As per the revised schedule at first News in Hindi is broadcast followed by English. So, the English bulletins so far broadcast at Midnight, 0200, 0400, 0700, 1000, 1200, 1900 & 2200 hrs. 1ST is replaced by Hindi bulletin and broadcasts 5 minutes later.

There are no changes to the main English News Bulletins broadcast at 2.00 pm (Mid-Day News) & 9.00 pm (News at 9)

KOREA. Info from Hiroshi on Sept 2 (Google translation):

"Underground broadcasts aimed at North Korea, 'People's Voice Broadcasting' and 'Echo of Hope Broadcasting' [VOH], change their schedule in principle on the first Monday of every month. Every month, they switch the frequencies starting at 0700 and 1100. There is no change in frequency. Both frequencies are difficult to hear due to jamming. The carrier on 6600kHz continues to be transmitted in an unusual way, with audio alternating 1kHz above and below. For this reason, if you cut out the jamming on 600kHz, you will be able to hear the audio clearly. Broadcast times from September 2nd.

SWLtools App for the Belka receiver

Many thanks to SWLing Post contributor, Stefano, who writes:


I am a proud owner of a Belka receiver and I really love it.

The Belka is small, it is simple, it works very well outdoors with its short antenna that outperforms my desktop receivers with long wire antennas. Its size allows you to put it in your pocket, take it on a trip, on vacation, anywhere.

I have often sat in my garden at night with my Belka, away from the electrical noise of the house, and made some really good listening. In these situations I realized that I needed to record my dx. I thought about buying a mini-recorder, but since I always have my iPhone with me I decided to develop an app to record the audio of my Belka. After some time I am happy to let you know that my new app SWLtools is available on the Apple AppStore.

SWLtools allows you to record, play back and share your best listening. Also, since Belka also has an additional output where the IQ signal is present, I also added a function to the app to display the spectrum and spectrogram (waterfall).

SWLtools is available for free on the Apple AppStore (and it is also ad-free). (via SWLing Post)



Today is the 98th birthday of AIR KOLKATA.

Like BBC, the privately owned Indian Broadcasting Company (IBC) started India's first broadcasting studio and office in Apollo Bunder Road, Bombay. Soon they opened their Calcutta station at Temple Chamber, opposite the high court, but then moved to No 1 Garstin Place and started to broadcast from August 26, 1927.


The Calcutta station's first director was CC Wallick of the BBC, while Nripendra Nath Majumdar was the producer of the Indian programmes. Musician Rai Chand Boral was one of Majumdar's assistants.

Birendra Krishna Bhadra was also associated with AIR for several decades, as the producer of the drama section. He used to present the 'Birupaksher Aasar' broadcast every Sunday at 1.00 pm, which created a sensation among the listeners. But the crowning glory of his career in All India Radio, Calcutta was his performance in Mahishasura Mardini.

The programme was first introduced in 1937. It has become a catalyst to bring back the old memories, it creates goosebumps as it brings the flavour of the Durga Puja.

In the initial years, like all the other programmes, this show was also broadcast live. However, a live show of the programme was recorded in the 1960s, and since then the same recording is played every year in place of the live programme.





It is a special early morning programme broadcast on 'Mahalaya' at 4.00 am.

In the 1970s an alternate version of Mahishasura Mardini was recorded with Govinda Gopal Mukherjee, Uttam Kumar, who reluctantly agreed, and great Lata Mangeshkar as the principal singer. However, the attempt was a grand failure and by popular demand the original version was reinstated.


