



NATIONAL NC-183/D REVIVED

W0AD update --- Guyz, The radio that hooked me as a 10 year old to the mystery of shortwave radio and eventually to the ham radio hobby was a plain jane 1948 National NC-183 that was on the desk in the bedroom I stayed at when we visited the family farmstead south of Superior every summer. I remember being amazed at the warm glow of the dials, the smell of the set heating up, listening to the sounds coming out of the speaker and the whoosh whoosh of CW being received by an envelope detector (I later discovered what the BFO was for!) I went to the public library and got a book on the Kennelly-Heaviside layer. As a 10 year old I didn't understand the math, but really liked the pictures of the radio waves bouncing off the ionosphere.



So, the nostalgia bug bit two and a half years ago, and I bought a re-capped National NC-183D receiver (totally different radio from the stock NC-183) that a guy had bought from a restorer but he never could get it to work. He was so disgusted with it that he gave it away for \$150 shipped.

I figured that someday I would get smart enough to figure it out.

Well, some of my ham buddies were talking about how great the R-388 and 51J4 series of Collins receivers were, and it got me thinking... Hey, I've got this NC-183D in the garage; it would sound really nice with the push pull 6V6s --- maybe something fixed itself in the last two years? (ha ha) Or, maybe a tube finally went bad as I had tested them all when I got it. I would get plenty of noise out of the radio, the controls all worked, but not a peep of signal.

What are the chances of that!!!! It seemed weird that a weak mixer tube would cause the radio to be completely deaf, so I took a closer look at the tube I pulled out.

It was a 12BE6 --- Wow. Someone must have inadvertently substituted a first mixer tube with a 12 volt filament instead of a 6 volt filament. The 12 volt filament never heated up enough with only 6 volts applied to conduct electrons so the RF path was cut off. That's why I heard noise but no signal.

So a guy who spent many hours recapping this radio probably sold it for a premium and the buyer was just like me; he assumed that the tube lineup was correct. I even tested this tube!

It's amazing that this was the first and only tube I replaced, but more importantly: I' m sure there's a moral to this story, because it seems very unsurprising to me that things in life happen this way. PS. Now I get to do an alignment. Instant gratification, much more fun than my day job!

Re: [SDR-Radio] Signal History enhancement proposals

The Signal History is nice for monitoring 70cm beacons. I used it today for monitoring PI7CIS, QRB 712 km with QSB and ASC signal lifts. I then found room for some enhancements.


- 1) An amplitude scale on the Y-axis would be nice together with lines all across time for some levels (each 5 dB or so)
- 2) An "Extremely Long Time" of say 20 minutes or so would be nice as well as a "Silly Long Time" of an hour or so in viewable monitoring time.



Just record the range, you want to analyze. Then use Data File Analyzer Module for each/any signal you want. Export the data, and visualize them via spreadsheet. I recommend SciDAVis (free) or the more stable QtiPlot (a small fee) or Tableau Public, as Excel gets too slow with e.g. ca. 850.000 data from 10 signals over 24h. See attachment for two much different examples.

There is another advantage of this method: you may apply some statistical calculations on these data, e.g. calculating SNR or presenting the information as box plot.






DX nostalgia


First out this time we have a QSL from Radio Aparecida in Brazil, a very common station on SW over the years. V/s José Dinys must have had an enormous backlog of reception reports to verify when he started as 'International Correspondence Chief' as Tore Larssons report from April 1961 was verified in December 1966. José was very interested in international correspondence and collecting stamps. In the enclosed stencil letter he wrote that he would also like to correspond with the listeners' girl friends and added "tell them to send portraits of theirs, please".




TL received a QSL letter from La Voz de Nicaragua in 1980 which was the year of the campaign *The National Literacy Crusade* in the country. The campaign was given high priority by the new Sandinista government as Nicaragua by this time had an illiteracy rate of about 50% which was the highest in Latin America. The station used to be a regular on 5950 and 11835 kHz.



Another Brazilian SW station which is still around. This nice QSL folder was received by Lars-Olof Hansson LOH in 1962. Radio Bandeirantes started on SW on Dec. 6, 1953 according to the text.



Jan-Erik Räf JER received this QSL card from FEBC The Far East Broadcasting Co. – The Call Of The Orient in 1956.



Finally a letter which JER received from BBC in 1944. At this time BBC had regular programmes in Swedish and the v/s writes that the BBC engineers were very impressed that JER could pick up the SW transmissions by his home made crystal receiver and they were asking for a description of this set.
