I wish you all a **Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year** with a typical postcard painted by **Jenny Nyström**.




Jenny Eugenia Nyström (June 13 or June 15, 1854 in Kalmar, Sweden – January 17, 1946 in Stockholm) was a painter and illustrator who is mainly known as the person who created the Swedish image of the *jultomte* on numerous Christmas cards and magazine covers, thus linking the Swedish version of Santa Claus to the gnomes of Scandinavian folklore.

While in Paris, she discovered the booming postcard market, and tried to persuade the Swedish publishing house Bonnier to start producing postcards, but they declined. *Lille Viggs äventyr på julafoton* ("Little Vigg's Adventures on Christmas Eve"), written by the author Viktor Rydberg inspired Jenny Nyström. She made drawings accompanying this tale. Viktor Rydberg saw them and suggested the Bonniers publishing company to release the book. After they declined, S. A. Hedlund Publishing released it in 1871. The short Christmas tale for all ages was widely printed and has since become a Christmas classic in Sweden. Jenny Nyström eventually became Sweden's most productive painter and illustrator. I continue to think it's still the second harmonic of KGLD, Tyler TX, 2 x 1330, and claim to be the only DXer who ever definitely IDed it, a couple of years ago, but now it's never strong enough to pull anything more than traces of audio. In case anyone else would like to try for it, I point out the official FCC sunset/sunrise times when, if they are following the rules (aside from suppressing harmonics more than this), the fundamental cut from 1000 watts day power to 77 watts night power should occur in December at 2315 UT, just before which one would expect a larger signal on the propagating harmonic (January: 2345 UT). Sunrise is 1315 UT in Dec, 1330 UT in Jan, but it also has a PSRA of 500 watts starting at 1200 UT. So far, when I hear it any time of night, it's supposedly only a fraction of 77 watts. Non-directional at all times. Format is gospel music, and maybe some preaching. So far, pickins is sparse for any other MW harmonics this winter on 2 or 3 MHz bands (Glenn Hauser, OK)

The end of the BBC Uzbek broadcast was heard at 13.25:55 UT, a local string instrument play, followed by the BBC / Babcock Control Room pause music again, with cello / string instrument piece from 13.29:38 UT, this last until 13.30:57 UT.			
TX Dushanbe Yangi Yul transmitter carrier string switch connection O F F at 13.31:07 UT.			
The CHINA Noise Jammer remained until 13.32:55 UT in the air. The 8 kHz bandwidth noise signal disappeared from SDR screen.



Does anyone listen to these services and while CKZN broadcasts to Labrador what is the purpose and broadcast area of CKZU?

I have picked up CKZN on 6160kHz once here in Scotland and really miss the Northern Quebec Service which came in here really well in the evenings, it's just not the same listening online.

(Thanks guys, Rob, Glasgow, Scotland. via DXLD)

Rob, these transmitters are under the auspices of CBC, and not RCI. There are vast areas of northern Canada which are poorly served by existing, mostly retranslators. In the case of CKZN, it would serve remote areas of northern Labrador, while CKZU would do the same for northern BC. In both cases, fishing vessels could also tune in. I use CKZU frequently when I'm at my DX cottage on Haida Gwaii, and in addition, in my vehicle when it was so equipped with a SW receiver. There are plenty of isolated areas where there's nothing available on the AM or FM bands, especially during the summer. I can attest how well CKZU is heard up there. They beam due north, I think. Then again, I too miss the Northern Quebec service. It was something special. With Sackville now history, little chance of RCI ever returning to SW, sadly. (73, Walt Salmani via DXLD)

ETHIOPIA. Coincidentally, I also heard Fana Broadcasting Corporate (previously known as Radio Fana) on 6110 kHz on Sunday evening (starting around 02:55 UTC on 7 December) using the Univ. of Twente WebSDR. I was looking for Xizang but heard Fana instead signing on with their interesting IS. I recorded (using my Tecsun ICR-100) the IS and the ID and start of the news bulletin in Amharic (excerpt attached). I had an Ethiopian colleague listen to the recording and answer a few questions I had including one on the meaning of the name. He told me that the word

"fana" in this context has the meaning of a pioneer or a founder and was chosen by the station as it claimed to be the first non-governmental broadcaster. In reality, Fana belongs to the governing party (Ethiopian People's Revolutionary Democratic Front).

The other two words in the station's name ("broadcasting" and "corporate") are English loan words in Amharic. My colleague says such words are used for convenience and almost everybody in the country (radio listeners) knows these words. There are Amharic equivalent words but the words are a little awkward for usage and especially for broadcasters. In addition, "broadcasting" and "corporate" are western (recent) concepts and the words have been adopted by most Ethiopian languages. There are several other English and Italian words in the Ethiopian languages. For example, aeroplane (airplane), mercato (market), autobus (bus), parlama (parliament), and so on.

By the way, in case you are wondering what the initial news item is about, my colleague says it is about the dam being built at the source of the Nile.

YEMEN [non]. 11860, Dec 10 at 1422, VG signal in Arabic discussion about Yemen, studio YL (in Aden??) interviewing OM on phone. Also at first I can hear R. Ashna, Kuwait to Afghanistan underneath, which clashes at 1430-1630, uncovered at 1432 during a brief Yemen transmission break. IBB has the flexibility to move, so they should get with it, as this R. Sana`a has claimed 11860 for 24 hours a day, per Ivo Ivanov. He still lists it as a 50 kW ND transmission from Jeddah, SAUDI ARABIA. It's so strong here during this hour, that I could now believe it's a 500 kW Riyadh unit; maybe just an ideal pipeline hour for us, longpath? 1434 brief Qur'an segment; then mostly music, martial-sounding, with some Arabic exhortations; after 1503 back to mostly Arabic talk, weakening somewhat by 1528.

More about it from our Cairo correspondent, Tarek Zeidan, Dec 10:

``Hello, It is Sanaa. The latest changes in this transmission are officially mentioned in the news bar in Yemen TV network (not the official one) stating that Radio Sanaa is transmitting 24/7 now on 11860 kHz.

Now there are two Yemeni TV networks, one supporting al-Huethi group located in Sanaa and the other one is supporting the elected President who is located in Aden the capital of Southern Yemen.

The official Radio Sanaa, transmitting now only online, replied to an E-mail from a listener that they are not the network using 11860 and this station is not the official voice of Yemen. The online network is completely different than the one on 11860, of course.

In Egypt I can hear them after 0430 UT but can't confirm if it's really 24/7; I can confirm that the gap between 1000 and 1800 is now filled with programmes attacking Iran, as it is the main supporter of al-Huethis. A DXer in Japan advised that he heard voice of the Gulf Cooperation Council transmitting on the same frequency, which is a fill-in for a 24-hour transmission. All the best, Tarek Zeidan, Cairo, Egypt, Sent from my iPad`` to the DXLD yg. Wolfgang Büschel measures it on 11859.9985 (Glenn Hauser, OK, DX LISTENING DIGEST)

HISTORY: Propagation uses a variety of ways. The oldest way to telegraphy code Samuel Morse (born. Samuel Finley Breese Morse). Telegraph benefit to radio or amateur radio service - that spun out the question of who invented the radio, who conducted the first radio broadcast, etc. Usually involved in the names of the pioneers in radio Marconi, Popov and others. Few know, however, that the first radio broadcast in the world, which sounded human voice and music, has carried out a Canadian engineer Reginald Aubrey Fessenden. First, the trial was broadcast, and the human voice was heard a mile (about 1.6 km) - this was the 23rd of December 1900.

But the first broadcast, which sounded for the first time in history, a real radio program was aired on December 24th 1906, the night before Christmas. Fedesena radio transmitter was located at Cape Brant Rock on the coast of Massachusetts, and the program takes on several ships in the bay.

The program included:

"Ombra mai fu" (Xerxes aria from Handel's opera "Xerxes, the king, or in love");
Playing the violin itself Fesendena "O Holy Night";
Fesenden sang Gounod's aria;
I read out passages from the Gospel of St. Luke Bible.

The second transmission sounded 31st December 1906

Some DH reference periodicals or wrongly is obsolete note that 1st gear sounded on 24th December 1909, not 1906.

Nez i Nordfrankrike - og de hadde tatt emot akkurat samme annonsering, ved akkurat samme tidspunkt som jeg gjort i Komagvær! Han forteller videre, at allerede da hadde de blitt forbause over hvor langt en MF-signal egentlig rekker... Og så kommer da min rapport fra langt nord i Skandinavien! "Controlador" bekreftet rapporten min, og lovde også å sende den videre til korrekt e-postadresse ved Las Palmas radio, så her venter vi med spenning!

Nesten antydning til "Utility-QSL-flom" i dag (9/12). Nå kom QSL på min rapport til Palma radio (Mallorca) som ble avlyttet i Komagvær den 2. november. v/s José Benitez på CCR Valencia forteller at man bruker en sender fra Rhode & Schwarz på 1 KW som er lokalisert i Marratxí, Palma de Mallorca Island. Senderen kjøres remote fra Cellnex Maritime Communications Center i Valencia.

Utility-spalten må jo få et bidrag i ny og ne.

Mottok akkurat QSL fra **Bjørnøya Meteo**, som alt som oftest høres fint her på 2182 kHz og arbeidsfrekvensen 1757 kHz. v/s Raymond Sellevold hilset og ønsket meg og personellet på Vardø radio en God Jul og et Godt Nytt År.

Regner med at jeg kan formidle denne hilsen slik at den også omfatter gjengen i DXLC. Har for øvrig pøst på med en hel del utility-rapporter i dag, så vi får se om det kommer noe mer på den fronten.





Aasiaat radio på vestkysten av Grønland høres av og til med gode signaler på 2182 kHz, og gir også en god indikering på kondisjoner mot NA. Jeg hørte Aasiaat ute i Komagvær om kvelden den 7. november, og sente en rapport med opptak for noen dager siden. I går kveld kom en hyggelig e-post fra Bo Mogensen på stasjonen. Han bekreftet rapporten min, og skrev også at det kommer et QSL-kort på ekte papir med posten. Han forteller også at han minnes Vardø radio fra de gode gamle dager, hva han nu mente med det - we're still around

"It is always nice to receive these reports from all round the world but as far as I know your report is from the furthest north we have had yet."



World Radiocommunication Conference 2015 - summary

SARL weekly news in English 2015-12-5

World Radiocommunication Conference 2015 (WRC-15) concluded its deliberations on 27 November in Geneva, as heads of delegations signed the Final Acts revising the Radio Regulations - the international treaty governing the use of radio frequency spectrum and satellite orbits. Some 3 300 participants, representing 162 out of the International Telecommunication Union's (ITU) 193 member states, attended the 4-week conference. Another 500 or so participants, representing 130 other entities, including industry, also attended as observers. Festus Daudu of Nigeria chaired WRC-15.

"A great deal has been achieved in the last 4 weeks and the results will have a major impact on the future of the telecommunication sector in general and radio communications in particular," ITU Radiocommunication Bureau (ITU-R) Director François Rancy said in a closing news release. WRC-15 addressed more than 40 topics related to frequency allocation and sharing.

The conference reached consensus on a new worldwide secondary Amateur Radio allocation at 5 351.5 to 5 366.5 kHz, with a power limit of 15 W effective isotropic radiated power (EIRP). Some Region 2 countries will be permitted up to 25 W EIRP. With this action - and despite conditions that are more restrictive than had been hoped at the start of the Conference - the Amateur Service has obtained its first new global HF allocation since 1979.

The 15 kHz band at 60 meters "will maintain stable communications over various distances, especially for use when providing communications in disaster situations and for relief operations," an ITU news release said. The new band will not become available for use until the regulatory authorities address the WRC-15 Final Acts.

Threats by the mobile telephone/broadband industry near 10 GHz and 24 GHz have been averted for the time being, but are expected to be raised again at WRC-19 and/or WRC-23. The 144 and 420 MHz bands were excluded from the WRC-19 agenda item addressing short-duration (3 years) small satellites.

Agenda Item 1.12, addressing the Earth Exploration Satellite Service (10 GHz EESS), was approved at plenary with footnotes relevant to certain Middle East countries. The EESS allocation was tailored to avoid the Amateur-Satellite segment and poses no threat to terrestrial amateur radio use of the band.

The International Amateur Radio Union (IARU) team at WRC-15 also focused its efforts on tweaking the agenda for WRC-19. Agenda Item 1.1 will consider 50 to 54 MHz harmonization in Region 1. A proposed agenda item to align the 160 metre allocation in Region 1 with the rest of the world did not make the cut.


Perseus waterfall denoiser

Dear All, I'm finally managing to implement the Waterfall Denoiser I would ever liked to add to the V5 software. The algorithm takes some important CPU time and I'm optimizing it a bit so that there will be no need for a 16 cores CPU to run it. If it works as expected I will add it to the next software distribution.

In this last days I've also re-introduced the old V4 averaging method. The averaging in the V5 was not thought for measurements and has some drawbacks I was already aware but I add no time to add both of the methods when I released the full software version three weeks ago. Both of them will be available as soon the new distribution will be uploaded to our web-site.

Here is the picture of the denoiser I was speaking of. The comparison with the old V4 software version is not very fair but here it is: a couple of NDBs as seen with the V4 and with the V5 denoiser.

(In this case the V5.0b software version performs indeed much better than the V4 but not as good as in this picture yet).

Å blande DX-ing med politikk eller med religion...

Å blande DX-ing med politikk eller med religion er sjeldent noe god ide, og det er da også noe de fleste forsøker å unngå. Men noen ganger kan det skje ting man ikke helt hadde regnet med. Jeg mener å huske at det var Jan Alvestad som ved en anledning var nær ved å bli arrestert av den lokale lensmann etter at lokalbefolkningen et eller annet sted på Vestlandet hadde rapportert hva de trodde var mistenklig aktivitet med lange antenner på et øde sted.

Nå har ikke jeg opplevd akkurat det, men i dag skjedde det likevel noe som det smaker religion og/eller politikk av. I løpet av høsten har jeg hørt og rapportert en del mellombølgesendere i Iran. Delvis er det snakk om regionalsendinger beregnet på innenlandske lyttere og delvis er det utenlandsprogrammer (Vo-IRI – Voice of The Islamic Republic of Iran) som bruker mellombølge til nabolandene. Litt usikker på hva som gir de beste mulighetene for svar har jeg delvis brukt email og delvis snailmail for å sende rapporter, og noen svar er det også kommet.

I dag opplevde jeg imidlertid at en rapport som var sendt medio oktober kom i retur. Først skjønte jeg ikke hvorfor, det var en rapport til VoIRI på deres utenlandsprogram på aserbaidjansk så adressen skulle være grei nok. Etter å ha studert og tydet stemplene fant jeg ut at grunnen til at sendingen kom i retur var at den var såkalt «refusert».

Nå var det så godt som 100 % sikkert ikke VoIRI som hadde refusert den, det må ha vært den kontroll som iranske myndigheter fører med innkommende post som hadde reagert på et eller annet, men hva? Jeg vet ikke sikkert, men en pil som er tegnet med samme tusjpenn som den som er benyttet for å krysse av «refusert» gir en pekepinn. Den pilen peker mot ett av de norske frimerkene på konvolutten. Dette frimerket har det norske riksvåpenet, dvs løven med krone og bittelite kors på toppen. Om det er dette mikro-korset som har blitt for sterkt kost for det muslimske Iran vet ikke, men det er



den eneste forklaringen jeg kan komme opp med.

Konvolutten bærer for øvrig tydelig preg av å ha vært åpnet. Det forunderer meg i grunnen slett ikke. Iranerne som refuserte den har sikkert også åpnet den, og når det gjelder innkommende post (returnert post) fra Iran kan det vel tenkes at vårt eget PST også vil ta en titt. Iran står vel fortsatt på en liste som innebærer at vi ikke skal forsyne dem med utstyr eller informasjon som kan brukes til utvikling eller produksjon av masseødeleggelsesvåpen. PST og NTNU i Trondheim har hatt en kontrovers i den sammenheng når det gjelder studenter fra Iran, og en DVD-plate kan jo inneholde litt av hvert i så måte. Men både den iranske sikkerhetstjenesten og eventuelt PST er nok blitt skuffet når de undersøkte hva som var i konvolutten, inklusive innholdet på DVD-platen.


