The freshest Radio Country List

The Radio Country List for SDXF (Swedish DX Federation) has been updated due to 2 changes of country names in 2018, Macedonia to North Macedonia and Swaziland to Eswatini. There is also a clarification regarding the listing of Mexico under Central America, i.e. the listing is due to radio historical reasons. When the first Radio Country Lists appeared in the 60-ies, the listings were most likely made up by looking at WRTH, which had this division. Later in the 90-ies WRTH moved Mexico to North America (where it correctly is located according to most sources), but the Country Land Lists kept it under Central America, so it would not affect i.e. Awards and Diplomas. The Radio Country List for SDXF (which is mainly based on EDXC Radio Country List but simplified) is available on the homepage of SDXF (sdxf.se) at Medlemsportal > SDXF:s Landlista. UKRAINE. Unscheduled inspections of two radio stations

On July 16, the National Council of Ukraine for Television and Radio Broadcasting appointed unscheduled inspections of two radio stations, the Shanson radio network (TRK Shanson LLC) and the local radio Slavia (TRK Slavia LLC) from the city of Pologi, Zaporozhye region. During the monitoring, the National Council recorded that radio "Chanson" did not touch the song quotas: instead of 35% on one of the days from 15:00 to 22:00, 34% of the songs were broadcast in Ukrainian. Radio Slavia, according to the monitoring data, aired Oleg Gazmanov's song "Officers", although this singer is included in the List of Persons Who Threaten National Security, and broadcasters are prohibited from broadcasting works created with the participation of these people. I just listened to an old RN Media Network from 31 July 1986 <u>https://directory.libsyn.com/episode/index/show/jonat-hanmarks/id/14813465</u>

Wow, how I miss the superb content of that series! This one is particularly interesting, as it's about OTH Radar and CODAR. The latter, although not called CODAR then, was reported as a British invention, and meant to "hug the ocean's surface", while OTH used the ionosphere. I'm not at all sure that I agree with that. As for the Soviet Wood-pecker, they mentioned 3 sites in the USSR. The first, between Minsk and Kyiv and reported off the air. This is obviously the one near Chernobyl, which is so well known, and clearly abandoned after the nuclear melt down which had occurred only a few months earlier on April 26, 1986. That was unknown then. That site is very well documented with lots of videos and photos, but I hadn't heard of 2 other (presumably) identical sites mentioned. The second was on Sakhalin, but Robert Horvitz (of ANARC) states it's near Komsomolsk. I'm not aware of anywhere on Sakhalin with that name, but rather on the mainland closer to Khabarovsk, and the 3rd was really strange. He stated, north of the Black Sea and aimed at China. Did he mean Lake Baikal? My question is, has anyone seen evidence of these other 2 arrays? Google Earth should be pretty easy to see them, if they still exist. Horvitz (is he still around???) also

mentions the US, with plans for 3 sites on the west coast, another in Maine, and another in the "North mid-west", aimed to the Caribbean. Were these ever built? Japan, the UK, and Australia were also mentioned, with the latter callled Jindalee. I was able to find information about this in wikipedia: <u>https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Jindalee_Operat-</u> ional_Radar_Network

Looks like it's still operational, and likely what we may be hearing/seeing on the bands. There was no mention at all of China, which today, most people blame for the large number of broadband signals received, especially on the west coast of North America.

Now doing more searches on wiki does indeed show the Far Eastern site as near Komsomolsk on Amur, and not Sakhalin at all. Furthermore, I think that the wiki has all sorts of errors. The giant arrays are described as antennas, but wasn't this the transmitter? The transmitter coordinates just show bunker like buildings without any kind of transmission device. Sure the transmitters had to be located somewhere, and these large buildings would fit the bill, but they had to then feed an array. There's no talk in the wiki about a site in western Ukraine, not far from Lviv, which I gather was one of the actual receiver sites. The google maps satellite pictures from the Far East certainly don't show the impressive array that is present near Chernobyl. There's also discussion about a site near Mykolaiv, in southern Ukraine. Again, the Google photos don't show much of anything left, but interestingly, there seems to be an Wullenweber array (or remnants) just north of the coordinates.

I can't for the life of me understand how this site in southern Ukraine (indeed north of the Black Sea) would be used towards China! That surely doesn't make a lot of sense to me.






DX nostalgia by RFK

Welcome to the world of DX nostalgia! Of course hearing and identifying a distant station has always been a great experience but for many of us the best part was when we actually had the QSL in our hands. Often delivered in envelopes with nice exotic stamps. I still recall the feeling and somehow, although email may be a very fast and efficient way of communicating and exchanging information, it will never be the same. So let us dream about old times and have a look at some goodies from way back when. The first QSL comes from the collection of Lars Rydén and is from Brazilian station Radio Jornal do Commercio, owned by a big newspaper. The station was one of the most common Latin American stations on SW for decades. It also carried the programme "Brazil Calling" directed to a foreign audience. LR received this QSL card in 1952.




