

What is HFDL??

EiBi`s readme.txt explains only: ``HFDL Squitter (Aircraft comms station)``. Wikipedia: ``High Frequency Data Link (HFDL) is an ACARS communications medium used to exchange data such as Aeronautical Operational Control (AOC) messages, Controller Pilot Data Link Communications (CPDLC) messages and Automatic Dependent Surveillance (ADS) messages between aircraft end-systems and corresponding ground-based HFDL ground stations. Using the unique propagation characteristics of high-frequency radio waves, the ground stations provide data link communications to properly equipped aircraft operating anywhere in the world. As a result, pilots can always communicate with someone on the ground.``

But what does it sound like on an ordinary radio? And what is squitter? Explanation from: https://skybrary.aero/articles/squitter

"The term "squitter" refers to a random broadcast of data occurring either intentionally or in response to noise.

Description: Mode-S transponders automatically send periodic burst transmissions called "squitters". These transmissions are self generated and are not in response to interrogations from a secondary surveillance radar (SSR) system. The information sent in these burst transmission serves several purposes including:

Airborne Collision Avoidance System (ACAS) - Squitter information includes aircraft location and vertical speed. This information is used by ACAS systems on other aircraft to identify potential conflicts.

Automatic Dependent Surveillance Broadcast (ADS-B) - An extended squitter is a message or series of messages which broadcast an aircraft's identification, GPS position, projected aircraft trajectory and navigation system status to allow controllers to accurately track the aircraft``

Belarusian hackers hacked GRCHTS.

The Main Radio Frequency Center (GRC) subordinated to Roskomnadzor was attacked by the Belarusian hacker group "Cyberpartisans". The hackers made publicly available screenshots of internal correspondence, as well as contacts of employees and their relatives, and scans of documents. According to Kommersant's sources, the hacking could have been done through the remote workplace of one of the organization's employees. At the same time, the GRFC states that everything was under control.

The hackers also report that they have encrypted employee workstations, thus making it impossible for authorized users to access, and have damaged the organization's infrastructure. At the same time, representatives of the GRFC state that the workstations of employees are not encrypted, access to them is open. The cyberattack countermeasures service found that hackers used a vulnerability that had not been exploited anywhere before ...






