## Re: [Perseus-SDR] Updates to software

Hi, all - from a practitioner's point of view, I still see a lot of useful development in the field of SDR hardware and software. Some of if had already been done, some is announced for this summer. Just six points out of those being far more than just eye candy:

\* 30 MHz HF bandwidth for record/play

\* numerous decoders in parallel (24 are already available) for parallel decoding of many data channels

\* GPS synchronization as reference

\* connecting many remote devices (coherently or by time-stamped recordings) to achieve direction finding (TDoA)

\* include scheduler, decoder etc

\* combine a couple of ADCs to improve dynamic range (e.g. four ADCs to get an improvement of +6)

I don't think that all this must be provided by just one company. Cooperation and open interfaces are key to a solution. On the other hand, many of the disrupting functions, already available also with Perseus, haven't yet arrived within the "community". Its majority seems to use an SDR in more or less the same way as a Collins 51S-1 in the 1960s.

This has to do with the largely conservative mindset of mainstream amateur radio and their publications. Instead of leading (or at least: applauding) innovation, they populate the brakeman's cab. Partly of pure indolence, partly for again pure commercial interest - as only the legacy companies are booking expensive 4c glossy advertisements in their publication. This, of course, influences also the editorial parts of their magazine with e.g. biased test reports. If you want to see a vicious circle at work, here it is in a perfect form.

Wrapped up: There are many things to do which are quite challenging to ingeniously developers and also make sense for advanced customers. Conceded that "the masses" are lagging behind in making proper use of even the features we already have at hand ... ;-) (73 Nils, DK80K)

It started out in Boston as W1XAL, later becoming WNYW, and was well known for its educational programming. ## [WOR] History - Popov demonstrates radio receiver, May 7, 1895

In Saint Petersburg, Russian physicist Alexander Stepanovich Popov demonstrated the Popov lightning detector, a primitive radio receiver, to the Russian Physical and Chemical Society on May 7, 1895.

In the early 1890s, Popov began conducting experiments along the lines of Heinrich Hertz's research. In 1894, he built the first radio receiver, which contained a coherer. He further refined the design as a lightning detector.

A paper on his work was published in December 1895, but he did not apply for a patent for his invention.

In March 1896, Popov transmitted radio waves between buildings in St Petersburg. In 1898, he realized ship-to-shore communication over a distance of 6 miles, and then over 30 miles a year later.

In 1900, a radio station was established under Popov's instructions on Hogland Island (Suursaari) in the Baltic Sea to provide two-way communication by wireless telegraphy between the Russian naval base and the crew of the battleship General-Admiral Apraksin.

In some parts of the former Soviet Union, May 7 is celebrated as Radio Day as Popov has generally been recognized in Eastern Europe as the "inventor of radio," in contrast to the West's recognition of Marconi and Tesla.

Popov's work on the emission and reception of signals by means of electromagnetic oscillations built upon Nikola Tesla's accomplishments demonstrated in 1893.

Guglielmo Marconi received a patent for radio in 1896, but his device is widely thought to be based on various earlier techniques of other researchers, including Tesla, and resembled instruments demonstrated by others, including Popov. The three inventors are among a small group of scientists and engineers who had a hand in the invention of radio.
