

Zimbabwe Broadcasting Corporation's manager signed my prepared verification card and put on it the rubber stamp of 'The Manager, Zimbabwe Broadcasting Corporation, Radio Zimbabwe'. After eight years of patiently writing again and again, I enclosed a 100,000,000,000 (one hundred trillion) dollar bank note from the Reserve Bank of Zimbabwe in

one of my registered letters with proof of delivery and a warranty of 100 Euro. Then I had the Harare Central Sorting Office confirm that this letter was delivered. As shortwave transmissions from Gweru stopped a couple of years ago, I am more than happy that I still got this confirmation! Perseus Recording Issue

When I am recording (not using a timer program like Mestor), I notice the following situation: During the recording of the second sequential file (xxxxxx.001), the Perseus audio gets choppy. Stopping the recording does not correct the problem. I have to restart the Perseus to get the audio back to normal.

This only occurs when recording to an external hard drive. The internal hard drive (Drive C:) does not have this problem. Have others experienced this issue? What is causing this to happen?

Assuming Windows. Have you enabled write caching on the HDD? Go into Computer Management, Device Manager, Disk Drives, expand until you see the external HDD. Right click and go to Properties. Then the Policies Tab. Your internal drives should already have Write caching enabled. External by default are disabled. Enable it and always remember to stop USB devices when removing the drive (or shutdown the computer). (Bill Nollman via Perseus YG)

Soon coming cuts at VOA, RFA, RFE/RL, From Dan Robinson

This news emerging from VOA late Friday: VOA to end shortwave broadcasts in English and several language services Monday (June 30).

Received this late Friday afternoon: "FAREWELL TO SHORTWAVE"

We were informed late Friday that BBG's proposed shortwave cuts for FY2014 have been approved by Congress.

As of the end of the day on Monday, June 30th, all shortwave frequencies for English News programs to Asia will be eliminated. We will no longer be heard via shortwave in the morning (12-16 utc), and the evening (22-02utc)...mostly in Asia.

Shortwave frequencies for the following services will also be eliminated: Azerbaijani, Bangla, English (Learning), Khmer, Kurdish, Lao and Uzbek. Shortwave being used by services at RFE/RL and RFA are also being cut.

Because shortwave has been a cheap and effective way to receive communications in countries with poor infrastructure or repressive regimes, it was a good way to deliver information. But broadcasting via shortwave is expensive, and its use by listeners has been on the decline for years. At the BBG, the cost vs. impact equation no longer favors broadcasts via this medium to most of the world.

Important for us is that we will continue to be heard on shortwave frequencies during those hours we broadcast to Africa. Also, we know through our listener surveys that about half of our audience in Asia and the rest of the world listens to us via the web and podcast – so all is not lost.

Let's break the news about this change to our audiences starting Sunday night. I doubt specific frequencies are critical to announce. The important point to make for our listeners is that we encourage their continued listening through local affiliates, and on the web at voanews.com."






