

For the Pacific antenna I installed one CMC using 2 cores (and an isolation 4-6 dB better than a single core) at the antenna end and 2 more CMCs at the receiver end. Don't be afraid of using several CMCs for the one antenna! The more, the better!



And when you make comparisons before and after, use your receiver! I always measure noise during daytime, when noise levels are low. I set the receiver (in my case Perseus) to a bandwidth of 3 kHz AM and read the noise level on the S-meter. You can use any bandwidth/mode but be sure to use it for all measurements you make.

If the results I have measured now still holds when the conditions get better, I am sure to be able to log those rare stations!


Monitoring a frequency

BBC fails to air Shipping Forecast for first time in more than 90 years

It was early-morning chaos and warnings of impending Armageddon when BBC Radio 4 failed to broadcast the Shipping Forecast for the first time in more than 90 years.

The BBC radio service is something of an institution, metronomically broadcasting four forecasts a day since 1924, a routine which failed for the first time at 5.20am on Friday.

A technical glitch meant the BBC's World Service was played in its place, a gaffe that prompted listeners to take to Twitter to voice their bewilderment.

Kirsty Connell said: "Eep. The shipping forecast didn't get broadcast on @BBCRadio4 this morning. Isn't that the sign of impending nuclear armageddon?"

Jordan Rowland added: "No shipping forecast? If UK submarines don't get shipping forecast, don't they launch nuclear attack?"

The BBC was only able to resolve the issue at 5.40am when it cut back to the Radio 4 programme. Friday morning's Shipping Forecast eventually aired 6.40am.

BBC Radio 4 presenter Kathy Clugson apologised for the mistake, saying: "You're listening to BBC Radio 4. Our apologies. It's 5.40am and we've been happily broadcasting News Briefing. But unfortunately due to a technical error, you've not been hearing us, so you have been hearing the BBC World Service.

"We're sorry about that. We're looking into it and we'll try and broadcast the Shipping Forecast for long-wave listeners during the course of the Today programme."

But for some the damage to their established morning routine had already been done.

"Confused by Radio 4 failing to start broadcasting at 5.25 this morning," tweeted Graham Patterson. "No shipping forecast, no shipping forecast, no bbcnewsbriefing. Bad start to a Friday."

The incident also allowed for a predictable link to headline-grabbing UKIP leader Nigel Farage.

Mark Johnston tweeted: "Nation in peril? BBC radio fails to broadcast shipping forecast this morning. Expect Farage to blame Brussels within the hour."

Produced by the Met Office, on behalf of the Maritime and Coastguard Agency, the shipping forecast is aired at 12.48am, 5.20am, 12.01pm and 5.54pm.

Friday's mishap is not the first time the Shipping Forecast has run aground.

In 2010, Radio 4 presenter Susan Powell read out a forecast which had already been given out 24 hours earlier.

"'Unfortunately our usual switch from BBC World Service, which is broadcast on Radio 4 overnight, didn't go as planned and was delayed by around 20 minutes," said a spokeswoman for BBC Radio 4. "We apologise for the inconvenience."

MSF Outage - 12 June 2014

The MSF 60 kHz time and frequency signal broadcast from Anthorn Radio Station will be shut down on Thursday 12 June 2014 from 10:00 to 14:00 BST (09:00 to 13:00 UTC).

The MSF 60 kHz standard-frequency and time signal, broadcast by Babcock International on behalf of The National Physical Laboratory (NPL), is occasionally taken off-air to allow maintenance work on the masts and antennas at Anthorn Radio Station to be carried out in safety. This means that your radio-controlled clock will not be picking up the MSF signal, so may not be working correctly.

The duration of each outage period will be kept to a minimum, and the signal may be back on-air prior to the times given

above.


NPL has installed three atomic clocks at Anthorn and on 27 February 2007 Britain's national time signal transmissions, retaining their original call sign of MSF, were transferred there on a trial basis, moving formally on 1 April 2007. Monitoring and logging of the clocks and control of the transmissions is by Internet link from the NPL offices at Teddington, using comparison with GPS signals at both locations. Signal monitoring is by radio. To ensure accuracy, dynamic adjustment of the aerial according to local conditions (such as wind distortion) is controlled from computers on site. The signals, transmitted at 60 kHz, also provide a national frequency standard. The effective radiated power is 17 kW. http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Anthorn Radio Station (Mike Terry via DXLD)
