Um 17:35 UTC gab es dann noch einen Bericht über Muslim Bombers in Kashmir, ebenfalls in Englisch. Abgeschaltet wurde an diesem Tag erst um 17:46 UTC - in der letzten Sendeminute war noch ein Lied zu hören. Der Empfang war bestenfalls O=2-3, zwischen 17:35 und 17:45 UTC nur O=2. WRMI was the best. There were never any annmts and all went off around 0000. Pulled out the R-388, NRD-535D, and E1 receivers to tune in and record each freq. Strung up a temporary 40 foot +/- random wire for 11580 on the E1. Had the Perseus recording 9620 and 9690 using the Delta loop antenna, the R-388 tuned to 5129.8 with the Wellbrook ALA1530S, and this freq on the NRD-535D also using the Wellbrook. Combined pieces of all freqs/tracks at 2 different times to create the complete pgm in mono. Here is the link to the combined recording (2313, 2347 UTC)

Also writing by letter through the post – and don't forget that OTD likes to hear from you by post or e-mail – is DAVID CRYSTAL in Israel.

He tells us "Universal Radio, USA, is owned by Fred Osterman. He is willing to export books, but will not export anything else except to a very few people he trusts. Early in his career he was badly burned by dishonest foreign customers. Laws in the USA and Canada protect mail order houses, but they have no jurisdiction abroad. Fred Osterman's masterpiece is the book Communications Receivers 1942-2013. It is well worth a US\$100, and was reviewed in Communication in November, 2016. To buy from Universal Radio – <http://www.universal-radio.com> – you will need an intermediary in the USA or Canada. The intermediary will buy from Universal and then change the address on the box and mail it to you. They charge plenty for their service. For me, the Universal catalogue is a basic tool."

### Gammalt DX-material från Jan-Erik Räf

Jag fick ett mail från stöttepelaren i Arctic Radio Club, Tore Larsson, där han skrev om material han fått överta från Jan-Erik Räf. Det rörde sig då närmast om Etersvep 1953-55, där Harry Albinsson skrivit reseberättelser från Spanska Marocko med besök på Radio Dersa och Pan American Radio. Den sistnämnda har jag QSL ifrån... i mina gömmor.

Nu tog jag reda på att Harry Albinsson lever, numera bosatt i Täby och 86 år, . ringde upp honom, en kontakt efter 65+ år! Det blev ett trevligt samtal. Harry blev civilingenjör, sysslade med forskning inom fysiken, bl.a. i Frankrike, senare blev han verksam inom Industriförbundet. DX-ingen lade han på hyllan under studietiden, men han har kvar det mesta av sina QSL i pärmar och skokartonger. Han blev intresserad då jag berättade om DX-Boken och vill absolut skaffa den.

Jag pratade sen i telefon med Tore samt med Bengt Ericson. Då kunde jag också berätta att ett stort brev kommit från Larisa Suarez, vår vän från Radio Belarus. Det var bl.a. en hälsning inför min 83-årsdag. Larisa alternerar mellan Krim och Minsk, modern dog förra året, mycket smärtsamt för Larisa. Hon ägnar mycken tid åt sina barnbarn.

Ett namn som nämndes i samtalet med Harry Albinsson var Lars Kalderén. Harry var först undrande, för han hade nog inte varit med då LK skrev sina fina kortvågsspalter i Röster i Radio vid mitten av 1940-talet. Jag hade den stora glädjen att få kontakt med och sedan träffa Kalderén, på en stor jubileumssammankomst i Radiohuset för en del år sedan. Jag harangerade honom i ett tal jag höll, som den som inspirerade en tioårig kille att lyssna på världsradio. Janne Räf var också med och tackade pionjären. Harry Albinsson kopplade direkt när jag nämnde att Kalderén varit chef i många år för Riksgäldskontoret!

Till forna tider återgår min tanke än så gärna.....

Jag instämmer med Fänrik Stål. Men samtidigt måste jag vara alert som ungdomsledare på Röda Korset, förberedelserna för årets sommarlovsaktivitet är igång....
